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

Elrtists Represented.

ABORN, JOHN.

This artist is a constant exhibitor at the leading English Art Galleries. His work is most artistic, with a vigorous grasp of the subject represented. His pleasant pictures of Surrey landscapes find a ready sale.

COX, ARTHUR.

Member of the Liverpool Academy of Arts, and special artist to the London "Graphic." Many of his pictures are in private collections, including that of Lord Derby. He is a constant exhibitor at all the London Art Galleries.

GRACE, JAMES E.

Member of the Royal Society of British Artists. Mr. Grace possesses the faculty of producing bold effects and at the same time filling in all details with delicacy and refinement. There is a feeling of restfuiness and calm enjoyment in all his work, and his pictures are all delightful, and a treat to study, they are such as one would "like to live with."

HAGARTY, PARKER.

Member of the Royal Cambrian Academy of Arts. An artist whose work always has a ready sale, and it is noticeable for its delicate color and pleasant artistic feeling. The brush is good and the subject well chosen. He has sold pictures to very prominent collectors round Liverpool and district, also an important work to the Marquis of Bute for a large suth. He exhibits at all the standard exhibitions.

HAYES, CLAUDE,

Member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors and the Institute of Painters in Oli Colors.

This artist's work is very strong and rich in color, and his pictures are always welcomed at the London Exhibitions, where he regularly exhibits. He was awarded the Silver Medal at the Crystai Pulace, 1891, for his large oil entitled, "Near Arandel."

HAYES, EDWIN.

Acudemician of the Royai Hibernian Academy of Arts, Dublin. Member of the Royai Institute of Painters in Water Colors, the Institute of Painters in Oil Colors, etc. Diplomas, Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals awarded to Mr. Edwin Huys:—Sydney Exhibition, 1879. International Fishery Exhibition, 1883; Royal Diploma from the Queen, 1884; Adeiaide Exhibition, 1887; Crystai Palace Exhibition, 1888; Paris International Exhibition, Diploma for Water Color, 1889; World's Fair, Chicago, Medal and Diploma, 1893; Crystal Palace Exhibition, 1893; Crystal Palace Exhibition, 1896.

G. D. HISCOX, (Painter-in-Ordinary to the Queen.)

Mr. G. D. Hiscox has been a constant exhibitor for many years at the Royai Academy, Royal Institute, Royai Hibernian Academy, Royal Society of British Artists and other large art centres. For ten years in succession he has had large and important pictures in oil and water colors on the line in the Royal Academy, and has had the honor to exhibit his pictures on three occasions to the "Queen," and has sold some of his works to Her Majesty. Several of his paintings are at Windsor Castle and St. James Palace.

HOLMES, E. (deceased.)

The late Mr. E. Holmes' pictures are admirable in technique, fine in color, and finished in detail. His landscapes with figure subjects are highly prized for that natural delicacy in the form of the figures and the coloring, which is equally carried out.

HUSON, THOMAS.

Member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors. The water colors of Mr. Huson are always charming subjects, very charmingly rendered, manifesting a love for nature and a desire to behold her in one of her sweetest moods. His oil paintings are fresh, natural and vivid presentations of the charms of nature. Two of his paintings are in the Permanent Gallery at Liverpool.

KING, YEEND,

Vice-President of the Royal Society of British Artists, Member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors, and the Institute of Painters in Oil Colors. Medallist at the World's Fair, Chicago. Mr. King Is one of the most abic and rising of English artists, and at no distant day there is a strong probability of his being elected an associate of the Royal Academy. A celebrated pleture of his, "From Green to Gold," hangs in the Liverpool Permanent Gailery.

KNOWLES, G. SHERIDAN.

Member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors, the Royal Society of British Artists, the Royal Cambrian Academy of Art. This artist is considered one of the best figure painters exhibiting at the Academy, and his pictures are always reproduced in the official catalogue. His work gives munistakable proof of a sense of subject work, with the disposition to Invest Iandscape with poetic thought. In this he is always successful, while the grouping of the figures is excellent, expression and costumes well drawn, full of life and harmonious in color, which cutitle them to a high position in art.

MACINTOSH, JOHN M.

Member of the Royal Society of British Artists. Exhibits at the principal English Art Galleries. His work is done with a feeling for nature, with a patient and calm devotion to the practical requirements of art.

MORTON, GEORGE.

This artist resides in London, and exhibits at the principal Galieries. His work is mostly portrait and figure subjects, which attract much attention.

NORTON, W. E.

Exhibitor at the Royal Academy, Honorable Mention at the Salon, 1895, two Gold Medals in America at the National Academy of Design, N.Y., and the Philadelphia Academy. Mr. W. E. Norton was born in Massachusetts. In his youth he had a fondness for the sea, and made several voyages before the mast, previous to settling in Boston, where he began painting marine views, which are still his specialities, and in which he has met with decided success. In 1877 he went abroad, opening a studio in London, and where he still resides. He exhibits at the Royal Academy, the Salon and the principal Art Galleries of Europe. The "Art Journal" says of his work: "It is most remarkable for its effective presentation of fine neutral tints of rich deep gray and soft hazy dream-lights."

PARTON, ERNEST.

Member of the Institute of Painters in Oil Colors.

Mr. Ernest Parton is an American by birth, being born at Hudson, N.Y., 1845. He was elected a member of the Artists' Fund Society in 1873, and in that year went to Europe for the purpose of spending a few months in Great Britain, but, meeting with success in London, has remained there, and no other artist in England has made such a decided advance in his profession during the past few years. The one thing to be noticed in all the paintings of this artist is the remarkable skill he displays in keeping the individuality of colors; by this he produces charming effects where a less skilful artist would fail to make the picture Interesting, and there is always a decided out-of-door look about his work which tells the beholder that the artist painted Nature just as he found her.

PISA. A.

Mr. Pisa is at present a resident of London, but studied the art of painting in Florence and Parls. His style and colors are excellent, and in effects of atmosphere and lights he is very happy, and seems to get the magic that belongs to all delicate perceptions.

RICHARDSON, E. STEWART.

Member of the Royal Scottish Society of Painters in Water Colors. A landscape painter who has within the past few years taken a leap in advance, and is now ranked among the foremost painters in England. His delicately painted pictures show an acquaintance with the more modern phase of landscape art. Exhibits at the Royal Academy, Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors, and Institute of Painters in Oil Colors.

ROWE, T. TRYTHALL.

Exhibitor at the Royal Academy, Royal Hibernian Academy of Arts, Dublin, Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors and the Institute of Painters in Oil Colors. Mr. Rowe's favorite subject is landscape, which he paints true to nature and truly characteristic of English scenes.

STUART, CHARLES.

A well known artist of mountainous landscape. At the Art Union Exhibition, Mr. Stuart's "Sunshine and Mists," a bold view of mountain scenery, was selected for the highest prize, valued at £100. Mr. Charles Stuart's pictures always attract great attention, and do so year after year. His Scotch, Welsh and English landscapes, every one of which is deserving of careful study, and though all were painted by one artist, they show such wonderful variety that it is difficult to believe they are all from the one hand. Anyone who has studied the ever-varying effect of light and shadow in a mountainous region will have no hesitation in saying that Mr. Stuart has rather under-estimated than otherwise one of these sudden changes.—" Daily Telegraph."

WALTERS, G. S.

Councillor of the Royal Society of British Artists and exhibitor at the Royal ', elemy, Royal Institute and all principal galleries of Englated. His river scenes are exceedingly delicate in color and true to nature. It is impossible to look at this elever artist's work without feeling that the proper colors are there in well-balanced order.

WEEDON, A. W.

Member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors, the Royal Society of British Artists, etc. A painter of good style and clever manner of execution. The coloring of his work is good and generally of a quiet tone, but the light and shade in most cases strong, which has a charming effect All his pictures show excellent workmanship, and the details painted with care which is not easily equalled. His paintings are always hung in prominent positions at the leading exhibitions.
