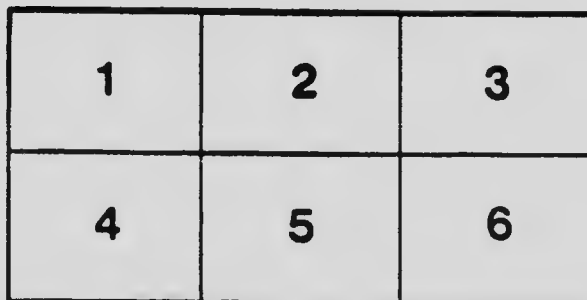

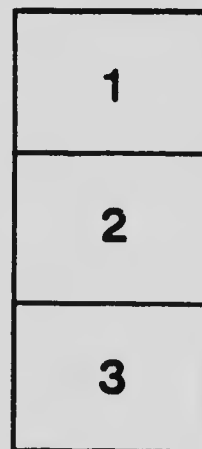

TO THE SHAREHOLDERS OF THE CALEDON MOUNTAIN TROUT CLUB, LIMITED:



THE Charter of Incorporation of the Caledon Mountain Trout Club, Limited, authorizes the Corporation it creates to maintain a fishing and shooting Club upon and for the enjoyment of its properties.

The Directors, a short time after the completion of the Club House, passed the necessary By-laws for the constitution of the authorized Club under the name of "The Caledon Mountain Trout Club," copies of these By-laws have been in the hands of members for some months.

The first Club season commenced with the opening of the Club House, on May 1st, 1903, and closed on the 22nd September, 1903.

The By-laws adopted creating the Club constitute the shareholders of the Caledon Mountain Trout Club, Limited, as its membership.

The first season, of course, was necessarily a new venture in all its features, and the Directors feel great pleasure in having to congratulate the membership on the results. Of the total 271 members of the Club, 150 visited and stayed at the Club House alone, or with their families or friends. Many returned more than once. Expressions of the utmost satisfaction and pleasure at what the Club possesses and with the manner in which its accommodation and appointments, and the way it has been carried on, and the extreme beauty of its surroundings have been universal. Members, not content with verbal expressions, have written letters which have been a source of much gratification to the Directors.

Many engagements to return next year have already been made. The manager reports that the prospects are that the Club House accommodation will be fully taxed during the season of 1904. This will mean a considerable surplus revenue from that source.

The past season was, as all know, cold in its early weeks. This fact, combined with the necessity on the part of members of learning what the advantages of the Club House were, made the growth of patronage somewhat gradual.

As the season wore on the patronage not only increased but became more regular. At the end of the accommodation available was called into requisition.

The pecuniary result for the past season is, nevertheless, that the receipts have, in the case of the Club House, resulted in a small surplus. The figures are as follows:

Thus it is seen that it cleared itself, and for the season of 1903 has been no expense to the Corporation, and next year must prove a source of profit.

The care of the fish and nurseries and hatcheries has occupied much of the Directors' time and thought. They found that the men in charge were able to carry on the work to all appearances satisfactorily. However, to reassure themselves on this subject, and also with the object of ascertaining from a well qualified and independent source the proper view to take of the care and propagation of the fish, Mr. Monroe A. Green of Rochester, New York, late of the New York State Fish Hatcheries, was called in, who made a most thorough and careful investigation of the Club's properties, nursing ponds and hatcheries. He has expressed himself satisfied of the great value of the properties we hold and of their future success, not only as a fishing proposition for the members, but as a commercial enterprise for the sale of eyed eggs, fry and yearlings for restocking depleted waters in Canada and the United States. From these sources large profits are realizable.

It has been found necessary to preserve all our first years' product for the purpose of thoroughly stocking the Club's own waters and to provide for the future.

It is satisfactory, however, to know upon what the Directors deem to be undoubted authority that the foundations for commercial profits have been well laid, and with care will be realized in a short time. Mr. Green reports favourably of the men whom the Directors have charged with the care of the fish and properties.

The Club House during the season has been completed according to the original design and furnished. Bedroom accommodation for sixty members is provided. The experience of the year shows that some alterations will be expedient in the kitchen and servants' department, which the Directors propose to make before the opening next season. This will not involve any large expenditure.

Of the total number of shares (333) of the Capital Stock (par value \$300 each) 271 shares have been subscribed, allotted and paid in full, leaving 62 shares which have so far been held as Treasury stock.

Not only has everything which was promised to subscribers in the prospectus now been provided and completed, but the Directors have felt called upon to do more than the prospectus called for, thus adding greatly to the comfort of members. The most important of these additional works are:—

- (a) *The right of five and one-half miles of stream fishing on the River Credit which has been acquired.*
- (b) *First-class Tennis Courts, Lawn Bowling Grounds and Inanimate Bird Traps have been provided, and a Golf Course on adjoining property has been rented and laid out, and has been used this season. It is hoped to have it in good order next season.*

(c) *The original estimate for the Club House and furnishing was found to be entirely inadequate to build and furnish a suitable and permanent abiding place for members and their families. The large membership compelled a better provision at a larger expense, which has been provided to the satisfaction of everybody.*

(d) *Another feature added is the Annex Building containing 14 additional bedrooms upstairs, the ground floor being occupied by Billiard and Pool Tables, Amusement Rooms and Rathskeller, all appropriately furnished and affording a lounging place for members of the most unique kind, and one which has caused great surprise and much pleasure to all who have visited it.*

A Summer Home, unexcelled in salubrity, in the beauty of its situation and surroundings and the comfort and luxury of its appointments, is now provided for the members to which they can bring their families and their friends.

The several properties acquired with the cost of acquisition and improvements to date is shown below:

As the steps in carrying out the proposition have successively been taken, the fact that later subscribers for shares were buying into an established concern, (in which the previous shareholders had taken the risk involved in the initiation and launching of the proposition) was recognized in the premiums paid on the last thirty-five shares sold. The price gradually rose from par value \$300 to \$700 per share at which last price several shares were subscribed and paid in full.

Your directors feeling that the completed enterprise would warrant a large premium on the price of the unsold shares have not felt justified hitherto in pressing the shares for sale and they do not now advise that course as necessary. It is, however, proposed to offer twenty shares at \$700; twenty shares at \$800, and to hold the remaining twenty-two shares at \$1,000 or more per share.

The Directors estimate that they will, in view of the past sales of shares, realize from the unsold shares for the Club's benefit enough to provide a surplus of about \$15,000 in the Club's treasury.

They propose also to dispose of the Gooderham farm, retaining the portion necessary for the nurseries there, to secure which the farm was purchased. It is not required by the Club. This will bring in about \$5,000.00.

The Directors have every confidence in the future of the Club; they have given their care and time without stint to its affairs from the beginning with a view to its development with due regard to economy, and they feel a pride in the results which have been achieved. This the Directors have done without having asked for or received any remuneration whatever beyond the satisfaction arising from the successful development of the proposition which they deem an ample recompense.

In conclusion, we would draw the attention of shareholders to the list of members which accompanies this report. The members have been selected and their subscription invited by private interview. It will be seen that the membership is of gentlemen of high standing in Canada and the United States. It is proposed to continue the course hitherto adopted, so that only unexceptionable members shall be introduced. Necessarily this course involves much trouble and some expense, which the directors think the purpose fully justifies.

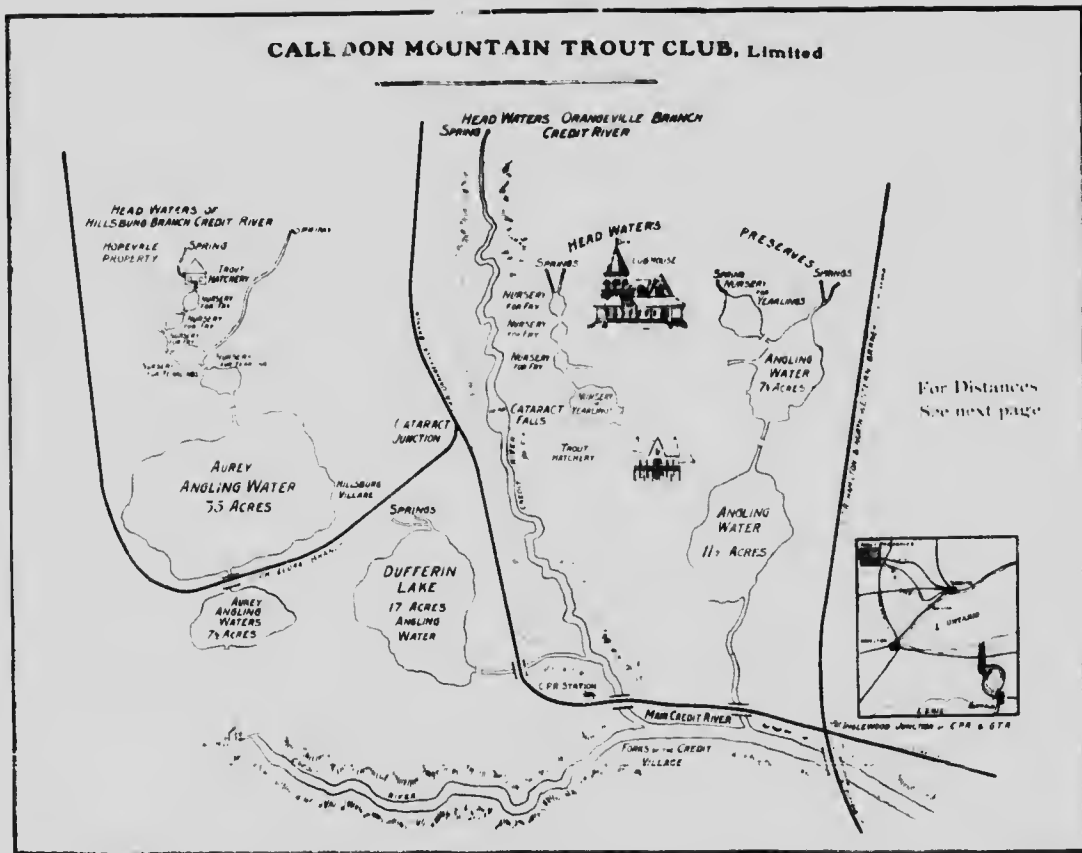
