

CHOLERA AND TYPHOID.

TWO EPIDEMICS DEPLETING THE POPULATION OF PARIS.

A California Man a Victim - Action Taken by British and United States Residents - Deaths in Other Parts of France.

Paris, Nov. 14 - Continued cold weather is exerting a favorable effect on the rate of mortality, which does not exceed one in 36,000. The ravages of the epidemic are trivial compared with those of typhoid fever. This epidemic shows little if any effect upon the pleasure-seeking propensities of the people. Theatres and other places of amusement are well filled every night. The disease has made large ravages among the soldiers of the garrison, but the officials publish no returns and refuse all information.

Dr. MacGillivray, of the Glasgow Messenger, states that the exodus of English and American people from Paris is altogether unjustifiable. Many people have fled for refuge to more dangerous places. He advises that only weakly constituted and nervous, timid people should leave the city. A strong, healthy people is perfectly safe in Paris if they avoid excesses and banish all fear of disease.

Five cases of cholera occurred yesterday among the employees of the newspaper Moniteur Universel. A printer died almost immediately. Christiana Christiansen of California died from cholera to day. He is the first American victim.

A meeting was held to day of American and English residents to take measures for the relief of cholera sufferers. A resolution was adopted to distribute a list of provisions and provide soup kitchens for the English and American poor.

Since midnight, 17 deaths in the city and 31 in the hospitals. The deaths were: 1 at Toulon, 3 at Nantes, 3 at Orlan, 2 at Melun.

SMYTHIA FOR THE CROFTERS. The Home Secretary Appeals to the Landlords in their Behalf.

LONDON, Nov. 14 - In the house of commons Mr. St. John said that the crofters had his deepest sympathy. He stated that the employment of force against them and the Scottish farmers' landowners was a resolution which he would not support.

Gordon Hill Holding Out. LONDON, Nov. 14 - A Douglas dispatch states that the holding out of Gordon, dated Nov. 14, confirming the massacre of Col. Stewart and Power and Mr. Herby. Gordon says he will not hold out against the militia.

Admiral Rieu's Losses. PARIS, Nov. 14 - Recent despatches from Admiral Rieu state that his fleet has suffered numerous losses, especially in the bay of Biscaya. It is believed that the admiral has been killed.

Lady Lytton has been vindicated. LONDON, Nov. 14 - The inquest into the death of Lady Lytton has resulted in a verdict of natural causes, thus vindicating her reputation.

Threatening Anarchists. PARIS, Nov. 14 - Troops have been despatched to Montceau les Mines to restore order as notices have been posted there on food imports.

REPORT OF THE BUREAU OF INDUSTRIES FOR NOVEMBER.

A Pleasant Field of Wheat, Barley, Oats, Peas, Potatoes, Mangolds, Carrots and Turnips.

The report of the bureau of industries for November deals chiefly with the grain and root crops of the province, and gives tables of produce based on 2500 returns made to the bureau on Oct. 25, 1884.

THE ROMANY RACE.

Miss Britman's knowledge of a Curious People. The only living American who has any intimate knowledge of the language, history and customs of the mysterious Gypsy is Charles Godfrey Leland, the distinguished author in Philadelphia. He was seen recently by a reporter for the Press, and in the course of a conversation his knowledge of the Romany race was mentioned as a matter of compliment. "Oh, yes, I do know considerable about the gypsies," he said in the course of conversation. "I was with them constantly for several years in England, and even now, in America, I see some of that queer folk nearly every week. The way I came to know them was through my studying philology. For months I spent entire days in their tents, using only the Romany language. By the by, their language is the best index of their origin. The gypsy is unquestionably a Hindoo. The European gypsies of to-day have retained much of their race characteristics. But they are amalgamating more and more with other races. They thrive better in America than elsewhere. In England the passage of the enclosure act virtually abolished all common lands, and so the gypsy has now no place to pitch his tent, unless he becomes a trespasser. The fact is that the great increase of population in three of 25,000,000 in that small country necessarily put a stop to gypsy encampments. Now very many live in cities during the winter season. In summer they resume their nomadic career. "Their avocation for the most part is horse-trading and fortune-telling. They have the reputation of swindling horses. They don't deserve it. I regard the gypsy as a much more honest character than many Christian folk of a superior standing and higher culture. Many people think they steal household articles. I am sure they don't. Why, if an article is missed within five miles of a gypsy tent, the owner will be miles around makes a raid on the tent. If they ever did steal, this would prove it. Besides, there is no need. All gypsies are rich. The men are very shrewd horse-traders, and they carry considerable money at the business. The women always find speculations persons from whom to sell their wares, and their fortunes. Their habits are economical, and their modes of life very inexpensive. The gypsy never cares about personal adornment. Even the old taste for fancy costumes is disappearing, if it has not entirely disappeared. "How many gypsies there are I cannot say. I was only able to trace about one hundred family names in England. Most of these have representatives in America. There are a few Spanish gypsies here also, but the great bulk are English stock. Most of the older folks in America now were born in England. Only the younger generations are natives. The Scotch gypsies are of a higher class, but they are not numerous now. Irish gypsies? Yes, there are some few. "They are for the most part tinkers or tinklers. They have a dialect of their own, of which I am the first philological discoverer. The only mention of it in literature is by Shakespeare, who makes Prince Hal say: 'I can talk with the tinker in his own dialect.' The dialect is called the 'Shelta'. "Some time ago I saw an Irishman thinking in the back yard of my house. I went up and addressed him in Romany. He replied in that tongue without showing the least surprise. I then addressed him in the Shelta. He at once exhibited unfeigned surprise. The fellow told me he knew very few who spoke the dialect, and that he was surprised to find me use it. From him I learned much more of the dialect than I had known. I made his instructions to me the basis of a character in a work on gypsies. A London journalist said that the Irishman had picked off an ancient Irish dialect on me. I jokingly retorted that the Irish gypsy is a half-breed. They are all tinkers. "The religion of the gypsy was pure atheism. They are the only absolute atheists I ever met. But now, however, in England, they are beginning to practice formal religion. Some of them have the babies baptized, and others affect legal marriage. With this change may come a love of civilized and cultured pursuits. "As far as I can trace, no gypsy has arisen in literature, art or science. How- ever, if he should, it would be difficult to prove, for pride would hide the origin. It is said that Daniel Webster and Hiram Hannan were of gypsy descent. I cannot believe the assertion has good foundation. President Lincoln certainly did look like a gypsy, and yet I know no reason to assert that he sprung from these strange people. With these amalgamations with the Gentiles comes also a desire to settle down. There are the Cooper in Boston and the Harrisons in Washington; they are rich, and as far as I know, they never go on the road. I know a few other families that have given up tent life, and who now permanently reside in homes."

He was acquitted. "Daniel Webster once proved that he was the handsomest man in New England. "Boston," said he, "is the handsomest town in New England. "Tremont is the handsomest street in Boston. Scollay's are the handsomest buildings in Tremont street, Christopher Gore's office is the handsomest room in Scollay's building, and I am (now) the handsomest man in Christopher Gore's office—ergo, I am the handsomest man in New England."
