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## ECLIPSES.

There will this year be FOUR Eclipses—two of the Sun and two of the Moon—occurring as follows :—

I.—6th of May, an Anular Ecilpse of the Sun, partly visible—

Rises  $6\frac{1}{2}$  digits eclipsed, 4h 44m } Mean time  
Eclipse ends..... 5h 18m } Morning.  
Duration of visibility, 34 minutes.

II.—21st May, Total Eclipse of the Moon—invisible at Montreal.

III.—30th October, Annular Eclipse of the Sun—invisible at Montreal.

IV.—13th November, a Partial Eclipse of the Moon, visible—Beginning, 6h 23m. evg. —Middle, 8h 2m—End, 9h 41m.—Magnitude (Moon's diam. = 1) 0.92 on northern limb.

There will be a Transit of Mercury over the sun's disc on the 8th May, visible as follows;—Beginning, 11h 32m: morning—End, 6h 1m evg.—Nearest distance of centres 9' 6" 6h 1m—Duration of transit, 6h 29m

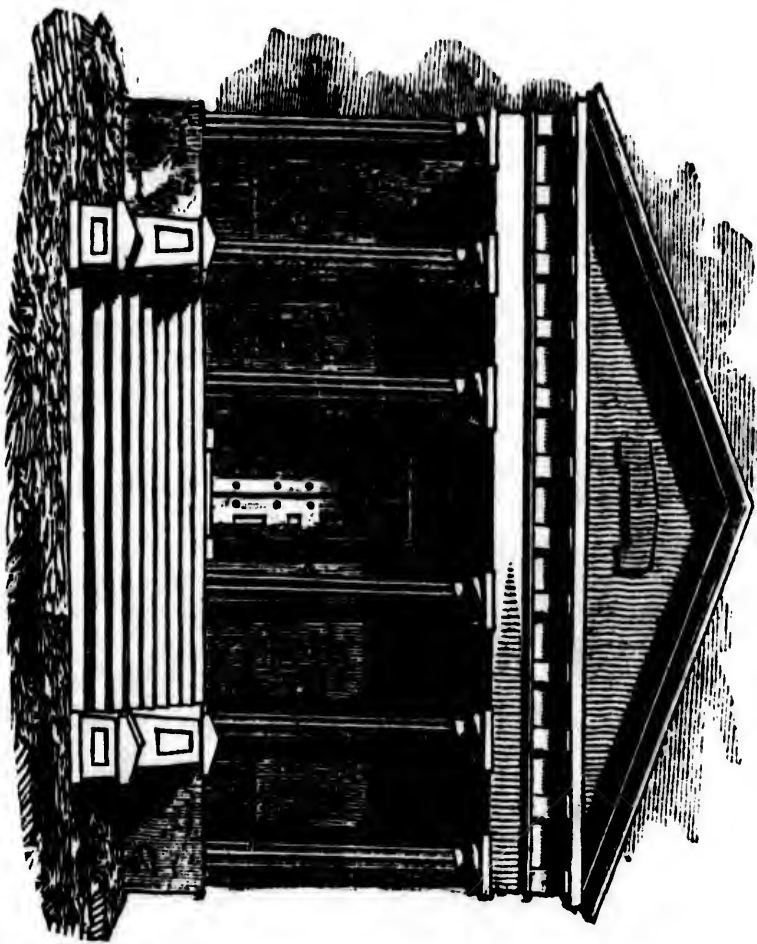

REMARKS.

The duties stated in the foregoing table are in sterling money, collected in currency at £1 4s. 4d. (\$4.87)  $\frac{1}{2}$  £ sterling.

The *ad valorem* duties under the Imper. Act are calculated on the value at the port of entry, which value is generally ascertained by adding 10  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. to the invoice price.

The *ad valorem* duties under the Provincial Act 4 & 5 Vict. cap. 14, are calculated on the actual cost of the articles where purchased.

Bonds, satisfactory to the Collector, will be taken for Provincial duties exceeding £50 cy. at six months; but all such bonds dated on or after the 1st September, become due on the 1st April next ensuing.

All goods imported into Canada can be bonded and warehoused, without the payment of any duty upon the first entry thereof, at the duly constituted warehousing ports.

The several rates of *ad valorem* duties are easily computed,—20  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. being equal to one-fifth,—15  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. to one-tenth and one-half of that tenth,—10  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. to one-tenth,—7  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. to one-twentieth and two-fifths of that twentieth,—5  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. to one-twentieth,—and 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent. to one-fifth of one-fifty—of the value on which the duty is to be calculated.

### Remarks

#### ON THE CURRENCY OF CANADA, VALUE OF COINS, &c.

The values assigned to the several coins by the Currency Act are not arbitrary, but are proportioned (except in the case of British silver) to the quantity of pure gold or silver in each. The £ currency was and is equal to 4 dollars of account; and a note for 100 dollars either in Upper or Lower Canada, is now, as it has always been, payable by £25 cy., in any coins equivalent by law to that sum.—By the Currency Act the Provincial dollar of account is made equal in value to that of the United States; and the Eagle coined after 1834 and before 1841, and passing there for 10 dollars, is therefore made to pass for £2 10s. cy.—and the *Par* is £1 cy. = 4 dollars of account of the United States, the value of any sum being always that of the *least* valuable coins by which

it can be legally paid. The weight of pure gold in an Eagle and in a Sovereign are such, that if the former be worth £2 10s. the latter will be worth £1 4s. 4d. cy. which is the value the act assigns to it and to the £ sterling, and agrees with the value ( $\$4\ 86\frac{2}{3}$ ) assigned to it by law in the United States.—The *Par* of cy. and stg. is therefore £1 stg. = £1 4s. 4d. cy., or £100 stg. = £121 13s. 4d. cy. (or £121 $\frac{2}{3}$ ) cy. But 10 silver dollars of proper weight and fineness, are worth *more* than an Eagle, or 10 dollars of account,—so that the silver dollar is really worth *nearly* 5s. 1d. cy., for which sum it is directed to pass. In the same manner the values of certain other foreign coins are ascertained and assigned. But as subsequent coins of the same nations might vary in weight or fineness,—such coins are not to be a legal tender unless under a proclamation issued after assay. British silver forms the exception to the rule stated; it is only worth, as silver, 10-11 of the nominal value for which it passes on the faith of the British Government. This nominal value is maintained by the Currency Act, and such coins, *while lawfully current in Great Britain*, pass for sums proportionate to their nominal value there, at the rate of £1 4s. 4d. cy. for £1 stg.; but for the reasons above stated, it is provided that they shall not be a legal tender for more than £2 10s. cy. in any one payment.—At the foregoing rates,

1d. sterling is = 1,21666, &c. of 1d. cy.

1d. currency is = ,821917, &c. of 1d. stg.

The rule for converting sterling into currency will be—Add one-fifth and one-twelfth of that fifth—or multiply by 73 and divide by 60.

For converting currency into sterling—multiply by 60 and divide by 73.

For converting dollars at 5s. 1d. into dollars at 5s.—Multiply by 61 and divide by 60;—and for converting dollars at 5s. into dollars at 5s. 1d.—Multiply by 60 and divide by 61.

The coins current by the Act, are:—

British gold coins at the rate of £1 4s. 4d. cy. to £1 stg. American Eagles coined before 1st July, 1834, at £2 13s. 4d. cy.—Do. coined between 1st July, 1834, and 1st January, 1841, at £2 10s.—and at the same rates for half Eagles, &c.

British gold and American gold coined before 1834, at 94s 10d. cy. per oz. troy.—

American gold coined between 1834 and 1841, at 93s. cy. per oz. troy.—

Coined before } Gold coin of France, at 93s. 1d. cy.  
Apr 26 } Do of LaPlata & Columbia, at 89s. 5d.  
1842. } Do. of Portugal & Brazil, at 94s. 6d.  
Sp. Mex. & Chilian Dubs. at 89s 7d. cy.  
—if offered respectively in sums of not less than £50 cy., at one time.

British silver as above stated.

The dollars of Spain, United States, Peru, Chili, Central America, States of S. America, and of Mexico, coined before 1841, at 5s 1d cy. and half dollars at 2s 6d cy. Quarters at 1s 3d. Eighths at 7½d. and sixteenths at 3½d.

French 5 franc silver pieces, coined before 26th April, 1842, at 4s. 8d. each.

Copper coins of the United Kingdom, (or any to be coined by Her Majesty, of not less than five-sixths the weight of such coin) at their nominal rates.

The least legal weight of a Sovereign is, 5 dwts. 2½ grs.—of an Eagle coined before 1834, 11 dwts. 6 grs.—after 1834, 10 dwts. 18 grs.—of a Dollar, 17 dwts. 4 grs.—of a 5 franc piece, 16 dwts.

#### REGULATIONS AND RATES.

##### LETTERS.

1.—All letters sent by post in Canada and other Provinces of British North America, are *charged BY WEIGHT*.

2.—The scale of weight for charging postage is the same as that by which letters to and from the United Kingdom are charged, viz. :—

For a Letter not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz	.....	1 Rate.
Do do	1 oz	.....2 Rates.
Do do	2 oz	.....4 Rates.
Do do	3 oz	.....6 Rates.

And so on, adding two rates for every additional ounce. After the first ounce, fractional parts are not noticed; thus, if a letter exceed 1 oz. it becomes liable to four rates, and if it exceed 2 oz. to six rates.

3.—The *Rates of Postage* on letters are—

 (without regard to the number of pieces

4.—Letters to and from the United Kingdom are subject to a uniform charge of 1s. 4d. currency, per half oz. ; and on letters *via the United States*, the Provincial charge is a uniform rate of 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. from any part of Canada to the frontier line, and 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. for every additional half ounce. This charge must be pre-paid, as also the American postage to the Atlantic port,—Boston or New-York.

NEWSPAPERS.

Colonial Newspapers not exceeding 2 oz. sent by post to any other place within the British North American Provinces, pay one halfpenny, *to be pre-paid or not at the option of the sender.*

If sent to any British Colony beyond sea, (not intended to pass through the United Kingdom,) or to any foreign country, except the U. States—one halfpenny—*to be pre-paid.*

If sent to any part of the United States—one penny—*to be pre-paid.*

Newspapers sent from the United States, are liable, on delivery, to a Provincial rate of one penny, in addition to the U. S. postage.

Colonial newspapers sent to the United Kingdom, or to any Br. Colony by way of England, and British newspapers from the U. Kingdom to any part of Canada—exempt from any charge for postage.

With exception of these last, (which are not limited as to weight,) a newspaper to pass under the foregoing regulations, must not exceed 2 oz. otherwise it becomes liable to pamphlet postage, *i. e.* one penny per oz.

British and U. States papers, if *re-posted* in this Province, liable to full letter postage.

Supplements charged as distinct newspapers.

#### VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS IN PARLIAMENT.

If sent to the U. Kingdom by packet, or to any part of British North America or British West Indies,—one penny for every four ounces.

If intended to be sent to the U. Kingdom by private ship,—double the above rates.

No packet or cover containing votes or Legislative proceedings permitted to be sent through the Post, if exceeding six pounds weight.

#### PAMPHLETS AND OTHER PUBLICATIONS.

If printed in the U. Kingdom, British North America, or British West Indies, may be sent to any place in British North America, the U. States, or British West Indies, at the reduced inland rate of one penny per oz. in addition to sea postage; provided they do not exceed 16 oz.

If printed and mailed in the United States, they are liable on delivery in this Province to the same rate of one penny per oz.; but if re-posted in Canada, they are charged with full letter postage.

Newspapers, Pamphlets, Publications, and Parliamentary Proceedings, must be sent without covers, or with covers open at the ends. If this is not done, or if there be any marks or writing on them besides the address, full letter postage will be charged.
