QUEBEC RAILWAY MATTERS. "WILL OF THE WEST" Texan Oow-Boy Arrested in St. Thomas-Singhed With Bowie Enives and Riddled Slashed With Bowie With Bullets.

(From the St. Thomas Times.) One of the cells in the police station was occupied on Sunday last by Charles W. Moore, alias "Will of the West," an individual who has indeed lived a life of ro-

mance and interesting adventure. The varn which he spun to a Times reporter during the short lulls following successive outbreaks in the demoniac howlings of a poor wretch with the delirium tremens con-


fined in the cell adjoining, is given below, and presents a curious picture of life in the remoter settlements on the confines of civilization. There is hardly a portion of Moore's

anatomy that has not been perforated by bullets or slashed with bowie knives, and when he stripped to the waist in the chief's office, the sight he presented was peculiar, The left thigh bears the mark of a bullet wound, and the hard pellet, which was not removed, can be felt beneath the skin. In the left arm above the wrist, another bullet is still lodged. A gaping orifice in the left side just above the heart, shows where a "calet," (a Spanish dirk, 18 or 20 inches long, in shape like a spear head, but as pliable as whalebone) was thrust by a greaser in a border raid; while another unsightly hole in the back of his neck shows where the point of the weapon came out. A scar which crosses the forehead, and runs partially around the head, represents where he was scalped by Indians, who "cow-bovs," kil made a descent upon the "cow-boys," kil-ling eight of these desperadoes and wound-

ing two besides himself. Over the left eye is another bullet wound and a portion of his ear is missing.
