### A CLOSURE STRIKES THE PENNSYLVANIA MINING CITY.

### Many Lives Reported Lost—Hundreds of Buildings Wrecked—The Damage to Property Estimated at \$200,000—The Storm Takes a Wide Sweep Through the Keystone State.

### WILKESBARRE, Pa., Aug. 19.—At 5 o'clock this afternoon the most terrific cyclone that was ever experienced in this locality struck this city. It came up the river. From what point it originated is not known. The suddenness of its coming was one of its most awful features. The winds were as black as night, the wind blew with most frightful velocity, while rows of trees were blown down, following this hundreds of houses were unroofed, partially blown over or completely demolished, and worse than all, the victims of death were sent upon a number of people. How many were killed is not known at this time. Large districts in several sections of the city are in complete ruins, and houses and children are in the streets crying and wringing their hands in absolute dismay. The damage will reach hundreds of thousands of dollars.

### Passenger trains and locomotives at the depot were blown over and every wire in the city, electric light, telephone and telegraph lines, were blown down, with nothing in the memory of the oldest inhabitant. Everybody is rejoicing that there has not been a fatal case of fire, as it is impossible with trees and fallen buildings that the engines could not be drawn through.

### A LIBERAL PAPER DEMANDING THEIR ABOLITION.

### The Sums That go to the Registrars of Ontario—High Time to Reform These Abuses—But Not by Dividing the Office in Two as Mr. Mowat Has Been Doing—A Startling Admission.

### From the Montreal Examiner (Editorial).

### The Registrar of the Province of Ontario has been furnished a statement of the returns made to the Provincial Secretary of all the fees and emoluments received by the registrars of Ontario for the year 1888.

### Before commenting on what these returns disclose, it may be noted that the good deal of looseness in the manner in which the registry business is conducted. Proper books of account have, of course, been provided, but it is impossible to tell whether or not the registrars enter all the fees that are received, and there is no system of audit whatever. The latter a certain number of auditors in practice, and one that should not be suffered longer to exist. For want of better machinery, there should at least be an audit by the county auditors. To this the registrars can make no reasonable objection, because when the fees exceed \$2000 the county auditors are entitled to percentages, being 10 per cent on the next \$500, with an additional percentage on each succeeding \$500 until 50 per cent is reached. Had there been such a system of audit the extensive defalcations that have been discovered in the Waterloo registry office would have been detected long ago.

### The returns are not made in a manner readily understood, and there is evidently some confusion on the part of the registrars themselves as to what the different headings call for. Taking, however, the leading aggregate amount of fees and emoluments earned by registrars during the year 1888 by virtue of his office, the following are the disbursements which apparently include the amount due the counties, the following result is arrived at:

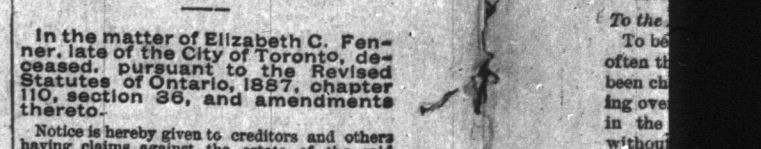
