MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH
IN CANADA.

CONSTITUTION.

I. THAT in consequence of the withdrawal of the British Conference from connexion with the Canadian Conference, the Canada Conference Missionary Society has ceased to be Auxiliary to the Wesleyan Missionary Society in England; it is therefore expedient that the Conference of the Wesleyan-Methodist Church in Canada recognize and establish, as it existed previously to the year 1833, an independent Missionary Society, to be denominated THE MISSIONARY SOCIETY OF THE WESLEYAN-METHODIST CHURCH IN CANADA.

II. The object of this Society is to excite and combine the exertions of the Societies and Congregations of the Wesleyan-Methodists and others throughout the Province of Canada, in the support and enlargement of Missions among the Indians and destitute Settlers of this Province and elsewhere.

III. The payment of One Pound and upwards, annually, shall constitute a Member; and the payment of Ten Pounds, and upwards, at one time, shall constitute a Member for Life, and shall entitle each to a copy of the Annual Report.

IV. The Officers of this Society shall consist of a Treasurer, Recording and Corresponding Secretaries, who, together with Ten Managers, shall form a Board, by whom the business of the Society shall be transacted during the intervals of Conference. They shall be annually elected by the Society. At any meeting of the Board five shall form a quorum for the transaction of business.

V. The President and Secretary of the Conference shall be, *ex officio*, members of the Board of Managers.

VI. The Conference, at each of its Annual Meetings, shall appoint a Committee, consisting of the President and Secretary of the Conference, the Chairmen of Districts, and five others, whose duty it shall be to audit all the accounts of the Expenditures, &c., during the past year, and make, as far as may be necessary, the appropriations for the support of the Missions during the ensuing year.

VII. All the Methodist Missionary Societies which have been, or may be formed in the several Districts of the Province of Canada, shall be entitled "Auxiliaries;" and all Societies in the particular Circuit of any District shall be entitled "Branches."

VIII. All Benefactors of Ten Pounds, and upwards, and all Subscribers of One Pound, and upwards, annually, to any of the Auxiliary or Branch Societies, shall be deemed Members of the General Society.

IX. An Annual Public Meeting of the Members and Friends of the Society shall be held at the time and place of the Session of the Conference; at which Meeting the Officers and Managers of the Society shall be appointed, according to Article IV.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS.

1. The Missionary year hereafter shall invariably terminate on the 1st day of June in each year, at which time the accounts of the various Auxiliary and Branch Societies throughout the Province will be closed. Any subscriptions or collections received after that date must necessarily be omitted from the forthcoming Report, and will be carried to the account of the ensuing year.

2. All moneys, whether collected at the Anniversary Meetings, or subsequently obtained on subscriptions during the year, are to be paid, without reserve, into the hands of the *Local Treasurers*, who will lose no time in transmitting the same, through the Superintendent of the Circuit, to the General Treasurer at the Wesleyan Book Room, Toronto.

3. It is further earnestly recommended, in order to enable the Missionary Board in future to publish with facility and correctness the Annual Report of the Society, that the Superintendents of Circuits shall carefully prepare, from the returns of the local Secretaries, a *Circuit Account*, including the names of Subscribers, Collectors, and Branches, as well as the amount of all collections and subscriptions received during the year, preparatory to the District Meeting, at which a *District Report* shall be made out, written in a legible hand, and embracing all the Circuit returns in detail, which Report shall be brought to Conference by the Chairman of the District.

4. The General Treasurer will not be responsible for the receipt or payment of any moneys that have not regularly passed through his hands.

R E P O R T .

THE work of propagating the Gospel has been continued, with occasional interruption, from the era of its Divine Founder until these latter days. The two duties of *receiving* and *diffusing* the Gospel have never been totally forgotten. The duty of diffusing the Gospel has been long known and performed by the English nation. So early as the seventh and eighth centuries, missionaries from England, Scotland, and Ireland, were in Pagan lands, and successfully preaching the Gospel. But the zenith of the Papal power was not a time favourable for the spreading of real Christianity; and yet, in the darkest period of Popery, there were some who had the light of truth, and who permitted others to share the beams. After the Reformation, though more of vital religion obtained at home, it was not immediately diffused abroad. The flight of the Puritans from England, owing to persecutions at home, was a means of bringing many of the Pagans of this continent into contact with the Gospel. But the great impetus to the propagating of the Gospel, which impetus is still felt, was the extensive revival of religion under the Wesleys and Whitefield: that revival consisted in the new disposition arising, in thousands of minds, to perform both the duties which we have mentioned. Societies have been organized in England and America, with a view of effectually performing the second duty. Among the Missionary Societies, now in operation, is to be numbered the Society instituted by the Methodists of Upper Canada, about nineteen years ago. As a Society, we cannot mention those great deeds which other Societies, older and abler, have performed for the truth. Yet, when we consider the

state of the Indians of the forest, and the condition of the Canada settlements generally, compared to what was their situation twenty years ago, the Society may say their labour has not been altogether in vain. We do not claim the merit of all the moral and religious good effected in the Province. No: other Christians have performed their part of the noble work. Still, Methodism has led the way; and now the Society is far from being in the rear. But boasting is not becoming. What have we to boast of? That we have done so much? We have rather cause for humiliation that we have done so little. If Almighty God has honoured us in accomplishing any good, we must honour Him, and offer adoration and praise.

During the past year the Committee have met with nothing especially encouraging; nor have they seen any reason for a relaxation in their exertions. The real state of the Missions, however, will best be seen in the succeeding detailed accounts.

INDIAN MISSIONS.

The aborigines of the Province were the first objects of the missionary enterprise of the Society. Though many years have passed since the establishment of the first Missions among them, the Society has never ceased to care for them until the present hour. The state of the Indian Missions is still encouraging,—there being not only an advance of religious knowledge among the Indians, but a stronger disposition to cultivate the arts of civilization.

MUNCEY MISSION.

On this important Mission, where three tribes of Indians are collected, three Missionaries have been stationed during the past year. The state of the Mis-

sion is so well described in the following letter of the Rev. Peter Jones to the Secretary of the Missionary Society, that nothing need be said in addition to it:—

Muncey Mission, May 30th, 1844.

DEAR BROTHER,—As it is expected that an account of the state of each Mission be given to the friends and supporters of Indian Missions, it is with pleasure I again present to them a report from this department of their work.

Through the mercy and assistance of the Great Supreme Being, the Indian brethren have steadily held on their way to heaven, rejoicing in hope of the glory of God.

Our religious meetings have in general been well attended, spiritual and profitable; knowledge thereby has been greatly increased.

The most prevalent evil amongst this people is their constant practice of going on their hunting excursions, which necessarily exposes them to temptation, and brings them more or less in contact with evil and designing men. Being deprived of the ordinances of God's house, they become weak in faith, so that, when temptation presents itself, they are in too many instances led astray. In order to prevent and counteract this practice, we have, as much as possible, directed their attention to the cultivation of the earth; and I am happy to state, that, since the opening of this spring, most of our people have worked like good white farmers, and have sown and planted far more than they ever did before. Should Providence favour us with a prosperous season, they will raise sufficient for their own consumption during the next year, which will, I trust, in a great measure prevent the necessity of their scattering into different parts of the country for food.

The Muncey Mission embraces three bodies of Indians, and might very properly be called three missions in one. The first is amongst the Ojebways, settled at Colborne, on the Thames, where we have a convenient mission-house, and a large place of worship, originally intended for a school and council house, and built by Government out of the Indian annuities.

The second is at New Oneida; and I rejoice to say that our Oneida brethren are not only doing well in religion, but that, as farmers, they bid fair to become a prosperous and happy people.

The third and last body of Indians amongst whom we labour is the Muncey tribe, and a more quiet and well behaved people I have never seen.

Our number in Society is as follows:—Ojebways, 128; Munceys, 27; Oneidas, 62; Whites, 4; total, 221; showing a small decrease.

During the year there have been 20 removals, and 8 of our members have departed this life, in sure and certain hope of a glorious resurrection. We have two Mission Schools within the bounds of our work; one at Colborne, numbering 27 scholars, who attend regularly—and another at New Oneida, taught by Mr. A. Sickles.

So great is the desire of these people to have a School of Industry established amongst them, that the Ojebway Chiefs have offered to give 200 acres of excellent land for such a purpose, and would also grant something annually out of their land payments towards its support.

I would again ask, cannot something be done towards the establishing of such an institution at a suitable place? The sooner such a school is in operation, the sooner will the burden of supporting the Indian Missions by our white Christian friends be taken off, as the Indians themselves, when sufficiently raised and civilized, would gladly support their religious teachers.

Our people have done something in the way of subscribing towards the funds of the Society, and I am happy to report that the amount collected on this Mission is £55 6s. 3d. We have also done a little for the Bible Society.

The Lord has done much for these people; and, considering their former degradation, and deep-rooted prejudices in favour of their pagan notions, I think wonders have been accomplished;—and we have much cause for thankfulness to Almighty God for the signal success that has attended the labours of our Missionaries. I trust the friends of Missions will be encouraged to continue their exertions in the great and glorious work of christianizing and civilizing the human family, until the whole earth shall be full of the knowledge of God.

This is all I have to say.

GRAND RIVER MISSION.

The situation of the Missionary at the Grand River has been rather unpleasant during the year. Attempts at proselyting have been made by different parties, which are anything but honourable to them, and which have greatly increased the difficulties of the Missionary's work. The Rev. Hamilton Biggar gives the following report of the Mission:—

During the last year, the labours of the Missionary, like those of the preceding one, have been extended to the Whites and Indians.

Among the Whites, there has been considerable increase; deducting for removals, deaths, &c., amounting to 23 in all, the net increase is 45. There are eight classes of White members connected with the Mission; in all, 180 members. Most of the classes are in a healthy and prosperous state, and many members are deeply pious and devoted to the high and holy principles of the Religion of the Cross.

Among the Indians, we cannot report an increase of members; the total number is 112. There is a slight decrease of four for the year; nor is this wonderful, circumstances considered. The astonishing efforts made to proselyte these simple sheep of the forest, to me appear not only dishonourable, but subversive of the best interests of the

Indians. Perhaps my convictions on this subject had better remain where they are, than to have publicity.

The Indians, or the principal part of them, now reside on the south side of the river, and have consequently to cross when attending the service held in the chapel; and it is delightful to see, on Sunday mornings, the numbers crossing and repairing to the House of God. Notwithstanding this inconvenience, and the distance many have to come, our congregations are large—the white inhabitants of the neighbourhood greatly contributing to its increase.

Having no School-house on the south side of the river, and the one on the north side being very inconvenient, few Indian children have attended. The School, however, has been large, from the attendance of White children. This arrangement was made immediately after the last Conference, with Mr. Senior (our Schoolmaster), by the inhabitants and myself,—guaranteeing a proportion of his salary from the funds of the Mission, on condition of the School being open for as many of the Indian children as might attend.

This arrangement, on the whole, I thought the best; for, last year, when there was no school on the south side of the river, among the Indians, ours was removed over, and in a few weeks the Agent of the New England Society commenced one immediately in the rear of us. We had no desire to compete with one who had such ample resources at command; nor were we jealous by whom the children of the Indians should be instructed, so that the intellectual and moral condition were improved.

Although we have no increase of members, we trust we have of actual *religious* growth and Christian stability. Many are worthy of the Christian name.

The prospect of a speedy termination of conflicting efforts in Methodism, on the Grand River, affords no little encouragement that the work in this department will be greatly increased; and that the members will become steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord.

SNAKE ISLAND MISSION.

This Mission is an island in Lake Simcoe. It appears that nearly all the adult inhabitants are members of the Church. There are no White settlers on the island, save the Missionary's family. The Indians have this year built a Parsonage for the Missionary, and presented it to the Missionary Society. The Rev. Horace Dean has furnished the following interesting report of the Mission for the past year:—

Snake Island, 25th May, 1844.

DEAR BROTHER,—The approaching session of Conference reminds us of the duty of making our annual report. The report of an isolated

Mission like this, where nearly all the adults are members of the Church, must, in the very nature of things, be nearly the same from year to year. Our labours have been chiefly confined to the Island, in teaching the School and attending to the spiritual wants of the Mission, occasionally preaching in the adjoining neighbourhoods. There is a perceptible improvement in many respects on this Mission. The means of grace are well attended, and they have been generally seasons of refreshing. The School is unsteady. At the season of hunting, the village is wellnigh deserted; the School then has to close for several weeks. The attendance generally is irregular, being from 5 to 20 children; this arises partly from the habit the Indians have of visiting their friends at other Stations, as well as the fact that they have very often to visit the White Settlements that they may vend their wares for the purpose of getting provisions; and on all those occasions they take their entire family with them. When we had them all together, there were 8 boys in writing; one class in the Testament; one class reading in the Spelling Book, and so down to the A, B, C. The improvement of the Indians in cleanliness and domestic economy, is worthy of praise, and is adding much to their comfort. Their improvement in husbandry and the mechanical arts is more slow; still they are improving even in these. The Indians on this Station have done nobly this year in promoting the interest of the Mission and the comfort of your Missionary and family, by building a comfortable Mission House, twenty-eight by twenty-two, at the expense of about seventy-five pounds, the keys of which they have presented to the Missionary for the benefit of your Society. There are 65 Indians belonging to the Society on this Mission. Five persons have been converted; and there has been one marriage, with five births and two deaths, on the Mission this year. The numbers belonging to this Mission, great and small, are as follows:—31 men; 37 women; 25 boys, and 28 girls;—in all, 121.

In conclusion, permit me to say, that we have great reason to be grateful to the God of all our mercies, for all his blessings of providence and grace! May his blessings be showered down on the Missions in this Province, and on his work generally, is the prayer of your sincere friend and brother.

CREDIT MISSION.

At this Mission there has been a small decrease of 5 members of the Indian Society; but there has been an increase of 9 White members. This Mission seems not to have declined during the year; but we are sorry that we cannot afford other particulars, no report having been furnished to the Committee. But there are 105 Indians reported in Society in the Minutes of Conference.

LAKE SIMCOE MISSION.

The Rev. Thomas Hurlburt was appointed to this station. After serving the Society for many years, he has felt it is duty to transfer his labours to the Indian Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church. The Mission, during the year, has made some little advance. There has been an addition of 4 White members and 15 Indians. There are 135 Indian members, of the Church.

SAHGEENG MISSION.

The Indian Missionary, George Copway, laboured here the past year. It seems, from the increase of seventeen Indian members to the Church, that some success has attended his labours. The Mission has been no burden to the Society this year, the Indians having contributed out of their funds £100 to defray the support of the Gospel. The number of Indian members reported at the Conference was 134.

OWEN'S SOUND.

The Indian Missionary, William Herkimer, has faithfully laboured here during the year. The number of members reported at Conference was 4 White and 50 Indians. This Mission has been divided, and the present St. Vincent Mission detached from it. The Mission is in a thriving condition, and affords satisfaction to the Committee.

SCHOOGOG MISSION.

The Indians of Balsam Lake and Mud Lake have left their old localities, and have settled on the borders of Schoogog Lake. They have sent for a School-teacher, and have erected a house for him. The Mission is in a very encouraging state.

MISSIONS AMONG WHITE SETTLERS.

This is a field of patient discovery and ministerial devotedness on which the Society has, during the year, bestowed much of its solicitude and expended a considerable amount of its funds; and from which, as in the case of the Indian field of labour, there has been a repayment of gratitude, liberality, and christian success; a return this which, to the praise of God be it said, has, in some degree, been made to the Society year after year since its establishment.

WARWICK AND ADELAIDE.

This Mission has greatly prospered during the year. God has blessed the labours of the Missionary, and about 100 members have been added to the Church. Our friends have erected four log Chapels on this Mission the past year, each in a day, and all done by voluntary, cheerful work. Two of the Chapels are in the Township of Warwick, and two in the Township of Adelaide. The narrative is so singular and remarkable that we shall let our zealous brother Dignam, the missionary, tell it in his own pleasant way. Says he—

Some time ago we heard much said for the good people of "Craven's Neighbourhood," (U. S.) stating that they began building, and held the dedicatory service the third day. This was said, too, as if all other places in the western world should yield the palm to them. Now although Canada is not, perhaps, so proverbial for "enterprise" as some countries, yet, in Warwick, we have brought the building materials out of the bush, manufactured them into a temple for the worship of God, and held the dedicatory service the same day. "Not unto us, O Lord, but unto thy name be all the praise."

I had previously agreed to stand by and superintend the building. To this they agreed, if I would preach to them when all was done.

Thus there was a law, like that of the Medes and Persians, and all parties looked forward with great anxiety.

The morning came—I was not idle—
 I caught my steed, and spann'd my bridle ;
 And four white feet, in swift succession,
 Soon brought me to the sixth concession.
 The sun was gilding all creation,
 The songsters warbling adoration ;
 No note to me was half so cheering
 As what I heard in "Gardner's Clearing."
 The busy din of axes bounding,
 Chips were flying, woods resounding ;
 Drawing—sawing—shingle-making—
 Each one busy, no one speaking,
 Corner-men were busy fitting ;
 Working standing, working sitting ;
 Hands beneath, in full enjoyment,

 God bless the friends of Gardner's raising !

In the same township, north of the new Plank Road, I made a similar agreement, two days afterward. So the morning came ;—the axe-men came—the oxen came—and the materials came. All hands to work ; hewers of wood and drawers of water. And thus, with one united effort, our new-born temple sprang into order—as if the Creator had said, Let there be a house, and there was a house ; and in the same house, the same day, the high praises of the great Redeemer sounded. And, behold, the half is only told ! For, in the township of Adelaide, two more have been erected the same way, and dedicated the same day. Thus four houses have been built for the worship of God, and not one cent of the debt is to be liquidated, not one glass of rum was drank, not one unhappy feeling existed, not one disagreeable word spoken in the performance of 170 men's work.—Hallelujah ! I have been before congregations at many towns and villages in the Province, but none conveyed such high-toned feeling as to see the working-class, with folded sleeve and dripping face, brush away the dust and take their seats, whilst I stood upon the base of a royal oak stump, upon which the axes had played with destructive violence, (in a corner of the temple) and preached Christ, the sinner's Friend.

These houses are now fitting up for a two-fold purpose, viz. Preaching and Sabbath-Schools, and some of them are filled ;—the latter are producing a most salutary influence. I have obtained two acres (improved) for a Mission-house and premises from Capt. S. Moore ;—this I have not occupied yet. All these places can be, or have been, secured to the Conference, by either bond or deed, to be occupied for a School-house, Meeting-house, and Burial-ground. The new Plank Road intersects this Mission for 15 miles, making it very advantageous

for travelling. The Mission-house would be precisely midway between London and Port Sarnia, right upon the same road, and also in the centre of the Mission: thus holding forth every inducement for the occupation of the place.

The Mission is prosperous and promising; and, what I highly admire, they are not ashamed of Methodism. Some have joined, and are brought to God—others are seeking. We are beginning our *winter's work* on Tuesday first, by holding our first meeting for a "special effort," careless what class of Satan's subjects are displeased if God be glorified. I feel satisfied, if the good friends through the Province had the same opportunity of seeing the good effects of supporting a Mission here as I have, they would feel amply paid; and for their encouragement, it is on the very eve of supporting the townships of Warwick, Adelaide, Bosanquet, Plympton, and Enniskillen. I have been out upon an expedition as far as the waters of Huron; and, by the way, at the lake, I saw much of the beauties of nature;—but nothing, either by land or sea, ever gave me such sublime ideas of the great I Am, as the beautiful pebbles on the shores of Huron, where every blue breaker mirrors forth the incomprehensible, invisible, omnipotent Creator!

GOSFIELD.

The Mission department of the Gosfield Circuit includes the Townships of Maidstone, Rochester, and West Tilbury, in the Western District of the Province. The prospect among the inhabitants of these Townships is very encouraging. Two settlements of Ojebway Indians have been attended to, as well as the Indians on the Island of Point-au-Pélee, in Lake Erie, during the year. The Missionaries, the Revs. Solomon Waldron and Thomas Williams, have furnished the following interesting report of their labours on the Mission:

With regard to the Missionary labour on this Circuit I would state, that the Gosfield Circuit embraces at present the following Townships, viz: East Tilbury, Romney, Mersea, Gosfield, Colchester, Malden, Maidstone, Rochester, and West Tilbury. The first six of these compose the old Gosfield Circuit; the latter three have been added, and during the year we have bestowed as much labour upon them as we could well share from the older settlements. The old Circuit being quite extensive and entirely detached from the new Townships, and owing to the swampy nature of the land, the newness of the roads, and the openness of last winter, our visits latterly were few and rather "far between,"—the swamps not being frozen over so as to admit of travelling on horse but a few weeks during the whole winter. But when we were able to visit them, our visits were encour-

aging to ourselves, and, we trust, profitable to them; and whenever we have been able to be with them on the Sabbath-day, they showed their eagerness to hear the Word preached by turning out in large congregations, so that their houses (or shanties) could scarcely hold them. The three last-named Townships, with the rear of East Tilbury, present an interesting field of Missionary labour; but they are so separated from the old Circuit, by unsettled country and swamps impassable almost six months in the year, that they never can be well supplied in connexion with it. At the same time, it is important ground, and should be taken up. The Government are now making a new plank road through it, running from Chatham to Amherstburgh and Sandwich, on what is called the Middle Road; and in another year, along a line extending through six Townships, they will have good roads, though still separate and detached from the front of Gosfield by almost impassable swamps. Should a Missionary be sent to them to devote all his time among them, he could immediately form five Classes, and have enough to do in labouring among them. Settlers are coming in very fast, and some of our old settlers are moving back. It is altogether an interesting field of labour, and promises much for a future day, and in a short time they would do much to support their own Missionary.

There is another class of Missionary labour that has attracted some attention from us. It is among the Ojebway Indians, two settlements of whom reside within the bounds of this Circuit, and nothing heretofore has been done to instruct them, although there is a "British" Missionary stationed here for that purpose, who labours among the "destitute" of Gosfield and Amherstburgh, and about twenty Wyandot Indians. We have visited the Indians at Point-au-Pélé several times, and, knowing a little of their language, we have gained their confidence. They esteem their friends; and they are willing, nay, anxious, that we should do something to instruct them and their youth and children. The last time we visited them, the Chief pointed us to a body of a log house which he offered to us for a school-house; and another, built by a squatter, could be had for the residence of a Teacher or Missionary. He expressed great anxiety lest they should be still left in ignorance, expressing the greatest readiness to become a Christian should he receive the necessary instruction. We have no doubt but they would believe and enjoy the blessing of Religion should attention be paid to them. The Chief called together all the children so that we could see them. We counted eighteen, and there were some families absent. We would suggest, that if a Teacher could be got who could interpret and reside among them, they could be well supplied with preaching from the Circuit, as many of the Local Preachers take a deep interest in them. These Indians have attended some of our meetings, but, not understanding us, all they receive is deep impressions of the excellence of Christianity. On being asked how they felt, they would say, "My heart is sick." The white people are much interested in their behalf, and promise to do considerable

towards the support of their Teacher or Missionary. Lately, an unprincipled person began to build a Distillery on their lands; they felt alarmed, and applied to us for our interference; and we are happy to say that, by interesting Mr. Ironsides, their Agent in Amherstburgh, in their behalf, we have succeeded in arresting its progress.

With earnest prayer to Almighty God for the prosperity of this Cause, and for every blessing to be bestowed on those who are engaged in carrying it on, we beg to submit the above to your consideration.

GUELPH.

The difficulties and encouragements of this Mission are described in the report of it by the Rev. Stephen Brownell, who has laboured here during the past year. It appears that two sites of land have been obtained, that two Chapels are about being erected, and that about twenty members have been added to the Church.

The following are the prospects on this Mission at the present time. We have obtained sites for two places of worship,—the one in the village of Elora, the other in the township of Nichol. We are making preparations for the erection of two plain Churches, as we are too poor to build more respectable ones, unless assisted from abroad. I have expended in the purchase of the aforesaid sites, &c., about fifteen pounds of my own money, as I perceived, should I not do so, our cause on the Mission could not well be sustained amidst the opposition of Puseyites and other enemies to Methodism who are stalking abroad. I think the Missionary Society would do well to allow the friends at Elora some assistance in the erection of their Church, as it is a central position, consequently a proper place for holding our Quarterly and Missionary Meetings. We have not a place of worship of our own within the bounds of the Mission. Our friends are willing to do all they can, but are too poor to do what they would wish to do. We have seven regular appointments, and two or three occasional ones, between 200 and 300 miles travel in the month; when all the appointments are met, we have between 400 and 500 hearers; have two Sabbath Schools, in which there are about 70 children. We have had a few Protracted Meetings during the year, which resulted in the conversion of some souls, and in a small addition to the numerical strength of our Church.

WALPOLE.

From this Mission the Committee have received no report. It appears from the Minutes of Conference that there has been some decrease of members.

ST. VINCENT.

In this new part of the country, where settlers have been taking up their residence during the last few years, the Rev. John Neelands has been labouring. His report of the Mission is as follows :—

This Mission embraces the Townships of St. Vincent and Sydenham, and parts of Derby and Sullivan. There are at present thirteen appointments or congregations to whom the Word of Life is offered, and, as the population is rapidly increasing, more may be added. The number of Church members is ninety-three, divided into seven classes. This is an interesting field, and invites pressingly the attention of the Missionary Society, and no doubt but it will well remunerate the toil of the spiritual labourer with a rich harvest of souls. I would advise that a section of the work here be transferred to the Indian Mission at Owen's Sound. We have about 36 children and youth in our Sabbath Schools; but the instruction is much impeded for want of books. The Temperance cause is progressing. Altogether our prospects are brightening, so we "thank God and take courage."

BARRIE.

From the accounts received we understand that the spiritual and financial interests of this Mission have been encouraging during the year.

ASPHODEL.

The state of this Mission is also encouraging. A lot of land has been given, and a Parsonage has been erected on it during the past year. The Rev. William Young thus reports :—

This Mission embraces the six following townships :—Otonabee, Dummer, Asphodel, Belmont, Percy, and Leymore. It is bounded on the east, by the Marmora Mission; on the south, by the Murray, Colborne, and Cobourg Circuits; on the west, by the Peterboro' Circuit; on the north, by unexplored and uninhabited regions. The waters of the noble Trent run through this Mission, forming the division line between the townships of Percy and Asphodel, and passing through the townships of Leymore, Sydney, and Murray, emptying themselves into the Bay of Quinte. The public works now in operation on this river are creditable to all concerned therein : especially

to the excellent superintendent, Mr. T. Wilson, a gentleman whose vigilant oversight has preserved peace, industry, and, with comparatively few exceptions, correct morals among the workmen. We have from sixteen to twenty appointed places for preaching, the services at which are generally well attended. We have fourteen classes. We have received into the Church, from conversions, 25; from other Circuits, 20. The total number of members at the close of this Conference year is 266. The Societies, generally, are in a healthy state. From their limited resources, they have contributed their quota towards the support of the Gospel among themselves; have, during the past year, erected a Parsonage-house and Stable for the accommodation of their Missionaries, and have considerably increased their contributions to the general funds of the connexion.

MARMORA.

We have no report from the Missionary stationed on this Mission. But we understand that his labours have been very successful. The Minutes state that there are 118 members of the Church on this Mission.

CARTWRIGHT AND MANVERS.

Opposition to the truth is sometimes found even in the destitute parts of the land. Some portion of it has been experienced in this Mission. The Rev. John Williams has been labouring in this part of the missionary field for the year, and he thus reports:—

These two Townships formerly went by the name of the *Schoogog Missions*. It is bounded by the Peterboro' Circuit on the West, and Whitby on the North. From the town line between Cavan and Manvers it extends West within about three miles of the township of Reach, being about twenty miles in length. From the rear of Darlington and Clark it extends north to the east part of Schoogog Lake, —the Mission being about seven or eight miles broad; but this does not include the appointments among the Indians who reside on an island in the Northern part of the Lake. Within the limits of this Mission I have eight regular appointments in two weeks, two monthly appointments, and three occasional ones—thirteen in all. The congregations on the Sabbath are very good; frequently not less than 80 to 100 are convened to listen to the sound of the Gospel Trumpet. In townships settled not more than eight or ten years, this may be deemed a large attendance; and I have pleasure in stating that my Sabbath hearers have been increasing in number during the whole of the Con-

ference year. During the twelve months labour I devoted among this people, I received upwards of 20 probationers. The members are becoming more acquainted with the principles of Methodism, and their attachment to our Church is growing more ardent. We have seven classes, consisting of 109 white members. Our meetings are held chiefly in private houses; but several school-houses are in progress of erection. I need scarcely advert to the religious opposition which has been carried on in this sequestered part. The artifice and clandestine movements of the Kilhamites have failed to effect our members. And last winter the Millerites made another hard attempt in Cartwright to set up their battering engines, with a design to storm our Church and to batter down and demolish our bulwarks; but they found our defence invulnerable, so that in opposing our doctrines they found it like dashing snow-balls against a rock.

The *domestic* state of this Mission, as yet, is not favourable,—the people are poor, some of them *very* poor. Most of the members are natives of Ireland, and emigrated to this country a few years ago with little or no capital; and, although they are industrious, they find it hard to emerge from their indigence. However, the land in Cartwright and Manvers, in general, is of a good quality, which holds out a future prospect encouraging to the people. The total amount of money raised from the people, during the past year, was no more than eight pounds; yet I entertain no doubt but that in a few years this Mission will support a Minister, without assistance from our Missionary Fund.

I visited the Indians of Schoogog Lake four or five times during the year, and they were visited by Brother Davis (of Brock) once or twice. I had thought of sending you some necessary information concerning them; but as Brother Davis has included the Indians as members of his Mission, I infer that he intends sending you a full account of them.

GANANOQUE.

This portion of the country, like many others, partly maintains a Minister, and also receives some assistance from the Missionary fund. Although the village of Gananoque is respectable, yet other places visited by the Minister are poor. We are glad to find that the cause is advancing. The following interesting communication is from the Rev. Stephen Miles:—

Having to travel from the Western District, I did not reach the Circuit till the 29th July, 1841, when I immediately commenced my humble labours. I found but one organized class of 21 members, and one class-book. This was in the Franklin neighbourhood, Pittsburgh, which had been visited by the Kingston preachers. On arriving at

Gananoque, I was informed, that, after preaching a few times, I need not expect to have over a dozen hearers. This prediction, however, has not proved true, as in Gananoque, where we have had, with few exceptions, preaching every Sabbath, our congregations are large, respectable, and very attentive; and it affords me much gratification to say, that I have always found the Rev. Henry Gordon, pastor of the Presbyterian congregation in this village, the affable gentleman, and the zealous and affectionate Christian. There are six regular appointments every two weeks, at each of which, with one exception, a week evening appointment; the congregations are large, and very attentive. There are five classes, each furnished with a class-book. The appointments are so arranged as to enable me to be at a Prayer Meeting in Gananoque every Friday evening. This, however, I regret to say, is not as well attended as I should wish. There are a few on this Circuit, calling themselves Methodists, not attached to the societies under our charge; but I am fully satisfied that a great majority of the inhabitants are favourable, in their views, of the course pursued by the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada. I have reason to know, that the principles and doctrines of Christianity, as taught through the economy and influence of Methodism, are becoming more and more favourably received and permanently fixed in the minds and hearts of many. Since my stay on the Circuit, embracing the period from July 29, 1841, to the present date, I have sold one set of Clarke's Commentary, 24 of our Music Books, 96 of our Hymn Books, besides quite a variety of other useful and standard works, Catechisms, Almanacs, &c., furnished by our useful Book Establishment. I have preached 468 times; held four Watch Nights; officiated at all the Quarterly Meetings for the last two years; baptized 128 individuals, adults and infants; and solemnized matrimony between 23 couple. The financial returns may not appear as favourable as could have been desired; for which, however, there are causes, known only to those who are intimately acquainted with the Circuit. The funds will naturally increase, and the Circuit should, at all events, be continued. The space of country lying between Kingston and the Elizabethtown Circuit is important, and should never be abandoned by the Canada Conference.

CLARENDON.

This Mission has been long assisted by the Missionary Society. The labours of the faithful Missionaries have not been in vain. It can now about maintain itself, and will probably no longer require assistance from the Society. The Rev. William Morton writes as follows:—

This Mission comprehends four Townships, viz: Litchfield, Clarendon, Bristol, and Onslow. In attending to many places the Mis-

tionary must endure much toil. This place long continued a barren desert, which caused the hands of those who laboured here to hang down with discouragement; but at length the Lord visited it with the outpouring of his Spirit, and many were brought to God,—among the rest, some French Canadians, who, in broken English, give a pleasing account of their conversion. We have now twelve classes, two local preachers, four or five exhorters, and about one hundred and eighty-seven members. This outpouring commenced in August, 1843, and the work still continues to deepen in the hearts of the people. The acquaintance of some of the young people with Scripture, and other knowledge, might shame some on older Circuits. Although many of the people are poor, we expect this Mission is on the eve of supporting itself.

PEMBROKE.

From some cause or other there is no report from this part of the Ottawa country. But the Minutes show some improvement through the labours of the Missionary.

BUCKINGHAM.

We have no information from this Mission. The Committee cannot but complain of the Missionaries assisted by the funds of the Society who neglect one part of their duty, in not sending annual reports of the parts in which they labour. The Committee and the subscribers expect this information, and it is hoped that the cause of complaint will no more occur.

ST. ANDREWS.

The destitute settlers in the poor and back Townships are assisted by the Society. But as no report is sent in, the Committee can say nothing of the state of those Townships during the past year.

We have received also no reports from GLENGARRY, AMHERST ISLE, WOLF ISLAND, nor TYENDENAGA. The Society has liberally assisted those places, and it is hoped that the aid of the Society has succeeded, by the itinerant Ministers, in spreading evangelical truth, and in enlarging the Kingdom of our Lord Jesus Christ.

CONCLUSION.

It will be noticed, that the present Report is, in a great measure, composed of extracts from the letters of the Missionaries to the Secretary of the Society. This, it is thought, will render the present Report not less, but more, interesting than its predecessors. The Committee have only to regret that all the Missionaries, whether among Indians or white settlers, have not furnished definite information of their fields of labour. Had this been properly attended to, the Report would have been still more perfect, and consequently more satisfactory.

The Committee, in reviewing the past, feel grateful to Almighty God for the degree of prosperity with which He has crowned the labours of His servants;—confidence in the goodness of their cause, and in the belief that the friends of the Society will not withhold their hands from the support of this excellent work;—and encouragement to hold fast whereunto they have attained, and even make advances into parts where the Gospel is not yet known, or where its victories are not yet fully achieved.

The Committee would observe, that the state of the Province, and the calls made for aid, require no act or thought of regression, but rather a steady advance both in the numbers of its Missionaries and the amount of its funds. The population is fast increasing, and the limits of the settled country are every year enlarging. As the wild forests are encroached on by the industrious and hardy settlers, whether from the Mother Country
