In a letter to the N. Y. Clipper, dated 31st of last December, George Brown says: "I do hereby challenge any man in America to row a five mile race, with one tarjara head-and-best boat, for a sum not less than \$2000—say two thousand dollars in gold—on either the Charles River, Springfield, or the Kennebec River, on the 1st of June, 1874. This challenge to remain open for one month from this date, and the victor to take place on June, 1874."

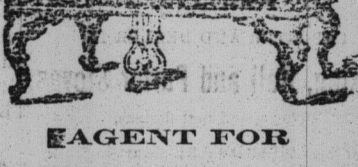
