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SYNOPSIS.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

The Annual General Meeting of the Board of Trustees of Queen's College, was held in the College, on Wednesday, the 7th June, 1854, pursuant to adjournment, when it was resolved to adjourn to 3 o'clock, P. M., in consequence of the non-arrival of Members.

The Board having met at 3 o'clock, P. M., the Chairman reported the re-election, by the Lay Trustees, of the Hon. Mr. Justice McLean, the Hon. Thomas McKay, and

the Hon. Peter McGill.

It was resolved that a copy of the Synopsis of the proceedings for 1853-4, be sent to each of the Ministers of the Church.

For the same reason as before, the Board adjourned to Thursday, the 8th then instant, at 10 o'clock, A. M.

The Board being met on Thursday, the 8th June, it was resolved, that the proceedings of the Executive Committee for the past year be sustained and approved.

The Hon. John Hamilton was appointed Chairman for

the present year.

The Committee appointed to seek out a Principal, stated that they had nothing specific to report, and were discharged.

An extract was read from the Minutes of Synod, recommending to all the congregations within their bounds, to exercise their largest liberality in behalf of the College; and recommending to Presbyteries to appoint two Clergymen and two Laymen to assist the Professors, as soon as they came within their respective bounds, in collecting old subscriptions, and obtaining new; also, recommending to the Trustees the publication of a full expose of the funds, plans and prospects of the University, and authorizing the Moderator to publish a Pastoral Letter, enforcing on the

people the duty of sustaining and extending the same; and farther, authorizing the Moderator to write a fraternal letter to the Ministers and Congregations of the Lower Provinces, requesting their co-operation and aid; and finally, recommending those who should be engaged in this work to exert themselves to stir up parents to confer upon their sons a higher education, and to consecrate such of them as afforded favorable indications of piety and talents to the work of the Ministry. In reference to which extract, it was resolved that this matter be left to the Executive Committee to act upon in their discretion.

The Committee appointed to wait upon the Government, reported that the Government were not prepared to state their views in the matter, whereupon the Committee were

discharged.

Professor Weir's appointment was approved of and con-

firmed-Dr. McGill dissenting.

Extract from Records of Synod read, intimating the reelection of Professor Williamson and Dr. Machar, as Clerical Trustees.

Letter read from Andrew Drummond, Esq., resigning his office of Treasurer; also letter from Mr. McIver, resign-

ing his office of Secretary.

Dr. Machar and Professors George and Williamson were appointed a Committee to draft Resolutions regarding the Preparatory School, the Medical Faculty, and other matters to be brought before the Board at its next meeting.

At a meeting held on the 2nd August, the Committee

appointed at last meeting, recommended

First—That the arrangements made by the Executive Committee with respect to the College School should be confirmed.

Second—That the Board should give power to the Executive Committee to appoint Lecturers in Medicine, on whose report the Senatus Academicus might confer Degrees, and whose emoluments should be derived from the fees of the Students, and any funds which might hereafter be obtained for the special endowment of a School of Medicine.

Third—That the Board should authorize the Executive Committee to procure rooms for the Medical School,—to make the necessary disbursements therefor, together with

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£50 for Apparatus; the whole outlay in all not to exceed

Lastly—That the Board should recommend that arrangements be entered into by the Executive Committee for building Houses for the Professors.

In reference to the foregoing recommendations of the Committee, it was resolved, that the first three thereof should be followed,-Mr. Malloch dissenting from the third.

It was resolved that the Rev. George McDonell, of Nelson, be authorised to collect subscriptions for the College in the Lower Provinces.

The Board adjourned to meet in the College on the first Wednesday after the Meeting of Synod in 1855.

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

At a meeting of the Executive Committee, held on the 12th May, 1854, an offer for the purchase of Lot No. 9, in the 13th Concession of Portland, at 15s. per acre, was accepted, on the conditions of £25 being paid down, and the balance in five annual instalments, with interest; and unless the first instalment was paid within one month, the Trustees should be at liberty to sell to any other purchaser.

The following Resolutions were passed:-

First—"That application be made to the Synod of Canada, in connection with the Church of Scotland, to meet in the City of Toronto, in the end of this month, for aid in paying off said debt." (Referring to the debt incurred in

the purchase of the "Summerhill Property.")

Second—"That the following, viz.:—the Rev. Professor George, Andrew Drummond, Esq., and the Chairman, be a deputation to lay the pecuniary wants of the College before the Synod, and to urge on the Synod the necessity for a general and liberal contribution being made throughout the whole Church, in order that funds may be raised to relieve the Trustees from the debt which has thus been incurred, for the great advantage of the College, and, as it is believed, for the good of the whole Church."

Third—"That the Synod be respectfully requested to appoint along with the Professors, a deputation to visit all the principal congregations immediately after the Synod breaks up, with a view of awakening an interest in the people in the above matter, as well as in bringing before them

the claims of the College in general."

The Treasurer reported having effected an Insurance on the new College Buildings with the "Beacon Insurance Comp was a some

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Company," instead of the "Equitable Assurance;" and he was authorized to effect Insurance for £1,000 additional in some other office.

The Treasurer was authorized to pay the Salary of the Assistant Teacher in the School for the half-year ending

The retiring Trustees, viz.:—The Hon. Mr. Justice McLean, the Hon. Thomas McKay, and the Hon. Peter McGill, were reported re-elected.

At a meeting, held on the 14th June, the Secretary was instructed to offer Major Sadlier £125 for the Lot upon

which the Preparatory School stands.

It was resolved, that in appointing a Master for the School, it should be distinctly stipulated that he should either by himself, or his assistant, devote two hours a day for five days in the week, to the duties of a College Tutor.

Mr. Hugh J. Borthwick was appointed Head Master. It was resolved, that the College Boarding House be discontinued, and the furniture disposed of.

An account for Printing, amounting to £6, was ordered

to be paid.

At a meeting held on the 11th July, Major Sadlier's acceptance of the offer of the Trustees was read.

At a meeting on the 21st of August, the Committee to confer with the Medical men were reappointed, and Professor George was added to their number.

Mr. Mowat was requested to receive the names of fami-

lies willing to receive Students as Boarders.

At a meeting on the 3rd October, Committee reported the willingness of the Medical men to give lectures, provided they received the countenance of the Committee.

Letters were read from various members of the Board on the appointment of Professors instead of Lecturers in Medicine; and the Committee were requested to aid the

Medical men in procuring suitable rooms.

The Rev. Professor George, John Mowat, and Joseph Bruce, Esquires, were appointed a Committee to confer with the City Council respecting the opening out of Arch Street.

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rance on nsurance The balance of the Salary of the Assistant Teacher to

the 30th September, was authorized to be paid.

At a meeting held on the 7th November, the Secretary stated that a petition for an increase of the Legislative Grant had been forwarded to the proper quarter; and also that one for a grant of land had been forwarded to the Ordnance Department.

Letters acknowledging the receipt of these petitions were read; that from the Ordnance Department declining

to grant the prayer of the Committee.

The thanks of the Committee were ordered to be conveyed to the Rev. George McDonell, for his exertions in collecting £148 8s. 3d. for the College in the Lower Provinces.

A Report of his tour on behalf of the College was submitted by Professor Smith, and an account of his travel-

ling expenses by Professor Williamson.

Mr. McIver's resignation of the office of Secretaay was accepted, and Mr. James Maclennan appointed in his stead.

Mr. McIver's account for Salary, Postages and Station-

ery, was ordered to be paid.

It was agreed to make application to the Legislature for Grants to the College, the College School, the Medical

School, and the Building Fund.

At a meeting held on the 5th December, an omission in the minutes of the last meeting was ordered to be supplied, to the effect, that the Rev. Professor George was requested to address a Circular to the Ministers of the Church, respecting the collections made for the College; and also to draft an address to Mr. McIver, on his resigning his situation as Secretary.

Professor George submitted his report of the tour made by him during the summer, as also his account of expen-

diture.

The Treasurer was authorized to pay the following accounts for travelling expenses, viz.:—

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A complimentary address to Mr. McIver was adopted, and ordered to be engrossed in the minutes.

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Letter read from Rev. Mr. Burnet enclosing £100, and stating the subscription in Hamilton to have amounted to

Letter read from Mr. Fowler, enclosing £15 from Ladies' Association of Hamilton, for a Bursary, and stating their intention of making the same permanent.

Received letter and report of School from Mr. Borthwick. Treasurer authorized to pay Mr. Borthwick half-year's salary of Assistant in advance.

Professors Williamson and Smith requested to confer with Mr. Borthwick, and report at next meeting.

At a meeting held 2nd January, 1855, Secretary instructed to inform Mr. John Ferguson, that they could not sell Lot No. 40, in 3rd Concession Osgoode, for less than

Mr. Mowat and Mr. Drummond were authorized to offer the claim of the College upon Lot 16, 3rd Concession of Osgoode, to Mr. Forsyth, Solicitor to the estate of the late Mr. Burnet, for 10s. per acre.

Secretary instructed to request of Dr. Stewart an account of the expenditure of the money advanced by the College

Chairman of Medical Board to be requested to give the Treasurer a power of Attorney to draw the money granted to them by the Legislature.

At meeting of 6th February, the Chairman stated that an arrangement had been made with the Commercial Bank, by which no loss would be sustained by the College by leaving the matter of the shares which the College are entitled to receive at par, over for a month or two.

Intimated that powers of Attorney had been given to the Treasurer to draw the grants to the College and Medi-

Secretary instructed to transmit for publication in the Presbyterian, an account of all the money received by the Treasurer, on behalf of the Building Fund.

Secretary instructed to make enquiry respecting value of Lot 9, in 8th Concession of Fenelon.

Mr. Mowat submitted an account of over-payment made by him and Mr. Drummond, on land purchased by them from the College. The excess paid by Mr. Drummond being £30 19s. 10d., and by Mr. Mowat £14 8s. 6d., which

sums were authorized to be paid.

Dr. Stewart stated, that for want of leisure he had not been able to prepare a statement as requested by the Committee.*

Professor Williamson submitted his report of tour made by him during past summer, which was approved of.

Mr. Mowat and Mr. Drummond were requested to receive proposals from Mr. Morton for purchase of College Land.

Treasurer was authorized to pay the account for adver-

tising, amounting to £24 3s. 4d.

An account for expenses of removal, incurred by John Anderson, Janitor, amounting to £11 2s. 6d., was ordered to be paid.

The Secretary was directed to transmit the usual Circular to Ministers respecting the election of persons eligible

for Trustees.

At meeting held on the 6th March, the Secretary was directed to ascertain the amount of the taxes upon the wild lands of the College, and to transmit the Treasurer's cheques for the respective amounts.

Letter from Colonial Committee read, renewing grant for another year; Professors George and Williamson requested to prepare annual address to the Committee.

The sum of £2 10s., received by Professor Weir in Toronto, and omitted in his account of travelling expenses, was ordered to be credited to the Building Fund, as from the congregation of Toronto, and charged to the account of disbursements.

At meeting held 3rd April, the address to the Colonial

Committee was read and approved of.

Treasurer stated that he had sent an authority to Mr. Robert Wigmore, to protect the lands of the College in Belmont and Fenelon, from certain depredations which were being committed upon the same.

Secretary stated that petitions had been forwarded to

the Legislature as directed.

Letter read from Mr. Morton, proposing to rent College

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Land; former Committee desired to confer farther with

Application made by Professor Smith for £16 for Prizes to deserving Students, and £4 to remunerate Librarian; also, to be reimbursed in £2 15s., the cost of a model gown for Students, which sums were authorized to be paid.

Application also made by Professor Smith, for authority to act in Britain for the College, on behalf of the Library and Museum, which was granted; and it was farther resolved, that he should be furnished with the documents necessary to make application in the proper quarter for a grant of land from the Ordnance Department.

At a meeting on the 1st May, the privilege of building upon a portion of the College land was granted to the Med-
