REPORT OF SESSION.

It is with feelings of pleasure and thankfulness that the Session again reports to the congregation, of which it has the privilege of taking the oversight. The work of the year has been some what interrupted by the illness and lengthened absence of the Pastor; and yet, we are thankful to say, that the congregations have been maintained, and the work of the Sunday School, Bible Class, and the different societies in connection with the congregation, has been prosecuted with comm ndable zeal and gratifying success.

The remembrance of the past mercies, however, only quickens

the desire for richer blessings in the future.

We are asked to open our mouths that He may fill them. Let us aim at the largest fulfilment, that His boundless mercies justify us in claiming. We long to see greater zeal animating ourselves and all the members, and to witness the in-gathering of many who are yet living without God and without hope.

We are the more urged to that desire by the fact that death has carried away thirteen (13) persons of different ages during the year, and many others were seriously afflicted who happily were restored to health, or are now on the way, we hope, to complete

recovery

Our sympathies go forth to the sorrowing bereaved, may the Good Shepherd lead them through affliction into a large and wealthy place. May we all be taught to number our days and apply our hearts unto wisdom.

It is very gratifying to the Session to note the fact that two more of our young men, Albert Briggs and James Duff, have gone to the Foreign Field to labor for the Master amongst the Heathen. We trust the presence of so many from our own congregation in the great Mission Fields of the world will draw forth more and more our sympathies and prayers, and that in due time others will follow in obedience to the Macedonian cry, and the Master's command.

The addition of five new members to the Session will greatly strengthen our hands, and enable us to overtake regular visitation to an extent hitherto impossible.

We trust our humble efforts in this direction will be appreciated, and that the congregation will help us in making such visitations as profitable as possible. We ask the hearty and prayerful co-operation of all in making this the most successful year in the Church's history.

Our large membership justifies such a hope.

There have been but three Communion services during the year—the regular order having been interrupted by the Pastor's absence. The fourth was postponed until January, 1891, and with the addition of members then added, the roll stands thus:—

THE MANAGERS' REPORT.

The Board of Managers in presenting this their Twelfth Annual Report, beg leave to draw the attention of the Congregation to the following Statements, showing the Receipts and Expenditure of the Church, and the several Societies in connection therewith for the year 1800.

The Board expected during the year to have been enabled to pay the sum of \$2,000 towards the reduction of the Church debt as estimated; but in this they have been disappointed, the receipts not being sufficient to warrant them in applying any sum towards that purpose. The Congregation should consider that although three years have elapsed since the new church was opened, no reduction of the debt has been effected. This is much to be regretted, but in other respects the year just closed has been a prosperous one.

It is sincerely hoped that an earnest effort will be made by the Congregation during the current year to contribute more liberally in order that the estimate of this year for the reduction

of the debt may be fully realized.

The Congregation will require to elect seven (7) members to the Board of Management to fill the vacancies caused by John Douglas, A. G. Gowanlock, James Hunter, J. W. Fenwick and C. M. Gordon retiring, their term of office having expired, and two members to fill the unexpired terms of John Winchester, and that of John Wanless, jr., whose sudden death we all so much deplore.

PARKDALE AUXILIARY OF THE W.F.M.S.

In presenting this our Fifth Annual Report while uniting in thanksgiving to our Heavenly Father, for permitting us to labor in this branch of His vineyard for still another year, we bow in humility before Him, as we record with deep regret that our membership and offerings have fallen below those of last year, while we believe this in a measure, was occasioned by sickness during the early part of the year, still we cannot but feel that affliction sent by our Heavenly Father, ought to have made us more zealous to labor for Him when health was restored.

Meetings have been held monthly. Number of members on roll, 31. Members of General Society, 12. Average attendance, 14 members and 5 visitors.

The Society is much indebted to Mr. Harris for a Reading given by him in May, for the N.W. Indian Clothing Fund, the proceeds of which amounted to \$39.10. A number of Sewing Meetings were held, and clothing, quilts, dolls, picture books and toys, valued at \$60, was provided, \$30 in cash was paid into the Supply Committee. A young lady in the Congregation also gave 47 yards of new rag carpet, valued at \$22, which was sent to the Boarding School on Muscowpeting Reserve. Total value \$112.00.

In October we held our Third Thanksgiving Meeting, the offering amounted to \$25.65. The meeting was the most interesting yet held, and has been a blessing to the Society, and we trust also to those who attended it.

Our Pastor, Mr. McKay, after his return from the Old Country, kindly gave us a lecture on his travels, speaking particularly of London. The lecture was very interesting and enjoyed by all who heard it. A collection was taken amounting to \$19.00, which is reserved for the North-West Fund for the ensuing year.

The total receipts for this year are \$230.15, being a decrease of \$9.90 from last year.
