BIRTHDAYS OF NOTABILITIES

This is the birthday of the Right Hon. Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, chief justice of the Supreme Court of Canada. He is today sixty years of age, having been born in Quebec in 1858. He practised law with distinction in Quebec for many years and was engaged in many noted cases. Entering parliament in 1896 he was successively solicitor-general and minister of justice, going to the Supreme Court in 1906.
