Sir,—In the early part of last summer I ommunicated to the public through your communicated to the public through your journal, that having perceived symptoms of vegetation in two cohan potatoes that had been solidly frozen (in a Book press) the whole of the preceding winter, I had planted them, and that they were growing luxuriantly, promising at same 1 to send you the result of the experiment in the Fall. I dug them a few days since, and the produce, as weighed by Mr. J. B. Brown, was twenty four pounds, and all of full rize. Those frozen potatoes weighed six and eight ounces, the one was planted whole, and the other cut in two—the latter was by far the most productive in proportion. As far the most productive in proportion. As this species is rapidly spreading through the County, the hint may be of service to such persons as may have them injured by the frost, and perhaps other potatoes might stand the

same test, if tried.

The other robans that I planted at the same time, and treated in the common way, yielded four times the quantity produced by any other kind, some of them weighing upwards of treet pounds. A piece of ground 30 feet by 18, produced six businels, in hills. I intend to plant, this fall, a hed of them, and of some other descriptions, and will give you the result in due season.—In mean time, am, Sir, you most obedient Servant.
