HAMILTON CIVIC AFFAIRS

Final Meetings Last Night of the Fire and Water and Markets Committees.

PRESENTATION TO ALD. McANDREW.

Ald. Metherall Intends to Sue Ald. Findlay for \$5000 Damages—Minor News.

Hamilton, Dec. 21.—(Special.)—The closing meeting of the Fire and Water Committee was held last night. Ald. Hannaford presided and nothing was said about his appointment as waterworks superintendent. City Engineer Barrow presented his annual report. During the year 327 miles of water mains were laid, making the total number of miles at present 9047. During the year 145 water meters were put in and they were found to be efficient. Twenty-two hydrants were put down during the year. The department's financial statement showed an overdraft of \$1300. The revenue was \$175,000. The expenditure was \$183,000 on general expenses and \$27,207.89 on construction account, leaving an overdraft of \$3067.2. The balance of the overdraft arose out of the street watering. The appropriation was \$30,000.

Markets Committee.
A large number of reports were presented at last night's meeting of the Markets Committee. The committee's appropriation was overdrawn \$308, the appropriation being \$3000. The committee's account was overdrawn \$782, the weight scales \$137, and the jail \$74. The police appropriation showed a balance of \$24. The committee gathered in license fees during the year \$9021.50, and the fees from the Central Market as given by Superintendent Davis were \$5470.40, as against \$5047.98 last year. The reduction was due to the operation of the Milk Act.

May Also Be Taken
In.

NEWARK WANTS TO GET OUT.
Owner Bloembeck Has Entered Suit
and League Thinks He Only
Wants to Join Eastern.

Allentown, Pa., Dec. 21.—Charles B. Bloem-
beck, owner of the Newark Baseball Club,
this afternoon filed a bill in equity against
the Atlantic League, praying that the league
be dissolved and his contract re-
solved; that he may join any other league;
the proceeds of the league divided among
its present members; and that he be allowed
\$2500 damages. Bloembeck alleges that
last July he bought the Newark franchise
and players from the league for \$2000, but
that Players Carlick and Cassidy deserted,
and the Board of Arbitration has awarded
the contract made with him, and failed to
deliver that for which he paid. He also al-
leges that Hartford has withdrawn from the
league, and that Paterson is in default of
\$3000, while Wilkes-Barre and
Scranton are about to join the league
against his consent.

At to-night's meeting of the Atlantic
League, Paterson was expelled for failure
to live up to contract obligations, and the
franchise was declared vacant. Norfolk's
resignation was accepted, and the franchise
awarded to George Ellis to operate where-
ever he chooses. Scranton was admitted,
and the resignation of Newark was tabled.

The league officials consider Owner Bloem-
beck's suit to dissolve the league and for
\$2500 damages only as a step to enable him
to enter the Eastern League, and they
will fight the case to the end.

The Atlantic League circuit for next season
will include Lancaster, Reading, Allantown,
Scranton, Richmond, Newark, Hart-
ford, and either Wilkes-Barre or Paterson.
Ellis will locate either at Norfolk or Pat-
erson.

Receipts of Rugby Finals.
Ottawa, Dec. 21.—The Canadian Rugby
Union has taken what is generally consid-
ered to be a very fair method of dividing
the gate receipts of the final championship
games, and the rule has been made for
this year as well as for future matches.

The Union takes charge of the receipts
and pays all expenses. The net amount
is then divided into five equal portions,
two-fifths of which go to each of the com-
peting teams and one-fifth to the Union.

Out of the Union's share, the expenses of
the year must be paid, including the prize
of trophies for the senior and inter-
mediate champions. The gate of the Col-
lege-Ottawa final game, after all expenses
were paid, amounted to \$346.83. The Col-
lege team yesterday received a cheque for
an amount in the vicinity of \$250 and the
Ottawas got a cheque for a like amount.

The Ottawas also received two-fifths of
the \$540 netted from the Varsity-Ottawa
game in Toronto.

90,000 PEOPLE MET DEATH

Owing to Famine in the District of Yemen, Arabia-Turks Whip Rebels.

St. Petersburg, Dec. 21.—A victory of the Turks over rebel natives in the district of Yemen, Arabia, is reported. The insurgents suffered heavy losses. The rebellion is the result of fanatic agitation. Ninety thousand people have died recently from famine in the same region.

INVESTIGATION OF THE WAR.

General Miles Objected to the Quality of the "Embalanced Beef" Supplied.

WHO WERE THE MEN RESPONSIBLE?

General Merritt Thought the Expedition in the Philippines Was a Decided Success.

Washington, D.C., Dec. 21.—General Nelson A. Miles, commanding the United States army, and General Wesley Merritt, commander of the American forces at the capture of Manila, were the principal figures before the War Investigating Committee today. General Miles responded to the questions of the committee only after several days' consideration. He was accompanied by his own stenographer. His examination was comparatively brief and not sensational. He spoke with some bitterness as to the "embalmed beef" and the "embalmed beef" furnished the army in the Philippines. He characterized as an experiment for which "some one in Washington" was responsible. He said that the landing facilities of the San Francisco expedition were inadequate, and that the men were short of rations and medicines and might have been better protected from exposure to fever contagion.

General Merritt took the committee through a detailed success, and would conduct it on the same lines if he had to do it over. He spoke in high terms of the troops under him, and said his army was well supplied with medicine and food.

CARPET BAGGERS COME BACK

Sir Wilfrid and Sir Louis Now at the Capital—Both Are Mums, But Thinking Hard.

Ottawa, Dec. 21.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Sir Louis Davies arrived from Washington at 11:30 to-day. Both commissioners appeared to be in excellent health and spirits. They declined to discuss the subject of the negotiations for Sir Louis Davies remarking that there was nothing to add to what has already been said in connection with the matter. Sir Wilfrid, however, in connection with the matter, and report progress. Sir Richard Cartwright will go direct to Kingston.

LYNCHED A U. S. SOLDIER!

William Sims Dragged From an Alabama Jail and Hanged.

Decatur, Ala., Dec. 21.—William Sims, a soldier who unpromptly murdered Robert Horton, a prominent citizen of Tower Creek, six miles from here, while at a country dance, was dragged from the county jail to-day by a mob of 500 men and hanged. He was hanged on a tree near the jail and his body riddled with bullets. A brother of the murdered man led the mob.

METHODIST MISSIONS.

The 74th Annual Report Has Just Been Issued.

The Methodist Missionary Society's 74th annual report shows that in Japan there are 23 missionaries, 15 teachers and 2,570 members, and during the year \$21,455.22 has been expended. In addition to this \$20,000 was devoted to Japanese work in British Columbia. In the Dominion there are 50 Indian missions and 37 missionaries, 27 assistants, 32 teachers, 11 interpreters and 5,407 members. The expenditure in this branch of the work was \$35,945.56. In China and in British Columbia there are 10 missionaries, 2 assistants and 4 teachers looking after the Chinese. The sum expended was \$12,192.90. In the domestic fields the grants have been increased \$11,387.76. In the 408 missions there are 4,000 missionaries, 3,000 assistants and 37,000 members. The \$24 paid agents of the society received \$30,881.15 last year. The French work is disappointing, and the missionaries report uninteresting hostility.

SLOWLY BURNED TO DEATH

The Awful Fate of Roderick Chisholm, a Chicago Electrician.

Chicago, Dec. 21.—Among a network of wires 30 feet from the ground, Roderick Chisholm, an electrician, was slowly burned to death last night, in sight of several and silent spectators, at the corner of Fifth and State streets. For nearly ten minutes the horror-stricken crowd watched the workmen in their frantic efforts to release their comrade from among the wires. He was bound to the wires with his hands and feet, and after considerable difficulty and not a little danger to the rescuers, Chisholm's body was gotten to the street.

New York Financial Cable.

New York, Dec. 21.—The Commercial Advertiser's financial cable from London says: "The markets here were dull this morning, but a brisker business was done later in sympathy with Americans, which opened good and then bounded upward. Baltimore & Ohio and Central Pacific leading. New York caused a small setback afterward, but soon brought Union Pacific, causing a resumption of the rise. American sales began when the house closed, causing a flat finish. There has been big buying here, with the idea of laying in stock for the new year. Spanish bonds are being sold at 100. The new French loan is said to be practically arranged. Gold was bid for at 78 1/2 by Germans. Money is easy."

Mr. Shields Knew Brady.

Detective Thomas Flynn has just received a letter from his brother-in-law, Mr. Alex. Shields, master mechanic of the Southern Indiana Railway, who was for many a dream on the Grand Trunk with the late Engineer Brady, who was killed in the Murray Hill disaster. Mr. Shields had just read the account of the disaster in which his old friend was killed and his heart was heavy. "Central in the group of the dead," he says, "was Billy Brady, whose strong resolution in discharge of known duty was a matter with which I was familiar years ago. The suggestion made by some poor cartoonist's ignorant hand that he was intoxicated at the time of the accident is too flagrant to notice. We who knew him pass such a suggestion with disgust."

A Plea on Christmas Cards.

The attention of the public is called to the fact that Christmas cards are not permitted to pass through the mails prepaid at the one-cent rate, unless they are less than one inch square, unless they are left open to inspection, not sufficient; the ends must be left open to inspection; otherwise they are sent to the post office and are liable to consequence in effecting delivery.
