HOUSEHOLD FEARS.

How to Wag a Successful Warfare As a Housewife.

First and foremost among those against whom the household warfare is waged is the bedbug. It is a pest that should have been exploded long ago that the presence of these creatures, under all circumstances, a proof of lack of cleanliness. In cold climates and in houses where usually give little trouble, but in warmer temperatures and especially in old buildings, constant vigilance is required. Sunning a bed has no effect upon the pests, except, perhaps, a pleasurable one, for they delight in warmth. Frequent washing of the bedclothes, but as it is always constant to wait six months for a sharp frost, there are other means to which one must resort. Corrosive sublimate is excellent. When every nook and corner of the bed has been freed from dust—for the *Cimex lectularius* has an especial predilection for crevices—apply the poison with a feather or camel's hair brush, ensuring every tiny hole where the germ of an insect may have been deposited.

Every housekeeper should subject each bed in the house to a searching examination three or four times a year, looking under the tufts on the ticking and in the seams of that and of the pillows for any marks of pest. Mrs. Carlyle gives interesting accounts of finding her bed infested with these creatures, of being kept awake all night at elegant houses and high-priced inns by the same pest. In this country, except in ill-kept hotels, such experience are rare. But sometimes bugs will be found in the domain of even the daintiest housekeeper, and that through no fault of hers. Every approach cannot be guarded, and the enemy will make an incursion from the most unexpected quarter. One woman was scandalized to find a thriving colony established in the bed in her guest chamber. It had not been occupied for some time, and she was surprised to find the pest in the room of the evil. The mystery was at last explained by learning accidentally that when the cook came in as dinner time from her "afternoon out" she had a pleasant habit of leaving her nightgown and shawl on the spare bed in order to save herself the exertion of mounting another flight of stairs to her own room. Another similar violation was traced to the basket of clean clothes brought home from the house of the landlady.

In these cases, however, there was no double fold as in the brain of Gambetta, which in other respects showed certain peculiarities of development. In the forebrain region, admittedly the seat of the highest intellectual powers—the striatum's brain showed complexities of folding associated with great diagrammatic regularity. Altogether, the examination in question is of a highly interesting character, proving as it does the fact that the faculties of genius and ability are not less unrecorded on the organ of mind. How far training and education may modify brain structure is as yet a moot point of science. One thing, however, is certain—namely, that it is quality and not quantity of brain matter which primarily dominates the world. That a large brain may be associated with low intellectual powers is a proved fact. Given a large brain-mass, and a high quality of structure, derived from an educated ancestry or from a sound stock in other respects, and we find represented the conditions which subdue all things to the will of the individual, which control the destinies of nations, and which revolutionize the world of letters, art, or science.

Learn Children to Swim.

The most anti-aquatic of small boys will hardly think of going in swimming for at least seven years, but it is already time for all parents to take steps to fulfill that important duty, the instruction of their children in the art and mystery of swimming. Next to walking on land, a child should learn to swim in the water. Too little attention is devoted to this by parents. Boys are left to pick it up as they do the ability to swim, from boys older than themselves, and in too many cases the girls never learn the first rudiments of the art. There is no more delightful exercise than swimming, but it is hard to learn. Man does not, like other animals, swim naturally. The limbs must be taught to move upon a new principle, and a new centre of equilibrium has to be dealt with. The child should therefore have a teacher, who should be at least as competent as the riding or dancing master. The elements of swimming for most children dread the water—is one of the difficulties to be overcome, and if the child's father can himself swim, he is the best teacher of his children, as they naturally trust him.

THE HOME RULE MOVEMENT.

Saturday's Dispatches to the Associated Press.

BORNEO, May 9.—J. J. Clancy telegraphed as follows the Sunday Herald, from London: The agitation of last week in England and Scotland, on the Irish bill of the government, has sensibly strengthened Mr. Gladstone's position. Meetings addressed by Lord Spencer, Ripon and Dalhousie, and Messrs. Mundella, Morley and Campbell-Bannerman, together with the speeches of these ministers, have produced a profound impression. So has the premier's manifesto, which has been called in the Tory papers a cry of despair, but which has had the effect in Liberal ranks of a trumpet call to a grand and bold assault on both treacherous friends and open foes. But the greatest sensation of the week has been the decision arrived at by the Liberal caucus. This was Chamberlain's own machine, and it has turned itself into a battering ram in support of the grand old man. It is not merely that the caucus voted for Gladstone by an overwhelming majority, but that at the same time it manifested exceeding bitterness against its parent, and treated him virtually as a traitor. It is an undoubted fact that at a single Liberal meeting in England or Scotland has declared against the government, and is another remarkable fact that not a single Liberal deceiver who has fled his constituency but has been severely reprimanded by the carriage of a vote of censure. Nevertheless, there is little doubt that as soon as a large majority is possible on the second reading of the home rule bill, Gladstone will announce more or less important modifications in that measure in his speech on Monday night. If any inference is correct, he will announce, among other things, that the question of excluding the Irish members from West Ulster will be reconsidered, and if this be done there is equally little doubt that Chamberlain will take advantage of the fact to withdraw his opposition. The report of these events is simply a matter of fact, and is not to be taken as more bluff, but it is felt that it is noticeable in them as officers, and it is possible some of them will be called to account.

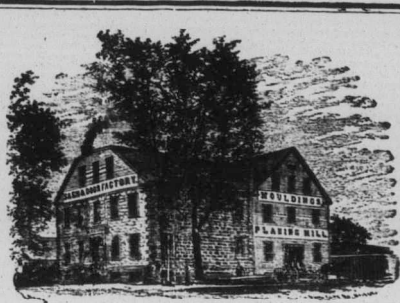
