# FULL TEXT OF MR. CURRIE'S SPEECH

Restigouche Member Criticises Acts of Present Administration In Legislature.

GIVE LUMBERMEN A CHANCE.

FREDRICKTON, Mar. 24.—Mr. Currie moved the adjournment of the debate.

House took recess.  
After the recess Mr. Currie stated that he had listened with very much pleasure to the different speakers in their discussions on the subject before the House. He noticed that there was a consensus of opinion that the president of the council, who was sent here by the prohibition party, the provincial secretary, who gained his honors of oratory championing the temperance cause, the solicitor general, who was created in a prohibition craze, and 15 or 16 members behind him, would have seen to it that something should be done along that line. The Premier had said that the most Act was good enough. The old government had been censured for their inactivity in the temperance cause, and he hoped that if they could not have prohibition they would have the nearest thing there was to it. He regretted that there was no reference in the speech to the policy of the government with regard to Crown Lands. It was well known that in a few years the Crown lands would all be up, and they could not blame the lumbermen if they took all the lumber out that they could get. It was a very serious matter in the province, the first in the world, and it was the duty of the government to take into consideration the whole question. The present system of collecting stumpage was improper. There were lots of scales, but in the short time it took them to do their work they could not possibly make the scale on half the logs. They did most of their scaling by guess work, and if the lumbermen was an opponent of the government they guessed "very hard, but if he was a supporter, they let him off easy. The scales cost the province \$11,000 a year and did very little good. He would like to see a committee appointed to inquire into the whole business.

The speaker made a comparison between the N. B. Quo and Ont. government showing under what a very great disadvantage the N. B. Quo was laboring. And that while the government of Ontario, charges more stumpage, than N. B. owing to the very poor survey the N. B. lumbermen's stumpage amounts to more than double that of Ont.

Mr. Currie's remarks were listened to with attention and he was followed by Mr. McLaughlin of Chatham.

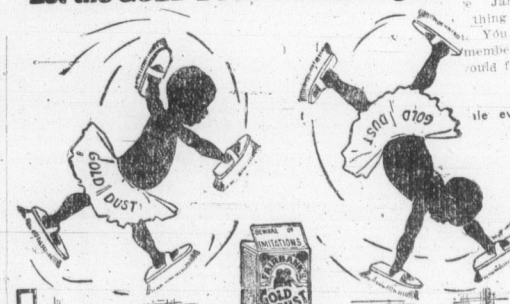
