BODY FOUND FLOATING IN THE BAY Somebody's Baby Picked Up Dead in the Street.

Batholomew Fowler, a farmer from Oxford County, who was killed by the westbound suburban train, 50 yards north of Brockview crossing, at 4.30 o'clock yesterday afternoon and beheaded.

The gateman at the Brockview crossing states that the engineer informed him that Fowler stepped in front of the train, being struck immediately. The train was stopped at once and the head, covered with blood and dirt, removed from under the wheels, the trunk being left lying between the rails.

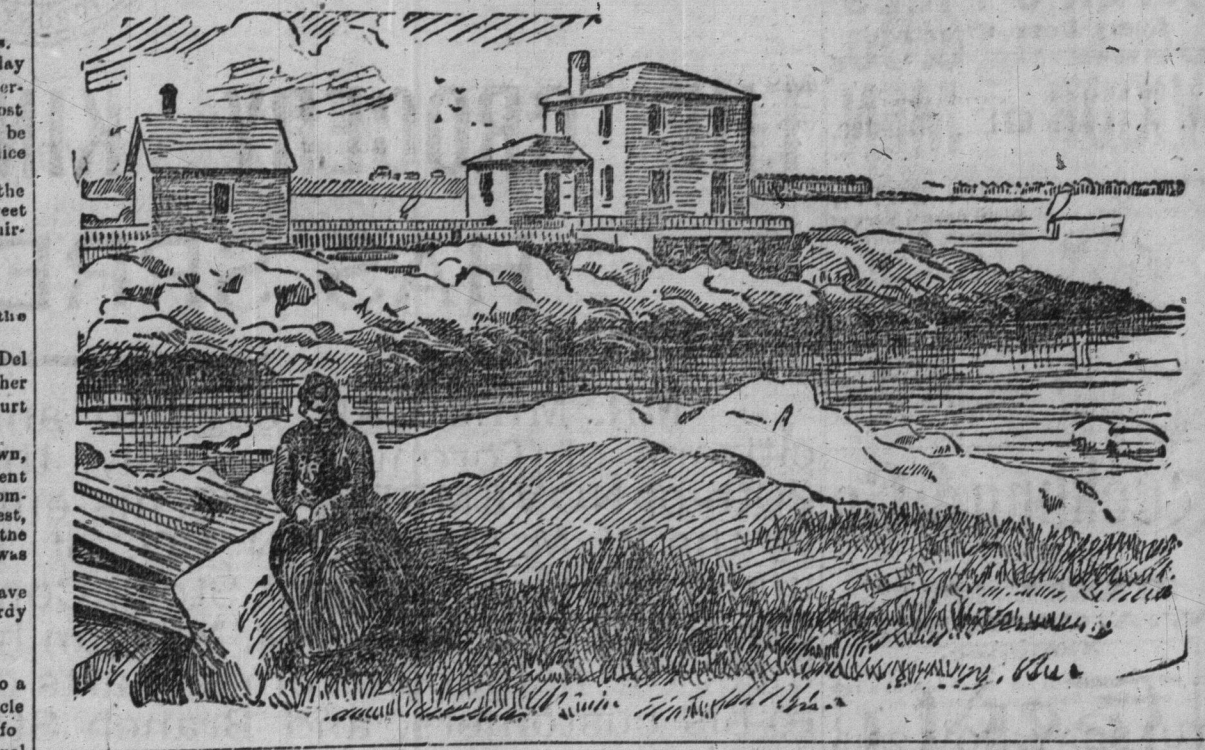

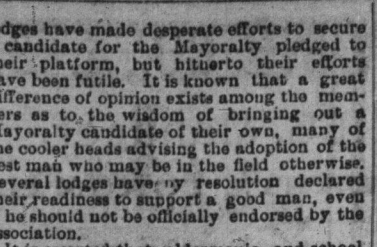

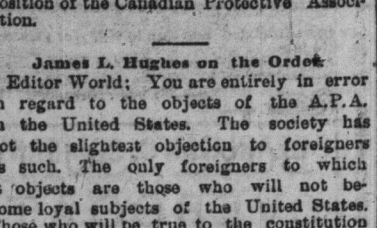
