ONE MORE MAN IMITATES PROFD. ODDUM.

He Stands Erect for a Hundred Yards and Dealing 100 Sheets into the Water Like a Ballet and Dies.

New York, July 23.—At about 9 o'clock this morning a small party of men, one of whom was a slender dandy reaching down to his feet, passed through the Brooklyn entrance to the bridge promenade. The 77 walked out a little beyond the first pier to part not guarded for the moment by the Police. Then the man with the dandy's build threw off the garment and showed himself to be attired in a close fitting jumpsuit suit. He clambered quickly to the side of the bridge and jumped off. He stood perfectly erect for about a hundred feet of his fall. Then he suddenly floundered up and second came to the surface again. The man disappeared, and it was some time before the police were informed of the tragedy. But few persons saw it.

Victory of the Scott Act in the County of Victoria. LONDON, July 23.—The Scott act has been adopted in Victoria county by a majority of 650 with twelve polling stations to hear from, also the Muskoka district which will swell the majority to over 1000.

A Majority of Fifty Votes Against the Tories. LONDON, July 23.—The government was defeated in the House of Commons this evening by a vote of 180 to 130 in a clause of the medical relief bill. The Parliaments opposed the government. On the announcement of the result the ministers held a hurried consultation, and it was finally decided to resign. The government resigned responsibility for the bill. Sir William Harcourt immediately resigned the responsibility on behalf of the opposition. The discussion was then continued. Mr. Labouchere started an exciting debate in which the liberals tried to induce the government to state whether it intended to oppose the bill eventually. Sir Michael Hicks-Besant promised to resign if the government refused to do so. An amendment to the rejected clause is almost certain to be rejected in the House of Lords and a conflict will thus be raised between the two Houses.
