New York, April 5.—Thomas Edison, the "Wizard" of West Orange, N. J., was in a very happy mood when he reported to his laboratory in West Orange, N. J., that he had completed another machine, which he calls the "Vitascope." It is an improvement on the Kinetoscope. Mr. Edison says he has no doubt that it will prove to be a success.

The Vitascope throws upon a screen the moving light-size figures of human beings and animals. Last night a picture of a man in a top hat was projected. The picture was magnified about 60 times.

Mr. Edison expects shortly to be able to project the photograph that he has just taken. He will be able to take records much longer than now, and the Vitascope and photograph will then be so combined that it will be possible for an audience to watch a photographic reproduction of an opera and hear the music at the same time.
