Trade Union's Customs Committee Met and Held for a Week, Then Adjourned for the Day.

New York, Dec. 1.—The special Treasury Committee, consisting of J. M. Conover, Chief Special Agent of the Treasury Department; W. B. Howland, representing the office of the Secretary of the Treasury; and a number of deputy customs collectors from frontier posts, among whom were General Greenleaf from Burlington, Vt., held a meeting this morning. The object of the committee was to discuss matters connected with frontier customs generally, and devise means for facilitating the business and accumulation of statistics regarding the movement of freight through Canada. No action was taken, and the committee adjourned until to-morrow.

London, Dec. 1.—The condition of Mr. James P. Roosevelt, Secretary of the United States Embassy, who has been suffering for some time past from nervous prostration, is improving, and it is probable that Mr. Roosevelt will start for Egypt within a week or ten days for the purpose of recuperating his health.

Medals for Scientists.

London, Dec. 1.—At a meeting of the Royal Society yesterday Sir John Lubbock, Foreign Secretary, presiding, medals were presented to Prof. Roentgen for his ray discoveries, and to the French professor, Moissan, for his discovery of the isolation of the element fluorine.

Money for the Strikers.

Hamburg, Dec. 1.—The distribution of the strike funds was delivered by about 14,000 dockers and others engaged on strike. The workmen of the Upper Elbe have decided not to strike.

Strikers Backed Up.

Berlin, Dec. 1.—At a meeting of the United Trades Representatives here yesterday evening Henry Mecklenburger, a member of the Reichstag, presiding, a resolution was passed, assuring the Hamburg strikers of the solid support of the workmen of Berlin and promising them financial aid, while agreeing to prevent the departure of men from the city to take the places of the strikers.

Murderers Got 15 Years.

Berlin, Dec. 1.—Grosse and Werner, the two men last October murdered Kaiser Major Levy, President of the Berlin bar, by stabbing him to death in his bedroom, were sentenced today to 15 years imprisonment.

Chauffeur Set at Liberty.

Paris, Dec. 1.—M. Chauvry, the Socialist deputy, who was arrested on Sunday during the demonstration against the visiting Socialists, was set at liberty today in pursuance of the vote taken in the Chamber of Deputies yesterday, ordering his immediate release.

Belgian Official Resigns.

Brussels, Dec. 1.—The Burgomasters and Sheriffs have resigned, owing to the adoption of the Communal Council of a Catholic proposal, fixing the minimum wage of communal employes at three francs per day.

Trade with Canada.

Old Country Merchants Say Orders are Light This Year—Prices of Apples.

London, Dec. 1.—(Telegram Cable.)—Manufacturers and exporters here say their trade with the Canadian provinces is not nearly so good as that of former years. The principal reason for this is the fact that Canadian dealers are placing very small orders for goods.

Admiral von Hellmann Tells of the Cost of Replacing the Fleet.

Berlin, Dec. 1.—The debate on the estimates was resumed today in the Reichstag. Admiral von Hellmann, Secretary of the Navy, declared that in order to replace the German fleet, which is due to be replaced in 1900, it would be necessary to spend 200,000,000 marks (about \$78,000,000) by new vessels, the sum of 32,000,000 marks (about \$12,500,000) for the fleet, and 168,000,000 marks (about \$65,500,000) for the fleet.

Changes in the Directorate.

London, Dec. 1.—The Marquis of Tweeddale and Sir Albert Cappel have retired from the Board of Directors of the Anglo-American Telegraph Co., and have been replaced by the election of Sir Gerald Fitzgerald and Mr. R. H. Benson. Mr. T. A. Sevan was elected chairman of the Board at a meeting held today.

Extreme Cold in England.

London, Dec. 1.—A cold wave of extreme severity is prevailing throughout England, and several deaths have occurred from exposure to the weather are reported. Many of the streams, lakes, ponds, etc., are frozen over with ice of sufficient thickness to permit skating, which is being generally indulged in.
