ROBB'S DICIUM Ottawa, Ont., Oct. 3. — (Canadian Press.)—"We have no desire to de-stroy Canadian shipping, but this gov-ernment is not here to protect the Canadian shipping interests at the ex-pense of the shipper and the grain industry. If we find that you are using the coasting laws so as to force Cana-dian wheat into American channels, the government will have to consider amending these laws." This statement was made by Hon. J. A.
