36TH SESSION OF THE INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE ON EDUCATION (UNESCO) IN GENEVA, AUGUST 30 - SEPTEMBER 8, 1977

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Don Jamieson, announces that a Canadian delegation will participate in the thirty-sixth session of the International Conference on Education, from August 30 to September 8, 1977.
