He soon afterwards began speculating and was so successful that he decided to start in business for himself. In his endeavor to control the wheat market he over-reached his resources and collapsed.

Wheat continued nervous faroughout the day, the extreme decline being 45c on July. June came next with a break of 3c, and on later months there was an irregular decline of it to life. The option dealings reached nearly 30, 706,000 bushels, the largest ever recorded.






