

Act of Incorporation.

CAP. CXXXI.

An Act to Incorporate "The Hamilton Club."

(Assented to 29th March, 1873).

WHEREAS the persons hereinafter Preamble. named with a large number of others in Hamilton have associated themselves for the establishment of a club for social purposes, and have prayed to be incorporated by the name of "The Hamilton Club," and it is expedient to grant their prayer:

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:

Corporate

Powers of

as now are or hereafter shall become members of the said association shall be and are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate in deed and in name by the name of "The Hamilton Club," and by that name shall have perpetual succession and a common seal, and shall have power from time to time to alter, renew or change such common seal at their pleasure; and shall by the same name from time to time and at all times hereafter be able and capable to purchase, acquire, hold, possess and enjoy, and to have, take and receive to them and their successors to and for the actual occupation of the said corporation any lands, tenements, and hereditaments, and real and immovable property and estate situate, lying and being within the City of Hamilton; and the same to sell, alienate and dispose of whensoever the said corporation may deem it proper so to do; and by the same name shall and may be able and

capable in law to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto in any manner whatsoever; and the constitution, rules and regulations now in force touching the admission and expulsion of members, and the management and conduct generally of the affairs and concerns of the said association, in so far as they may not be inconsistent with the laws of this Province, shall be the constitution, rules and regulations of the said corporation: Provided always, that the said corporation may from time to time alter, repeal, and change such constitution, rules and regulations in the manner provided by the constitution, rules and regulations of the said corporation.

2. All property and effects now Certain property services owned by or held in trust for the in the corporation. said association are hereby vested in the said corporation, and shall be applied solely to the maintenance of the said corporation.

Liability of members limited. 3. No member of the corporation shall be liable for any of the debts thereof beyond a sum which shall be equal to the amount of the original entrance fee, and the annual subscriptions which may remain unpaid by such member and members of the club not being in arrear for entrance fee, subscription or otherwise shall be wholly free from liability for any debt or engagement of the club. Members of the club not in arrear may retire therefrom in the manner provided by the constitution and rules of the club.

Members may retire from the club.

Powers to borrow money. 4. It shall be lawful for the said corporation, with the assent of the members as hereinafter provided for, to raise or borrow either upon mortgage of the real and personal property of the corporation or by the issue of debentures secured thereon as hereinafter provided, or by the issue of stock, or partly in one way and partly in the other, or others, such sum of money as they may deem neces-

sary, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of forty thousand dollars.

- 5. If stock be issued such stock Shares. shall be issued in shares of fifty dollars each, such stock to be subscribed for in a book to be opened for that purpose by the committee of the said club, and to be paid up in such manner and within such time as may be determined by the said committee, and shall bear interest at a rate to be fixed by the said committee.
- 6. If it be decided to raise or bor-Power to mortgage, the said moneys upon mortgage, the said corporation are hereby authorized to execute a mortgage upon their real and personal property or such portions thereof as they may see fit, to secure the repayment of moneys borrowed and interest at the rate to be fixed as aforesaid in such way and manner as may have been agreed upon.
- 7. If it be decided to raise the said Power to issue debentures, moneys upon debentures the said

corporation may pledge and mortgage the real and personal property of the corporation or either thereof for the repayment of the moneys so borrowed and the interest thereon: such debentures may be payable to the bearer or to the order of any person, and shall pass and be transferable by delivery or endorsement thereof respectively.

Special meeting to be called before borrowing money. 8. Provided always, that no money shall be raised in any way or manner until the consent of the majority of the members of the corporation attending in person or represented by proxy at a special meeting to be called for that purpose be first obtained; such special meeting to be called in the manner pointed out by the said constitution, rules and regulations for the calling of special meetings.

Application of

9. The funds so raised shall be applied exclusively in the purchase, improvement, or erection of a clubhouse and dependencies, and in fur-

nishing the same or payment of debts incurred for that or other purposes of the corporation.

to. The shares of such stock shall Transfer of be transferable by assignment on the books of the corporation.

paid up shall be a proprietor of an undivided share of the real estate of the corporation and of the buildings thereon to be erected, subject to any lien or mortgage, or debentures (if any), theretofore granted or issued thereon or to be granted under this Act.

12. It shall be competent to the Paying off said corporation to pay off so much of the said stock, from time to time, as the said committee may deem desirable; the share or shares to be paid off to be selected by the committee by lot or drawings.

13. Such payment may be made Mode of payby depositing in any of the chartered banks in the City of Hamilton, to the

credit of the holder or holders of such share or shares, the amount of such share or shares and of all dividends unpaid thereon, and depositing a notice to that effect in a letter post-paid and deposited in the post-office at Hamilton, addressed to the person who shall, on the books of the corporation, appear to be the owner of said shares, at the post-office address of such holder as stated in said books, and thereupon such share or shares shall *ipso facto* cease to exist.

Winding up the affairs of corporation. 14. If at any time twenty-five or more members of the said corporation shall deem it desirable to wind up the affairs of the said corporation, it shall be lawful for them to call a special meeting of the members of the corporation, to consider the advisability of winding up the affairs of the corporation, provided the notice of such meeting stating distinctly the object thereof be published in one or more of the daily newspapers published in the City of Hamilton for thirty clear

days prior to the holding of such meeting, and a notice, also distinctly stating the object of such meeting, be posted, prepaid, to the address of each member of the corporation as shewn on the books thereof; and if a majority of three-fourths in number of the members of such corporation present or represented by proxy at such meeting, resolve to wind up the affairs of such corporation, it shall be the duty of the officers of such corporation to proceed forthwith to wind up the affairs thereof, and for that purpose to sell and dispose of all the property and assets of the corporation, subject to any lien or encumbrance (if any) existing thereon, and with the proceeds thereof to pay the debts and liabilities of such corporation, and divide the surplus thereof pro rata amongst the members of such corporation.

Rules

(As amended to 17th June, 1902)

Name.

 This Association shall be known as the Hamilton Club.

Former rules.

2. All former Rules are hereby rescinded.

Politics and religion.

3. Politics and religious questions of every kind are absolutely excluded from open discussion in the Club.

Candidates for membership. 4. Each candidate for admission shall be proposed by one member and seconded by another, by a proposal in writing, stating the candidate's usual residence, rank, profession, or other description, which shall be inserted in the book of candidates, and signed by both mover and seconder, and such candidate shall be balloted for at the next ballot, which shall take place after the lapse of two weeks from the time the names of

the candidate and his proposer and seconder, and the day on which the ballot is to take place, have been posted in the Smoking Room under the hand of the Secretary. No ballot shall be valid unless fifteen members actually ballot, and one black ball in five shall exclude. No candidate who shall have been rejected shall be eligible to be proposed again within twelve months. No person shall be admitted a member unless of the full age of twenty-one years.

5. The ballot shall take place be-Rules of Ballot. tween the hours of twelve noon and five p. m., on the first and third Wednesdays of each month, and the Secretary, with at least one member of the Committee, or, in the absence of the Secretary, two members of the Committee shall open the ballot box and declare the result; and any member may vote by proxy at such ballot, such proxy being a special proxy given for such vote only. Should less than fifteen ballots be

cast, the candidate shall be again balloted for on the next Wednesday on which a ballot is held, and so on each succeeding Wednesday on which a ballot is held until fifteen ballots shall be cast.

New member.

6. The Secretary shall furnish each candidate so elected with a copy of the Rules and a memorandum of the amount payable for entrance fee and subscription, and until the same is paid such candidate shall not be deemed to be a member of the Club or entitled to any of the privileges thereof. And if any person heretofore or hereafter elected fails to pay such entrance fee and subscription within four weeks after notification, the election may be declared void by the Committee.

Ordinary mem-

7. The words "ordinary members" shall mean members who have paid the entrance fee required by these Rules, and such privileged members as shall have become entitled to full membership under Rule 9.

8. The entrance fee for ordinary Entrance and subscription. members shall be one hundred dollars, and the annual subscription twenty-five dollars-the latter payable in advance on the first day of December in each year. The subscription of such members balloted for on and after the first day of January shall be a sum equal to two dollars and twenty-five cents per month until the first of December following.

9. There may be privileged mem-Privileged bers who, after being balloted for and elected in the manner pointed out for the election of ordinary members, shall be admitted to the privileges of the Club, but shall not be entitled to vote or have any voice in the management of, or hold any interest in the property of the Club-such privileged members being as follows:

(1) Gentlemen resident at a greater Non-resident. distance than twenty miles from Hamilton, their subscription being \$20

Diplomatic or Consular.

> tative of any foreign state or nation who, being a citizen of such state or nation, is resident in Hamilton, but who had not been previous to his appointment a resident of Hamilton, and who is engaged in no business or calling other than performing of duties of such diplomatic or consular representative, his subscription being \$12.50 half-yearly, in advance; (3) Officers in His Majesty's Army and Navy, and officers of His Majesty's Active Militia permanent force of the Dominion of Canada or any colony of Great Britain, and all persons holding civil and military appointments under the Imperial Government, who may be stationed in Canada temporarily, their subscription being \$12.50 half-yearly, in advance;

Any diplomatic or consular represen-

Officers, etc. in Army or Navy.

Persons of temporary residence.

(4) Any persons who shall satisfy the Committee that their residence in the country is temporary and uncertain, and subject to be terminated by the occurrence of circumstances be-

yond their control, their subscription being \$5.00 monthly, in advancethe temporary residence of such strangers not to exceed twelve months; (5) Residents of Hamilton, Residents of Hamilton. or within twenty miles thereof, their subscription being \$20.00 half-yearly in advance for ten consecutive years, after which they shall be entitled to full membership with all its privileges, without further ballot.

10. Any member of the Club who Members ceasshall cease to be a resident in Ham-Hamilton, or ilton, or within twenty miles thereof, thereof, annual fee of \$10,00, or may, by the payment of an annual fee they may become supernumerary of ten dollars, retain all the privileges members. of full membership, or, if he so elect, may, on notifying the Committee, be deemed a supernumerary member, and exempt from payment of subscription so long as he shall not be a resident of Hamilton, or within twenty miles thereof, and shall not in any way make use of the Club or exercise any of his privileges therein; but any member availing himself of this latter

ing to reside in within 20 miles

Re-admission to

indulgence must notify the same by letter to the Secretary, who shall insert his name in the book of Supernumerary members. In either case, any such member shall be re-admitted to all his privileges upon his again becoming a resident of Hamilton. and on his return being notified in writing to the Secretary, such notification to be given one month after his return, and upon payment of a proportionate subscription for the current year, if his return dates after the first of January, at the rate of \$2.25 per month; and failing in such notification and payment within the time before limited, unless the delay can be justified to the satisfaction of the Committee, such member shall be considered to have withdrawn from the Club, provided that the Secretary having reasonable grounds for believing that any such member has returned to Hamilton as a resident, or in the case of a supernumerary member, has been availing himself of the

privileges of the Club, may notify such member that his privileges as a non-resident or superuumerary member have ceased and require the payment of the proper proportional subscription in the terms of this rule.

11. Any member shall have the Introducing friends. privilege of introducing a friend resident elsewhere than in Hamilton, or within fifteen miles thereof, for a period not exceeding two weeks, provided the name of such person has received the written recommendation of two members, and been submitted and approved of by the Committee, and the person so admitted shall thereafter be a privileged member of the Club for two weeks, subject to such regulations as the Committee may, from time to time, prescribe; and after the said period of two weeks for such further period as the Committee sanction, upon payment of \$5.00 monthly in advance. Such friend shall not for the ensuing three months be eligible for re-introduction. Any member

shall have the privilege of introducing a friend resident elsewhere than in Hamilton or within fifteen miles therefrom, for a period not exceeding three days, provided the name of such friend shall have been previously subscribed in the Visitor's book. The privileges of visitors may be terminated at the discretion of the Committee.

Power of Committee as to visitors. 12. The Committee shall have the power to admit to the privileges of the Club, as visiting members, for such period as they may from time to time see fit, any stranger of distinguished rank or position visiting Hamilton, to whom it may seem proper to offer such a compliment, and to make such regulations in regard thereto as they may think proper.

Life members how elected. 13. Life members may hereafter be elected only at any of the annual general meetings of the Club, on the vote of a majority of two-thirds of the members present in person or by proxy, provided the name of the per-

son or persons who are proposed to be so elected shall have been first submitted to the Committee, at a meeting held at least three months before the day fixed for holding the annual meeting; and a notice stating the name and residence of each candidate and of his proposer and seconder shall have been posted in the Smoking Room one month prior to the holding of the annual meeting. Life members now elected, or who shall hereafter be elected, shall not be liable to pay any yearly subscription to the Club, nor have any interest in its affairs or voice in its management, but they shall be subject to all other rules and regulations of the Club in the same way as ordinary members.

14. All privileged members, whether Privileged members who use the resident in Hamilton or otherwise, club liable for subscription. whose terms of subscription shall have expired, shall be considered as retaining their membership if they continue to make use of the Club, and shall be held liable for

their subscription in advance, as usual.

Members of other clubs eligible for election.

15. All members of such other Clubs as the Committee may from time to time designate, whose usual place of residence shall be distant thirty miles from Hamilton, shall be eligible for election as members of this Club, and on election shall be entitled to all its privileges (except that of voting or having any voice in the management, or holding any interest in the property of the Club), on payment of an annual subscription to be fixed by the Committee, provided such Club or Clubs extend the like privileges to this Club. The ballot to be dispensed with as regards the members of those Clubs extending the like courtesy to the members of this Club, and in such case the introduction by a member of the Club and the sanction of the Committee shall alone be necessary.

Qualification of voters.

16. No member shall be allowed to ballot for a candidate, or be permit-

ted to vote on any occasion whatever, or enjoy any of the privileges of the Club, who has not paid his entrance fee, or has been in arrear for his annual subscription for six weeks.

17. Any member failing to pay his Members failing annual subscription or dues within subscription. two months from the time the same shall become due, shall be reported to the Committee by the Secretary, and the Committee may cause his name to be erased from the list of members, unless the delay can be justified to the satisfaction of the Committee, and he shall thereafter in consequence of such erasure cease to be a member; but notwithstanding such erasure and such ceasing to be a member, such former member shall still be liable to pay his subscription and dues to the same extent as if he continued to be a member for the then current year.

18. The member introducing a Liability for friend as a privileged member shall duced. be answerable for any debt he may

incur to the Club or the Steward. and for any damage done by him to the Club property.

Pay club bills.

10. All members are to pay their bills for every expense they may incur in the Club, before they leave the house. The name of every member, whose dues or debts to the Club shall have remained unpaid for one month after the same shall have become due, shall be posted in the Club

20. All entrance fees and annual subscriptions shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Club.

Members may withdraw.

21. Any member whose dues are all paid shall be at liberty to withdraw from the Club, on his written application to that effect, sent to the Committee before the annual meeting of the Club.

Effect of withdrawal, resigna-

22. Any member who shall withtion or expulsion. draw, resign or be expelled, or whose name shall be erased from the list of members for any cause, in accordance with the regulations of this Club shall

cease to be a member of the Club. and shall forfeit ipso facto all right or claim thereon or in, or to its property or funds, except in respect of any debt the Club may owe him for moneys advanced or lent to the Club; and any member who shall be expelled shall forever thereafter be ineligible to be re-admitted a member of the Club. The Committee may, in their discretion, reinstate a former member who has withdrawn in good standing, without ballot, on payment of another entrance fee.

23. All affairs of the Club shall be Committee of Management. managed by a Committee to consist of nine members, who shall be elected by ballot at the annual general meeting of the Club, and no member shall be so elected as one of the Committee who has not been first proposed by one member and seconded by another member, and such ballot shall be taken after at least nine members have been proposed and seconded, and after that when five minutes shall

have elapsed without any name being proposed and seconded. They shall thereafter from their number elect by ballot a Chairman, and appoint a Secretary and Treasurer (who shall not be a member of the Committee), or one person to hold both offices, as they think best; and the said Committee shall have full power to make such regulations for the conduct of the business entrusted to them, and all other matters consistent with these General Rules and Regulations, and to alter and amend the same from time to time as they shall see fit, and shall record such regulations and amendments in a book to be kept for that purpose, and also post the same in the Club for the information of the members.

Vacancy on Committee by death, etc. 24. If any member elected to serve on the Committee shall resign, or should a vacancy occur by death, or should any member of the Committee have ceased to attend the regular meetings of the Committee for a

period of three months consecutively, the Committee shall have power to choose a qualified member to act in his stead until the annual meeting next ensuing.

25. The three senior members of Three senior each retiring Committee shall be annually. ineligible for re-election for one year. Should there be a greater number than three members of the Committee being senior to the others who shall have served an equal time, the Committee shall at its last meeting next before the Annual General Meeting, decide by ballot from such greater number, the three who shall be considered senior members and ineligible for re-election at the ensuing Annual General Meeting.

26. The Committee shall meet at Meetings of such periods as they may deem expedient to transact current business and to audit the accounts, and four shall be a quorum.

It shall be the duty of the Com-Duty of Committee to take immediate cognizance fraction of rules.

of any infraction of the Rules and Regulations of the Club.

Annual meetings

27. There shall be a general meeting of the Club on the third Thursday in December in each year for the purpose of electing the Committee for the succeeding year, at which meeting it shall be the duty of the Committee to present a report and abstract of the state of accounts and general concerns of the Club for the past year, which report shall be printed and distributed amongst all the members at least one week before such annual meeting. Notices of any motions to be brought up at the annual meeting shall be left with the Secretary at least fourteen days before such meeting, and no proposal, of which notice has not been given, shall be entertained at such meeting, and all such notices shall be posted by the Secretary in the Smoking Room of the Club at least one week before the day of such meeting.

Notices of motion.

Annual financial statement.

28. The annual financial statement

of the year shall distinctly show the total amount of revenue that should be received from members subscribing for the year, and the net amount of subscriptions paid up, together with the balance due for subscriptions for the year, and the amount of assets and liabilities of the Club: and the accounts of the Club, when presented by the Committee, shall be audited by one member (not being a member of the Committee), who shall have been appointed by the Club at the last preceding general meeting of the Club, and the auditor already elected shall audit the accounts for the current year.

20. The Committee shall have Extraordinary power at all times to convene an Extraordinary Meeting of the Club on giving seven days' notice, to be posted up during that period in the Smoking room, and mailed to each member specifying the object of such meeting in the form of a resolution. at which meeting no subject shall be

discussed beyond that specified in the notice.

Special general meeting—how called. 30. The Committee, on being requested in writing by twenty members of the Club, shall forthwith call a general meeting, giving a week's notice thereof (such notice to specify the object of the meeting), and to be given as provided for in Rule 29.

Quorum.

31. A quorum of fifteen qualified members shall be necessary to constitute any annual or special meeting of the Club, and the Chairman shall take the chair at all Club meetings, and in his absence the members present at such meeting shall elect a Chairman.

House hours.

32. The Club shall be open every day for the reception of members at 8 a. m., and shall be closed and the lights extinguished at 1 a. m., except on Saturdays and Sundays, when the hour of closing shall be midnight; and no member shall be admitted into or remain in the Club after these hours, on any pretence whatever,

unless specially authorized by the Committee.

- 33. No member shall, on any pre- No profits or gratuities tence or in any manner whatsoever, receive any profits, salary or emolument from the funds of the Club, except the Secretary or Treasurer or Auditor, if a member of the Club be appointed to these offices, or cither of them, nor shall any member give any money or gratuity to any of the servants of the establishment upon any pretence whatever; it being understood that this rule is not intended to preclude any member of the Club from selling property or goods, or stocks, or other money securities to the Club, or buying any of the same from the Club.
- 34. No member shall take away No papers to be from the Club, upon any pretence whatsoever, any newspaper, pamphlet, book, map, or other article the property of the institution.
- 35. No servant of the Club shall Servants not to be sent out of the house on any errands.

errands on any pretence whatever, unless on Club business by a member of the Committee, or to post letters at stated periods, or to call a cab from the nearest cabstand.

Complaints.

36. All complaints respecting the administration of the Club, the servants, or domestic arrangements thereof, must be stated by letter signed by the member complaining, which letter addressed to the Secretary must be laid by him before the Committee at their next meeting, to be dealt with as they may think proper.

No gambling.

37. No dice shall be used in the Club-house except at backgammon. Whist shall not be played for any higher stakes than twenty-five cent points. Other games may be played for limited stakes—the limit of the stakes to be fixed by the Committee.

Censures.

Any member infringing this Article, on his name being reported to the Committee, shall be censured, and the censure shall be posted in the Card Room; and any member whose name

shall be twice so posted within twelve months shall ipso facto cease to belong to the Club, and his name shall be erased from the list of members.

38. Any member, at his own ex-Restrictions as pense, shall have the privilege of members. introducing a friend or friends to breakfast, lunch or dinner, provided the name or names of such friend or friends shall have been previously entered on the Visitor's Book, but no member shall introduce any person being a resident of the City to the privileges of the Club, except for the purposes in this Rule mentioned. unless by the consent of the Committee. No person under the age of sixteen years shall be introduced or admitted to the Club premises.

39. Smoking shall not be permitted Smoking in the Reading Room, or in the Dining Room, except on the occasion of house dinners, and then only after the removal of the cloth.

40. No dog shall be brought into No dogs. the Club.

Infraction of

41. Any member wilfully infringing the Rules or Regulations of the Club, or being guilty of conduct in or out of the Club, which, in the opinion of the Committee or of any ten members, who shall certify the same in writing to the Committee, is detrimental to the character or the interest of the Club, or conduct unbecoming a gentleman, shall be liable to suspension from all privileges of the Club on a vote of a majority of the Committee, subject to an appeal to a meeting of the Club, to be held within fourteen days after notice of such suspension, of which meeting at least seven days' notice must be given, and if such suspension is sustained by a majority of qualified members at the general meeting so called, or if the member suspended fail to notify the Secretary to call such meeting, he shall be considered to be expelled and forfeit all privileges of the Club, including his entrance fee and his subscription for the current year.

- 42. No proxies shall be allowed at Proxies. any meeting of the Club, except as expressly authorized by the Act of Incorporation or these rules.
- 43. Any Article of these rules may Alteration of be altered, amended or suspended for any length of time, or any new rule or regulation introduced, by consent of two-thirds of the members present at any meeting specially convened for that purpose, provided such alteration, amendment, suspension or new rule shall have been specified in the notice summoning such meeting.
