





Many of us say and a few of us thick that the question may be solved, economically and permanently, by entering into trade reciprocity with our great neigh bor. but, tho this may be feasible now, when the United States have everything to gain, we should find an impossible barrier reserved so soon as our commercial rivalry should become sufficiently embar-rassing, unless, indeed, we submit to the condition of absorption into the Republic, a condition that is, as you, sir, have so ably pointed out, impossible and unthink-able. We must seek, then, markets abroad and principally in Great Britain. But this
