The following cases recommended by the Districts and referred by the Conference were considered:

1. Thomas Athoe. Recommended that his superannuated relation be continued for one year.

2. David Hunt. Simcoe District.—1. The Trustees of parsonage at Rockford request permission to sell the lot on which the parsonage formerly stood, also the furniture saved from the fire, proceeds to be applied to reduction of debt on same. We recommend that such permission be granted.

2. The Trustees of the church and parsonage at Selkirk ask permission to sell the property in Selkirk, which consists of church and parsonage, proceeds of sale to be held in trust, by the trustees, for the Methodist Church. Your Committee recommend that this request be referred back to the trustees, asking them to so decide on the disposal of the funds as shall be in harmony with the provisions of Discipline, Section 16, pages 303 and 304.

Milton District.—1. Your Committee recommend that the Trustee Board of Parsonage Property at Waterdown be given permission to sell parsonage on Main Street and apply proceeds to the purchase of new parsonage on Dundas Street, Waterdown.

Welland District.—1. The Trustee Board of the Port Colborne Church obtained permission of this Conference some years ago to sell the Port Colborne Church and apply proceeds to erection of new church. They now ask permission to apply proceeds of said sale of church as follows:

(a) In purchase of a suitable site for church.

(b) Toward cost of removing Humberstone church to said site.

(c) Toward cost of enlargement and improvement of said church so as to accommodate the Port Colborne and Humberstone congregations now united.

We recommend the request be granted.

2. Whereas, the late Samuel Hill bequeathed the sum of \$2,000 with instructions to his executors to erect a church on a certain site on the Hurricane Road, said church to belong to the Methodist Church of Canada; and whereas, on account of the union the same has not been erected, neither has the money been paid into the hands of the proper officers of the Church; and whereas, the executors of said estate now allege that the estate is, for various reasons, seriously impaired, and the claim of our Church to said legacy rendered doubtful, the executors of said estate now seek relief and ask this Conference to execute a quit claim on said estate, offering therefor to pay the sum of one hundred dollars to the Trustees of Bethel Church situated near where aforesaid church was to have been erected, for its repair and improvement. The Trustees of Bethel Church also ask the Conference to sign and execute said quit claim, believing this to be the best settlement of the matter obtainable.

Resolved,—That your Committee being unable to obtain sufficient information on the subject, recommend that the matter be referred to the President of Conference and Chairman of Welland District, Mr. E. Sweet, for them to take such action as they may deem best to protect the interests of our Church.

Woodstock District.—Your Committee recommend that permission be given to the Trustees of the parsonage at Bright, to sell the parsonage and apply proceeds to purchase or erection of another parsonage.

The Trustees of the parsonage on the Eastwood Circuit request permission to sell present parsonage and apply proceeds in payment of debt and the erection of a more suitable building. Your Committee recom-

mend that, in view of the probability of a married minister being stationed there this year, no action be taken.

Your Committee recommend that the Trustees of Lyons Creek and Dell's Churches be given permission to take down said churches and rebuild on a more suitable site, so as to facilitate the union of the two congregations.

Two years ago the congregation promised to raise \$3,000. They have paid of that \$1,970, and there is a balance still, called good, of \$630, and an unpaid balance from Mr. Kerby's list of \$175, making a total of \$805.

The yearly obligations of the congregation are: Uncontrollable expenditure, \$1,130.58; running expenses, \$385.00—\$1,515.58, besides the pastor's salary and connexional funds.

It is proposed to raise \$1,536, outside of the Trustees, to meet pressing necessities now due, and to aid the Trustees in their present embarrassment.

To meet this, your Committee recommend,

That each pastor, with the co-operation of his people, be asked to raise within three months on his Circuit, for this purpose, an amount equal to two (2) per cent. on all salaries over \$700, and one and one-half (1½) per cent. on all salaries of \$700 or less. This will raise \$1,551. And your Committee further recommend that a young married minister be appointed to this Church, at a salary not to exceed \$600 per annum for the next three years; or the best available minister in the Conference at a salary not to exceed \$1,000 per annum for the same term.

By resolution of Conference the following was added to the report, viz.,

That your Committee further recommend that a weekly cash deposit be made in the bank to the credit of the Church, with the object of meeting interest on loan, and to create a sinking fund to reduce the principal.

CONSTITUTION OF THE SUSTENTATION FUND.

1. The object of this Fund shall be to secure salaries of not less than \$750 for ordained married ministers \$400 for ordained unmarried ministers, and \$350 for probationers; *provided, nevertheless*, that no appropriation from this Fund shall be made to married ministers who have received more than \$550 for salary, board and fuel; or to ordained single ministers who have received \$250 for salary, in addition to board; or to probationers who have received \$200, in addition to board, until these sums respectively have been provided in full.
2. The income of this Fund shall be derived from a collection taken up in all our congregations, in the month of March in each year.
3. The Committee for the distribution of this Fund shall consist of a minister and a layman from each District, and shall be appointed by the Conference.
4. There shall be a Conference Treasurer appointed on the nomination of the said Sustentation Fund Committee.
5. This Constitution shall be printed in the Minutes of the Conference from year to year.

The Treasurer's report was audited by Rev. R. J. Elliott and L. A. Cummer, Esq., and found correct.

We recommend the following :

1. That the collection for this Fund be taken up in the month of September.
2. That the object of the Fund be clearly stated before taking the collection, especially the following points : (a) That necessary Conference expenses and special claims of affliction alone can be considered legitimate ; (b) That the salary of a minister regulates his claim on this Fund, no minister having any claim whose salary amounts to \$800 or over, and others only in cases of very special affliction ; (c) That cases of ordinary expenses for physician's bills cannot be entertained ; (d) That when a Circuit requiring ministerial supply during the year is considered by the Committee abundantly able to pay for the same, the Committee may reduce the claim or rule it out altogether ; (e) That the maximum amount allowed for funeral expenses shall be, for the minister or his wife, \$40 ; for children from twelve to eighteen years of age, \$30 ; and for children under twelve years of age, \$20.
3. That the Secretary of the Conference for the current year order the necessary supplies for his successor in office.
4. That Rev. J. H. Collins be re-elected Treasurer.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON SUPERANNUATION FUND MEMORIALS TO THE GENERAL CONFERENCE.

Your Committee organized by electing Rev. J. Philp, D.D., Chairman, and Rev. T. Albert Moore, Secretary.

Having considered the various memorials sent to your Committee, it was decided to forward them to the General Conference with the following recommendations :

1. In regard to the memorial from Brantford District, requesting the General Conference to clearly define the present status of the claims of widows whose husbands were permanent claimants on the Fund at the time of and prior to the last union, but whose claims have been disallowed by the present treasurer, though allowed by his predecessor, it was recommended that a copy of this memorial be forwarded to the Superannuation Fund Board as well as to the General Conference.

2. In regard to memorials from the following circuits and district meeting, Ker, Kelvin, Bartonville, Millgrove, Hagersville, Waterdown and Wesley Church, Hamilton, and the Welland District Meeting we recommend that sections 397 and 398 of the Draft of the Constitution of the Superannuation Fund, prepared by the Superannuation Fund Commission, be amended to read as follows :

"397. The annual subscription of each minister and probationer in the active service of the Church shall be a sum equal to two and a half per cent. of his salary, as reported in the Minutes of the previous year for salary, board and fuel ;' but in no case shall any minister or probationer, pay less than \$12. The subscriptions shall be paid to the Financial

Secretary, one-half at the Financial District Meeting, and the other half at the Annual District Meeting. During probation the subscriptions shall be paid from year to year, in accordance with the credit of years travelled.

"398. Each circuit and domestic mission shall be required to contribute a sum equal to six per cent. of the amount raised and reported to the Conference the previous year for ministerial support, and three per cent. of the amount raised for the following connexional funds, viz., The Missionary (general), Superannuation, Educational, General Conference, Contingent, Union Church Relief and Sunday School Aid Funds. The said contribution shall be included in the appropriation of the Quarterly Official Board, and may be raised by special subscription or otherwise, as the Board may determine. The General Treasurers shall notify the chairman of each district of the amount required from each circuit and domestic mission in his district."

3. In regard to the suggested plan for the Superannuation Fund presented by Rev. J. Kay, and also that presented by Rev. R. W. Woodsworth, it was decided to recommend that they be passed on to the Superannuation Fund Commission and to the General Conference.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

Report of the Board of the Superannuation Fund for the Year ending July 31st, 1893.

The Board is gratified in being able to report that all claims have been paid in full, leaving a balance in the hands of the Treasurer of \$1,719.47.

The balance due Permanent Fund, as per last Annual Statement (principal and interest), amounting to \$1,851.27 and \$500 on commutation, has also been paid.

The receipts are in excess of the previous year: From Circuits, \$2,092.56; from Ministerial Subscriptions, \$480; from Interest on Investments, \$617.51, and from Book Room, \$500, making a total increase for the year of \$3,689.27.

The capital account has been increased by \$2,373 from Ministerial subscriptions, and \$340 from legacies.

On account of the exceptionally large number of ministers who have been superannuated this year, the claims on the Fund for the next year will be increased by about \$3,000.

REPORT OF THE REV. DR. POTTS, GENERAL SECRETARY OF EDUCATION.

will be perennial in the history of the institution. By the unanimous action of the Board of Governors, the Rev. Prof. Shaw, D.D., LL.D., has been called to the vacancy so created, and Rev. J. Cooper Antliff, M.A., (Edin.) D.D., has been added to the staff. The Rev. Prof. Patton, B.D., has been granted leave of absence to pursue in Germany a Post-graduate Course in Semitic Literature, and his place has been filled by the Rev. Prof. Richardson, B.A., B.D., Acting Registrar.

The institution enters upon its new phase of history with the firm determination of its authorities not only to maintain its efficiency, but also to enlarge its work for the Church, and to increase its financial strength.

The number of students registered the past year was seventy-two, including seventeen non-resident. All students in residence attend the McGill University either as undergraduates or partial students. Men whose age and circumstances prove the wisdom of such a course are induced to take the full Arts Curriculum, which requires a residence of four years. At the same time at least equal practical benefit is obtained from the Licentiates' Course, which requires three years of attendance at lectures, and which includes the most valuable part of the University Curriculum, besides a heavy course in Divinity. It has been generally recognized that the College, in carrying so large a number of men beyond the necessarily limited, if not meagre, "Course of study for Probationers," is doing a most valuable educational service for the Ministry of the Methodist Church. After the system of Yale and Drew, and several other leading colleges in America, licentiates completing their course are admitted to the further and higher three years' course for the Degree of B.D.

Financially the condition of the institution is steadily improving. Although a small draft of \$1,600 has been made on the capital, which is sure to be soon replaced, the College may be said to be really out of debt. The Endowment Fund, largely through the successful efforts of the Rev. W. Harris, has been raised to over \$70,000. The income on current accounts the past year was \$6,448.58, and expenditure \$6,487.33. The income and outlay of the Boarding Department are about \$4,000.

There is great need of increased accommodation in both class-rooms, dormitories and Convocation Hall, and the hope is entertained that this want may be supplied without such a delay as may permanently weaken the institution, and that the valuable land held vacant may soon thus be occupied. The real estate of the College is valued at \$70,000, and is out of debt.

SYSTEMATIC BENEFICENCE.

Your Committee desire to call attention to the following :

1. We fear that many do not sufficiently realize the full scope of this question of proportionate giving as affecting our Church finances. It is not merely an assault upon dangerous methods in money-making and money-getting for our Church treasuries, nor is it only intended through this Committee to call attention to the idea of "tithing," as set forth in the old dispensation, and which, it is thought, in the light of Paul's recommendation to the Church at Corinth (1 Cor. 16 : 2), is reaffirmed as the wisest and best for the present dispensation.

We beg to express our belief that it is the duty of this Committee to impress upon the Stewards of our Church that the earnest study of system, of *business* system, in the whole matter of the Circuit's financial management would be in the best interests of the people and an encouragement to regular and definitely applied contributions.

We feel that the time has come that the same provision with equally sacred care, should be made for the Connexional funds and for current expenditure as for ministerial support.

2. The Committee would gratefully recognize the work of the Woman's Missionary, the Epworth League, and Christian Endeavor Societies in the matter of systematic beneficence. We learn, with pleasure, that these societies have reprobated the idea of raising moneys for the cause of God by the grosser and more worldly forms of entertainment.

We ask that both preachers and stewards shall stand steadfastly by the Apostolic principle in Church benevolence, viz., "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him," and emphasizing the fact that God's claim is upon all for a "willing mind" (1 Cor. 8 : 12), and that His approval of the "much" or "little" is accorded to "cheerfulness" (2 Cor. 9 : 7).

We beg to ask that this Conference memorialize the General Conference for a careful consideration of this question and a deliverance thereon.

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

Your Committee beg to report as follows :

At a meeting for organization Rev. A. L. Gee was appointed chairman, and Rev. R. W. Wright, Secretary.

The statistics for the year afford marked evidence of prosperity and reveal the deep and abiding interest of our people in this department of church activity. Every preaching appointment in our Conference, with the exception of thirteen, is represented by a Sabbath School. We are glad to note a large increase in the number of teachers and officers, who are members of the Methodist Church, as showing a laudable anxiety on the part of our people that the instructors of the children shall be godly men and women.

As the great object of the Sabbath School is the salvation of the young, our hearts greatly rejoice in being able to report the large number of 1,564 conversions, an increase of 330, and also that there is a correspondingly large addition to the number of scholars who are members of the Church. As we believe that the triumphant conquest of the Gospel is dependent upon the enlistment of the children and young people, we find in these figures matter for great thankfulness and strong encouragement.

We are gratified to see an increase of over 800 in the number who have taken the Total Abstinence Pledge ; yet, as less than one-third of the entire number of our scholars have taken this step, we would urge upon our ministers and Sabbath School workers the necessity of bringing the great question of Temperance before them in this personal and definite form.

We regret that there is a falling off in the number of our periodicals taken, and would recommend careful consideration of this fact. Our children are surely worthy of the best literature we can obtain, and this we believe on the whole to be supplied by our own publications, while in the cheap imported and interdenominational papers and helps, we have no guarantee of spiritual tone or of doctrinal soundness. We recommend that steps be taken by our Publishing House to provide helps for scholars, intermediate in price and size between the *Banner* and the *Berean Leaves* or *Quarterly*, thereby meeting a want which is being largely filled by American Houses.

This year we have entered for the fourth time upon the study of the whole Bible in connection with the International Lesson Scheme, a scheme which was never more widely appreciated than at the present, and which God has greatly blessed in promoting the study of the Word ; and we desire especially to commend to the earnest attention of our people, old and young, the unique study of the Life of Christ as furnished in the four Gospels, which we commence in July. We are glad to note that our scholarly and devoted Sunday School Editor has just published a valuable help for this study, in his "Harmony of the Gospels," which we hope to see widely circulated among our people.

We recommend that a Home Class Department, as far as possible, be organized in connection with each of our Sabbath Schools, under the direction of a Superintendent, who shall be an Assistant Superintendent of the Sabbath School and a member of the Quarterly Official Board, and that

TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

Your Committee met at the call of the convener and appointed Rev. D. L. Brethour, Ph.D., as Chairman, and T. L. Wilkinson as Secretary. We beg leave to submit the following report:

It is a source of profound gratitude to Almighty God that our principles have taken such deep root in, and obtained such widespread control over, the public conscience of this country, as is evidenced by the result of the several provincial plebiscites recently taken, aggregating in the four provinces that have voted, a majority of 132,000, and in our own Province alone of about 82,000. This magnificent result has been reached not without much toil, suffering, sacrifice and prayer on the part of those who have espoused our principles, and further progress can only be looked for by patient continuance in well-doing.

We would also record our gratitude to God that our principles have exerted such a leavening influence upon the political elements of the land. Progress in this direction has been secured by slow and almost imperceptible degrees, but to-day politicians and parties of almost all political shades and affiliations are ready to patronize and approbate, if not to espouse, our cause, and we are persuaded that in proportion as the number of those who esteem prohibition above all mere secular or partizan issues increases, and in proportion as they wisely consolidate their influence at the polls, will the patronage and support of those who govern us and shape our laws be secured.

But we are not blind to the alarming fact that the traffic we oppose is still a mighty factor in our national politics, as well as in the corruption of public morals and the deterioration of our national strength. It is essentially selfish, greedy and unprincipled, influenced by no considerations of human pity, sympathy or righteousness. It neither fears God nor regards man. Its slimy trail is seen in every walk of life. The bones of its victims are thickly scattered over the face of the ground, and with imperial authority it sits upon its throne of human skeletons, swaying its sceptre of cruel and deadly power, while tens of thousands, both of its guilty and innocent victims, are chained to its bloody chariot wheels and annually dragged to poverty, dishonor and shame. This, too, in face

of the appalling fact that it exists and does its damning deeds by the virtual, if not actual, open and active consent of tens of thousands of the nominally Christian electors of this land. It has struck its roots deeply into the fiscal, social and commercial soil of the nation, and obtained a mighty and widespread control of the habits and tastes of our people, even the Church of God itself being not altogether beyond its malignant and bewitching control. This being so, our work is not yet done. On the contrary, the tree of death still flourishes in our midst. Its friends combine in its defence, and with prodigal liberality devote their ill-gotten gains to this end. They subordinate all political convictions to consideration of self-interest, and, as a rule, support only such governments and political aspirants as favor, either secretly or openly, their unrighteous claims. Under these circumstances a solemn and weighty responsibility rests upon all who would claim the distinguished title of either patriot, philanthropist or Christian. It behoves all such to ask themselves the question, as in the light of eternity, whether this deadly system shall continue to exist by their suffrages and with their consent. Judging from the overwhelming public sentiment recorded against the traffic, as expressed in the plebiscite already referred to; also by the large and enthusiastic conventions recently held, and in various other ways, we are convinced that this evil only exists under the sanction of our laws because we have hitherto been unable to concentrate our strength on legislative lines. Could prohibitionists be induced to combine for the promotion of their principles in this respect, as their opponents do, we could easily dictate terms to all governments and politicians, who would then be only too ready to consult our wishes and crystallize our sentiments in law. But so long as we cannot rise above the interests of faction or party and support the men and ministries willing to befriend us, your Committee cannot consistently heap censure upon our law-makers, who know that their political existence depends upon their success in securing the support of a majority of the electors. In view of these considerations, we would strongly urge upon Methodist electors everywhere to rise above all factional interests, influences and relationships, and without prejudice or partizanship support only such candidates and governments as will adopt our principles and act in our interests.

We have reason to fear that too many aspirants to political honors are ready to make ante-election promises and exhibit an apparent friendship for our cause, but when elected generally succeed in finding some pretext for opposing prohibition in Parliament. We need to keep a watchful eye upon such persons, and try to choose wisely in selecting men to make our laws.

Your Committee would also earnestly entreat our people not to neglect the use of all moral measures for improving public sentiment, and inspiring temperance zeal. We have a wide field to cultivate, and an extensive work to do in rescuing the perishing, caring for the dying, strengthening the weak, lifting up the fallen, and educating the youth. Let us not be remiss in the performance of this work.

Above all, let us put our trust in God, and constantly seek His guidance and help. Without this, our labor will be in vain, and our strength will be wasted. "Except the Lord build the house, they labor in vain

Rev. J. W. Cooley and Joseph Gibson, Esq., are recommended as such delegates, with the understanding that Bro. John Mann be appointed as an alternate.

We would further recommend that a collection be requested from each Sunday School throughout the Conference, to be taken on some Sabbath when a Temperance lesson is taught, in aid of the Temperance Fund.

And, finally, we recommend that a Standing Committee on Temperance, consisting of Revs. J. S. Ross, M.A., W. Kettlewell, Dr. Brethour, Dr. Lowrey, and D. M. Lee, be appointed with authority to act in behalf of our Church during the year, should there be a necessity for action.

STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee, in reporting on the state of the work, note with gratitude to Almighty God the gracious increase of 899 souls in the membership of our Church during the Conference year just closed.

The most gratifying feature in connection with this advance in numbers, is the fact that these results very largely represent, under the blessing of God, the labors of our own pastors and people rather than the work of special evangelists. We have good reason to look for greater permanence and more vigorous life among the souls thus won for Christ, as well as increased devotion and wiser efforts on the part of both ministers and laity in future.

In the name of Christ, we again urge both ministers and people to pray and work, and our ministers to preach for immediate results in connection

with our regular services, for in Apostolic days "the Lord added unto the Church daily such as were being saved."

It is with very deep regret we note the decrease of \$2,000 in contributions for missions. This, however, is amply accounted for by the financial stringency of the times.

The funds raised for the support of the Sunday Schools show a decided advance, and there has been a steady growth of numbers in our schools and young people's societies. We are pleased to note the increased number of Church members employed as teachers, and to this we largely attribute the goodly number of conversions in our schools during the year, aggregating over 1,500.

Our junior societies are right royally caring for these "lambs of the fold," and are introducing them to Christian work, and in due season they will graduate into the grand army of the Lord, trained soldiers strong in Christ, on whom the Church and the Captain of our salvation may depend for aggressive service.

Your Committee regret that so many of the names that have been enrolled upon our Church registers should have to be labelled "Lost in Transit." To remedy this, we would ask our members to be careful to get their certificates of membership before removing, and to place them in the hands of the minister in charge immediately on reaching their new homes. We think, also, that it would be well for ministers who give such certificates to carry out the instructions of our Discipline by sending a copy of such certificate to the minister on the new field, advising him of the removal, that he may look after and locate the incoming member.

That while we are able to rejoice in the fact that our beloved land stands foremost among the nations of the earth for loyalty to the laws touching the Divine institution of the Sabbath, we nevertheless notice with deep regret and alarm that there are certain customs being established, and tendencies creeping in, which tend to destroy its sanctity and rest.

We enter our solemn protest as a Church against all unnecessary traffic and excursions of any kind on the Sabbath, whether by railway, street car, boat, or by private enterprise, such as hiring livery rigs, and driving about for pleasure on the Lord's Day.

We also earnestly desire that our people will by precept and example protest against whatever tends to Sabbath desecration, such as (1) holding of funerals on the Sabbath, except when unavoidable. We desire to put ourselves on record as opposed to the practice in common, especially in

(2) Social visiting on Sabbath, which is also to be deprecated inasmuch as it does not tend to growth in grace nor widen the field of usefulness. (3) The keeping open of retail places of business to so late an hour on Saturday evening as to encroach upon the rest of the Sabbath, and thus, in many cases, seriously interfering with our morning services.

And lastly, your Committee believing that the proper observance of the Sabbath is the great corner-stone of our Christian civilization, and peace and prosperity as a nation, and that it is not so much new and more stringent legislation we require, but by educating through the press and the pulpit the mind and heart of the nation; we, therefore, urge upon all our ministers to frequently refer to this subject, and preach at least one sermon during the year specially upon Sabbath observance.

REPORT OF THE EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee on the Epworth League work organized with Rev. Geo. Clark, Ph.D., Chairman, and G. A. Mitchell, B.A., Secretary.

The annual review of the work done by our Epworth League societies shows a gratifying increase of interest in this important branch of our Church work.

We see exemplified in these departments the very genius of Methodism shown in the organization of the "Holy Club" in the year 1729, with its four aims and objects, viz., more Bible knowledge, more literary culture, more personal piety and more practical service.

The Epworth League of the nineteenth century has for its motto, "Look up! Lift up!" and embodies the same grand principles of personal piety, personal culture and personal service.

Our Constitution is now complete for the most thorough and successful work among our young people and children, and the results reported plainly show that great success has attended the work of the year.

Various memorials and propositions before the Committee prompt us to recommend the following:

1. That each minister be urged to organize, without delay, a senior and also a junior League at each appointment.
2. That a highly spiritual tone be cultivated in all meetings of the Society.
3. That the name and working of all societies conform, as far as possible, to the recommendations in the Constitution, and that every effort be made to harmonize all young people's societies in this Conference into hearty co-operation.
4. That we urge all societies to forward items of interest to the young people for insertion in *Onward* and in the columns of the *Christian Guardian* set apart for that purpose, because we fully believe that most excellent results will follow through the large circulation of these excellent papers each week in our homes.

5. That, as we fail to secure full yearly reports of our Leagues, we recommend that additional columns in the Conference schedule be added to report Epworth League Societies.

6. That in compliance with the memorial from the Convention of the Young People recently held in London, we appoint two delegates to meet in Ottawa next March with the other delegates appointed, to consider the advisability of arranging for a Dominion Convention of Young People's Societies, and we recommend that Rev. R. J. Elliott and J. S. Deacon be appointed.

THE ANNUAL PASTORAL ADDRESS
OF THE NIAGARA CONFERENCE TO THE CHURCHES UNDER
ITS CARE.

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN,—We greet you in the name of our common Saviour and Lord, and say with St. Paul in his greetings to the Thessalonians: "Grace be unto you, and peace from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ. We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers; Remembering without ceasing your work of faith and labor of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of our God and our Father." Feeling as we have ever done, a strong affection for you all, we most sincerely entreat the blessed Spirit to abide with you as your sanctifier and comforter; for to you, as "the flock of Christ over which the Holy Ghost hath made us overseers," our thoughts instinctively turn, and around you gather all the feelings of our ministerial solicitude and regard. We rejoice exceedingly, and give thanks to Almighty God, because of the peace and harmony and good-will that so widely prevails amongst us, while language fails to express our gratitude for all the tokens of God's favor vouchsafed during the year, as manifest in the conversion of so many souls, the spiritual upbuilding of believers, and the measure of general prosperity throughout the Church. Within the bounds of our Conference many fields of labor have been blessed with gracious revivals, and hundreds have been turned from sin to holiness, and from the power of Satan unto God, while a deeper interest in things spiritual has been aroused among our people. Our General Superintendent, Dr. Carman, in his address to the Conference, assured us that in all the Conferences throughout the Connexion the spirit of revival was widespread, and that the feeling of brotherly love was never more prevalent nor so strong as it is to-day. For this we greatly rejoice, and we feel confident that you will share in our joy, and join with us in giving thanks unto God.

You will be glad to learn, that as a result of a faithful presentation of the truth, under the blessing of God, the increase of our membership for the year, after filling up the places of the dead and those removed by letter and otherwise, is nearly nine hundred. But while this increase is cause for thankfulness, may we not hope for still greater success in the future? If we all, with much prayer and faith, after full consecration to God, set ourselves earnestly to work for the salvation of our fellows that know not Christ, the increase would be manifold greater the incoming year than that which we now report.

The movement among our young people, so wonderful and withal so promising, is worthy of more than a passing notice. Societies of Epworth League have been organized in nearly all of our Churches, and if judiciously managed, will prove a power for good in the Church of Christ such as we have never known before.

young life in our Church, and forcing it to the front to do service for Him. We strongly commend our young people's societies to the confidence and fostering care of our Church, and feel assured that you will join us in the heartfelt prayer, "God bless our young people."

Our Sabbath Schools, too, were never more effective than now, nor the attendance so good. There is a gratifying advance in every department of our Sabbath School work, and the outlook for the future is most encouraging. We earnestly commend to your prayerful solicitude and sympathy the work being done by Sabbath School workers for the children of your homes—the children of your love and care—the lambs of Christ's fold. Encourage them in their gratuitous labor by kindly words of sympathy and cheer and by your earnest prayers.

And in this connection we would call your attention to the superior excellence of our Sabbath School publications, so wisely arranged for and so well adapted to the different departments of Sabbath School work. We would also recommend to your patronage our own Publishing House in Toronto as the best place to procure the most suitable books for our Sabbath School libraries. The *Christian Guardian* and the *Methodist Magazine*, we are pleased to inform you, have an increased circulation and are growing in favor with our people. We would strongly commend them to you and trust they may find a place in your homes.

Notwithstanding the stringency of the times and the depression in trade and commerce, our people have not forgotten the claims of God's cause upon them; for wherever else there may have been forced retrenchment, as a rule they have not allowed it to begin at the "House of the Lord," so that our connexional interests have been well sustained, beyond even what we might have expected. For this we thank God and take courage.

The all-important subject of the temperance cause has been brought to the front more prominently than ever before during the past year, and has occupied the undivided attention of our people in every part of the Province; and while we are thankful for the progress made towards the total prohibition of the liquor traffic—in the splendid majority of 82,000 in the Plebiscite vote, and the pledge given by the Premier of the Province that he would introduce a bill to prohibit the sale and manufacture and importation of liquor at the next session of the Provincial Parliament, if the Privy Council should decide it was within the power of the Local Legislature to do so—nevertheless, the goal not being yet reached, we would urge upon you the necessity of keeping the matter before the people still, until victory turns on the side of temperance. To this end we direct attention to the report of the Temperance Committee as published in the Minutes of Conference.

We cannot close this short review of the year's work without recording our profound thankfulness to the great Head of the Church for His sparing mercy to us His unworthy servants. During the year death has not entered our ranks—not one has fallen, and for the first time in our history as a Conference we are called upon to record the fact that "none have died."

And now, brethren permit us to admonish you to be true to God, and to "stand fast in the faith." The times in which we live are perilous in the highest degree to vital godliness and the interests of the soul. The insidious encroachments of worldliness, as evidenced by the eagerness

with which so many make haste to be rich, and their ever restless hopes and efforts to reach worldly positions and to obtain worldly honors, together with the seductive influence of worldly pleasure and worldly amusements, call for constant watchfulness, as well as to speak loudly to us of the dangers that attend the steps of everyone trying to live the life of a Christian.

As watchmen upon the walls of our beloved Zion, we love you too well to slumber or yet to be silent when we see the danger. We lift up our voice in loving and earnest warning. We charge you to be vigilant. Be ever on the alert. "Quit you like men, be strong." "This is the victory that overcometh the world, even your faith." That this world-conquering faith may be yours, binding you to truth and purity, and strengthening you for life's duties and calling, give strict attention to private devotions and the reading of God's Holy Word. Live near to God; walk under the shadow of the cross; hold constant and close communion with the Master. It is thus that men have faith and strength to rise above the vanities of life, and "to keep themselves unspotted from the world," and to live as the children of the Most High. Ever remember that our venerable founder, Wesley, declared that the purpose for which God had raised us up as a Church was "to spread Scriptural holiness through the land." If this be our mission, how can we fulfil it, unless we be distinguished for our piety? "As he that hath called you is holy, so be ye holy in all manner of conversation." To this end we pray you then to live and walk in the faith of Christ and the love of God. Continue to evidence your sincerity in the service of the Master, and your attachment to our beloved Methodism, by regular attendance upon the social means of grace, as well as the Sabbath services of the sanctuary. Do not think it an evidence of advanced enlightenment to be able to live without the aid of the class-meeting and the prayer-meeting. These time-honored means of grace, so greatly owned and blessed of God, have ever been cherished by the most holy and devoted men in our Church, and are not to be disparaged or neglected, nor yet regarded as obsolete.

We cannot but regard the attendance upon the social means of grace as an index to the spiritual life of the Church.

We would also enjoin upon you the importance of family religion. Neglect not to read the Scriptures and pray in your families. Regard as the most sacred thing on earth to you and yours, the altar of prayer in your homes, upon which is offered the morning and evening sacrifices of your devotions. And besides all this, "Let your light shine before men" in the world. "Walk as the children of the light." Be true to your covenant vows. Continue in "the old paths." May your hope of heaven never be dimmed. Live for the future, where, in the kingdom of Christ's glory, the saints shall live for evermore.

"The Lord make you to increase and abound in love one towards another and towards all men, even as we do towards you. To the end He may stablish your hearts unblamable in holiness before God, even our Father, at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ with all his saints." "And may the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost be with you all."

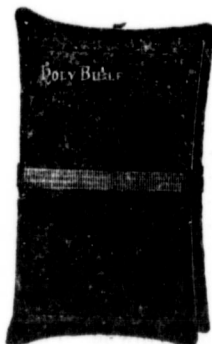
