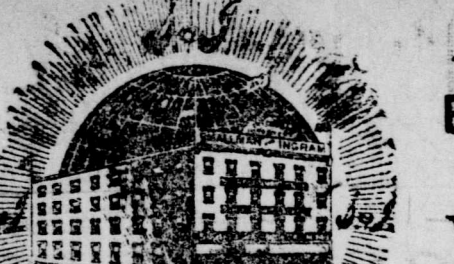

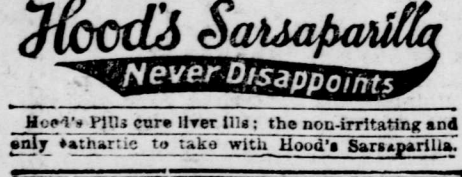

THE MARKETS.

Table listing market prices for various commodities like wheat, oats, and corn in London.

Wheat—Values of this article do not fluctuate. This week's trading though steady was small in volume and lifeless; \$1.05 for good was the basis of all grades.

Oats—The demand was good, and the supply light; this caused prices to advance 3c to 3c per 100 lbs over last week's close. Today 75c was the ruling price.

Peas—Receipts were slow and light; 90c to 92c was the price of feeding grades, and 90c to 92c that of milling. Corn—Both the supply and demand improved; 75c was the general price paid for white, and 73c to 80c for yellow.

No rye offered; the nominal price is 75c. Beans—Quite a few private sales are reported; the price paid ranged from 12c to 13c, mostly 12c. Demand for the open market 11c to 11 1/2c was the range; the demand was steady.

Buckwheat—Very little came in; 50c to 52c was the usual price. Hay—Receipts were uneven; some days plenty and others almost none; this made prices a little unstable.

Straw—Very little trade was done, owing to light receipts; \$2.50 to \$3.50 was the price by the load. Live Hogs—The price has been a little uncertain. Eastern buyers did not seem to want to pay enough to meet sellers' ideas. Sales ranged from \$3 to \$4 for the week, closing at the top price.

Dressed hogs—The demand from local packers and butchers was more than equal to the supply. Prices held steady every day except Thursday, when there were a few sales at 57c to 58c. From then out prices held steady; \$7.50 to \$7.75 was the closing figure for loads of choice and \$8 for single hogs.

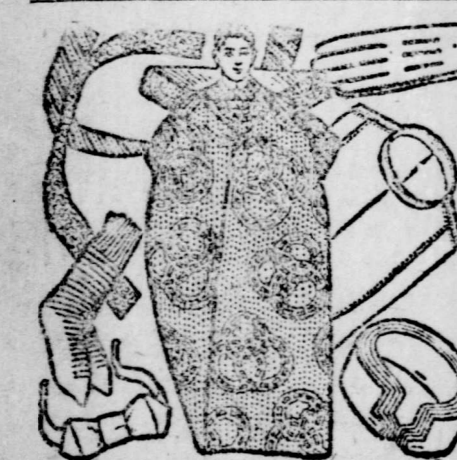

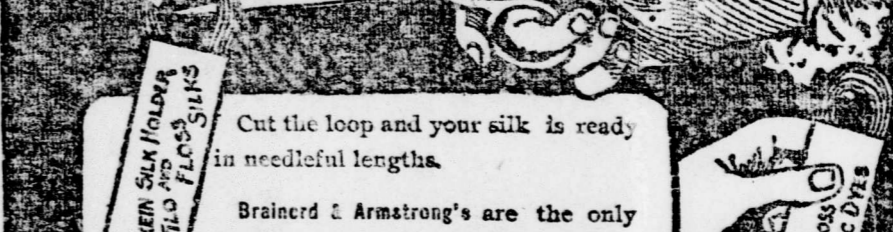
