

If you plan a little and use your common sense there is no need of wasting one particle of food. Cook plenty but use it all in one way or another. Here's a secret: A friend of mine whose husband was very fond of boiled onions with a cream dressing always used those left to make a soup the next day, adding a steak bone or any bits of meat she had and a stalk of celery, or, lacking these, she put in a little cream. The omions and cream dressing, boil all together for an hour. Strain and serve with toast strips and Parmesan cheese. I am still harping on that long end of the steak; you can make it into Hamburg steak with rice. Use one cup of cold boiled rice and one and one-half cups of Hamburg steak, saltspoon of salt, teaspoon of minced pepper, or one stalk of celery chopped fine. Mix all together, add one egg. Put meat and rice mixture into small cabbage leaves that have been boiled so as to be pliable. Tie all together. Put into a baking pan with one cup of hot water. Bake twentty minutes and remove leaves and serve the meat rolls with lemon slice or celery. This is delicious with French fried potatoes and mashed squash.





For whom is it? Delinquent Protestant girls. Not an orphanage. Not a home for mental defectives. Not a rescue home for adult prostitutes. Wayward girls can be reformed only when kept separate from other classes.

Who is to control the home? The Board of Temperance and Moral Reform of the Methodist church and the Board of Social Service and Evangelism of the Presbyterian church, acting through a local board of management. The Baptist church and the Church of England were invited to join but declined, at the same time wishing the movement every success. It will be a Protestant home, on broad, non-sectarian lines.

How will it be supported? Chiefly by government grants from the provinces have engaged to do this, and Newfoundland is yet to be asked. Any further amounts needed for maintenance will be provided by the churches in control. There will be no annual public appeal for running expenses.

Porter, Rev. W. F. Gaetz and Rev. G. A. Kuhring. Rev. Dr. Macmillan of Halifax, who has taken a very active interest in the movement, has expressed a willingness and desire to come to St. John if necessary, and discuss the movement.

The general committee of arrangements includes, Dr. M. E. Armstrong of Middleton; Rev. F. E. Barrett and Miss Carmichael of New Glasgow; A. M. Bell Rev. G. J. Bond, M. O. Crowell, Rev. G. W. F. Glendenning, Rev. J. W MacMillan, D. D., Rev. Anderson Rogers, Rev. R. W. Ross, and E. L. Thorne of Halifax; Rev. Dr. Smith of Fredericton and W. F. Whitman of Hantsport.

The institution when established will be supported chiefly, it is understood, by grants from the three provinces, and it is expected Newfoundland will also come into the movement. The following circular which has been issued will give the public a clear conception of what the home is to be and what it aims to accomplish.

John McKeen Has Retired After a Long and Honorable Career

The retirement of John McKeen, manager of the Bank of Nova Scotia in Halifax, is an event of great interest in the business and financial world. Mr. McKeen ranks high among the many able bankers whom Nova Scotia had produced.
