



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TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

The Council elected at the last annual meeting of this Association beg, in the following report, to direct the attention of the Association to some of the occurrences which have marked its twenty-third year.

At the regular November meeting the Council selected an Executive Committee as required by the Constitution. It was not subsequently found necessary to hold any special meetings of Council, and therefore the whole work of the Association for the past year has been conducted by the Committee.

The report of the proceedings of 1888 was, in time, published and distributed. In addition to the usual reports, Sussex shooting and County returns, there was inserted a full list of all former winners of the various Provincial Cups and Medals. This list constitutes a complete record of Provincial first prize winners since the formation of the Association, and of the Prince of Wales' Cup since it was first shot for. One error has crept into the list of the winners of the Provincial Gold Medal. Sapper Chris. Johnston, N. B. E., should appear as the winner in 1867 instead of Lieut. J. P. Bixby, St. Stephen.

The first duty which the Committee had to undertake was in connection with the selection of the N. B. Eight for the Maritime match. The Ottawa shooting of last September had filled three places on the team, so it remained for the committee to select five

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men from among the Martini shots. In doing so, the committee, of course, paid special regard to the former Martini experience of those who seemed eligible for positions. With the experience of the present year it must be recognized that this method of selection possesses at least one serious fault. While it, no doubt, is calculated to bring together a team of experienced and reliable men, it makes no provision that the men shall put in sufficient practice to fit them for such a match. Even taking into consideration the fact that the weather during the fortnight preceding the match practically stopped all firing in St. John, it would seem to the Council that there was too much indifference among the team to the necessity of hard practice, and, in the end, the team was not prepared to do its best for the Province.

On Thursday, the 13th of June, this Association, in its due rotation, received the visiting Teams of Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island on Drury Range. The day, though clear, was very windy, and even cold, and the personal pleasure of the match was therefore a little marzed. The match ended in the decided success of the Nova Scotia Team, with a total score of 658, 65 points more than New Brunswick with a total of 593; the Island being a close third with 588.

The visiting Teams accepted the invitation of the President and Council to dinner at the Dufferin Hotel. In the course of the evening the Maritime Trophy was formally surrendered by the President to the Captain of the N. S. Team. An impromptu toast list, and a sprinkling of songs, largely contributed by the visitors, made the evening pass quickly and pleasantly.

The Council would wish to recognize, in the fullest manner, the obligation under which the Association was placed by many of the officers of the St. John Corps, and by some who were able to be present from a distance. In truth it was principally owing to their assistance that the Association was able to give due prominence to the match, and due honor to the visiting teams. At the request of the President many of these officers attended in uniform during the shooting, and it is not saying too much to state that their willing support was the chief cause of the pleasant evening spent at the Dufferin table.

The Association is likewise indebted to the members of the St. John County Association for having the Range in full readiness for the match.

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It having been announced that the Dominion of Canada Matches would open on Monday, September 2nd, Tuesday, the 28th of August, though perhaps rather a late date, was necessarily selected for the commencement of the Sussex shooting. The programmes had been prepared and distributed early in the summer. It had not appeared to the Committee desirable to introduce many changes in the Prize List, so those that were made were few in number and of no great moment. Some few of the money prizes were withdrawn from the Provincial Match and placed to better advantage in the Domville Competition. Then too, in the Association Match, the prizes were rearranged so that the first thirteen were each of higher value than five dollars. The Ranges of this match were once more made 260, 500, and 600 yards, while those of the Prince of Wales were changed to 200, 400, and 500, with as usual the standing position at the first distance.

Apart from the heat, the Association was never more favored in the matter of weather, and the Executive was consequently enabled to carry out the programme, including the presentation of Prizes, by Thursday afternoon.

The attendance of competitors was an average one. The entries reached as high as 83 in some matches, and fell to 71 in the "Prince of Wales'." The resolutions passed at the annual and Council meetings in regard to the admission of civilians were carried into effect, and all the regular matches save the "Prince of Wales" and "Nursery," were thrown open to them. Ten civilians participated, of whom 4 were from St. John, 3 from Charlotte, 2 from Westmorland, and 1 from Fredericton.

While it is to be noted with satisfaction that there was a slightly improved attendance from York and Charlotte Counties, it is regrettable that the representation from Carleton County consisted of but three, and that of Northumberland, for a second time, of but one. Are the County Associations doing what they can to work up an interest in rifle-shooting among their local Militia? The Council feel very strongly that it is at least the duty of all County

Associations to hold their competitions prior to the Provincial, and thereby offer their members an oppotunity of being encouraged to enter for the Sussex shooting. In the larger centres too, more frequent competitions in the form of Monthly Matches should be arranged for after the example so successfully set by St. John and Fredericton. Something more is needed from a County Association than that it should hold but one gathering in the course of the year, regardless of whether or not it may contribute any recruits to the shooting strength of the district. If the old method of one Annual Competition proves ineffectual, the Council must recommend that other and newer methods be tried.

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The Snider Ammunition used was that of 1888, similar to what was shot at the last matches, and as then, it gave the utmost satisfaction. The scores made in the various matches, even by our small field of competitors, will well bear examination, and the Council would specially refer to the team totals in the Elder Matchbeing, as they are, the highest yet recorded in that competition.

The final competition for the Cup presented in 1884 by the Hon. D. McLellan, Provincial Secretary, was shot on Thursday; four of the five winners being present. The fortunate competitor was Lt. J. D. Perkins, 71st Batt., the winner of the Cup in its first year of competition.

The usual presentation of prizes was held on the Range, and was made by the President and Vice-President of the Association. Noticeably absent on the occasion, and for the first time in all the years of his command in the district, was Lieut.-Col. Maunsell, D. A. G., who had been called to Ottawa to act as Executive officer of the D. R. A. Meeting. The Council have to acknowledge the addition of the Nursey Cup made to the Prize List by Colonel Maunsell.

The lease under which the Association has latterly occupied the Stockton Range expires with this year. Before next August it will be necessary for the Association to enter into some new arrangement for target accommodation. Some radical improvements will also have to be made to the Butts and Range houses which are no longer safe or fit for use. The Committee had in view last spring the construction of a continuous trench to replace the

present single Butts, and made application to the Militia Department for a grant necessary to do the work. Presumably because the matter was not placed before the Department in the right manner, no notice has been taken of the application. It remains for the new Council to push the matter further in the direction of procuring a serviceable and properly equipped Range.

The Ottawa Team Report and Prize Return will be laid before you. They tell, if not of any great, yet of a very fair amount of success, even though confined to a minority of the team. The positions taken in the Dominion of Canada Match by the 62nd Fusilier and 71st Battalion Teams, by the N. B. Eight in the London Merchants; by Sgt. Loggie in the Grand Aggregate and Governor General's; and by him and Col. Sgt. Henderson in the Wimbledon Twenty, are good causes of satisfaction to the Council. The Council also feel that the Association can justly bear in mind that Pte. C. T. Burns, who is looked up to as this year's champion at Ottawa, was but a few months ago one of its members, and acquired his shooting knowledge on Drury Range.

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OTTAWA TEAM REPORT.

St. John, N. B., Oct. 1, 1889.

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The President of the N. B. Rifle Association.

SIR: I have to submit the return of prizes won by the New Brunswick Team at the recent Dominion Matches, and beg to supplement it with the following brief report:

The low rate offered by the C. P. Ry. over the Short Line gave the members of the team a choice of route, and the saving of a good deal of time to those who preferred to remain at home as long as possible. These latter left on Saturday afternoon, and joined the rest of the Team on Sunday at Ottawa. We then had a meeting, and found ourselves to be 34 in number, the strongest N. B. Team which has yet visited Rideau.

As has always been the custom, we telegraphed our entries while en route to Ottawa. Unfortunately for us, the number of general entries was greatly in excess of what was expected, and had exhausted all but the last few tickets. These were all squadded at the end of the Individual Competitions, and therefore our team had to fire just before the completion of each match. Without doubt this was a serious disadvantage, as we had frequently to fire about mid-day and late in the afternoon in a failing light. To guard against this in the future, it would be well to send forward early as many entries as the Team is likely to require.

I may report that the team was not quite satisfied with its share of success. Low scores were much too frequent, and our fortunate members were too often but a small proportion of the team. Perhaps this all was the result of three objectionable causes; extreme heat, a wind that was never steady, and defective cartridges. At least these were generally credited with the prevalent "bursts," of which nearly every competitor had a share.

Some good fortune, however, awaited us. The 62nd Fusilier and 71st Battalion Teams, of five each, within a point of each other, took first and second places in the Battalion Match shot in connection with the "Dominion of Canada." Among Team Matches this one between Battalions seems to be regarded by the

majority of competitors as the most important. No doubt this is owing to the shooting rivalry which exists between corps in Ontario, and in Quebec. We, therefore, struck a hard blow by winning these two prizes.

The best individual success was that of Sgt. Loggie. He took Third Aggregate, won a badge in the Governor General's Match, and stands second on the Wimbledon Team tie with the top man, Marris, of Hamilton. Together with him, Col. Sgt. Henderson and Lt. J. Manning shot into the Snider Aggregate, and all three, with Lt. E. A. Smith, into the Grand Aggregate. Henderson is 16th on the Wimbledon Team, and Lt. Smith 25th.

Finally, the N. B. Eight secured the second place in the London Merchant's Cup Match, and a prize of \$80. The score was 662. The Ontario Team shot magnificently, and well earned the Cup with a total of 704, an average of 88 points. The other Provinces scored as follows: Manitoba, 652; Nova Scotia, 642; Quebec, 627; P. E. Island, 624.

NOVEMBER 7th, 1889.

Present: Lieut.-Col. J. R. Armstrong, Vice-President, in the chair; Major F. H. Hartt, Capt. J. H. McRobbie, Major J. J. Tucker, Lieut. W. Parks, Sergt.-Major Carmichael, Mr. P. A. Melville, Mr. J. Hunter, Lieut. E. A. Smith, and Capt. J. T. Hartt.

The meeting having been called to order, the minutes of the last Council meeting were confirmed, and those of the annual meeting read for the information of members present.

Capt. J. T. Hartt was re-elected Secretary-Treasurer.

The following members of Council were elected to form the Executive Committee:

Capt. McRobbie, Mr. P. A. Melville, Major Hartt. Captain Kinnear, Lieut. E. A. Smith. The letter from Lieut.-Col. Beer, in reference to the Fredericton Pitcher, which had been referred to the Council by the annual meeting, was then read and discussed.

Moved by Capt. McRobbie, seconded by P. A. Melviville-

"That the matter be referred to the Executive Committee, with full power to confer with Col. Beer and to accept the Pitcher on terms agreeable to him and them."—Carried.

Letters from J. D. Chipman and Lieut. A. J. Raymond were read, regretting inability to be present at the meeting.

The report of the committee appointed at the annual meeting to procure information regarding a new range at Sussex, was presented, together with a detailed statement of the estimated cost and plan of the Fairweather Range, showing approximate distance from the I. C. R. station.

Moved by Major Hartt, seconded by Capt. McRobbie-

"That the report be received and referred to the Executive Committee, with Col. Beer and Mr. J. D. Chipman, with power to take from Mr. Fairweather a lease of the range, including a suitable right of way for ten years, with a right in the Association to renew for a further term, and that application be made to the Government for a sum sufficient to put the range in order; that such committee be charged with full power to determine the kind of butts and erections to be placed on the range, and to superintend their construction."—Carried.

After some discussion as to the uncertainty of having the new range in readiness for the next annual matches, it was resolved—

"That the Executive Committee communicate with Mr. Stockton regarding the old range, and that they have power to procure a year's lease of it should it appear that the Fairweather Range will not be available for the matches of 1890."

The section of the Council report dealing with the selection of the Maritime Team was read and considered.

"That the recommendation of the annual meeting as to the entrance fees in the Nursery and Maiden Match be carried out."—Carried.

On motion, the meeting adjourned.
