2.30 p.m. The meeting will reassemble for hearing the retiring President's address, and afterwards the general business of the Society will be continued; adjournment at 5 p.m.

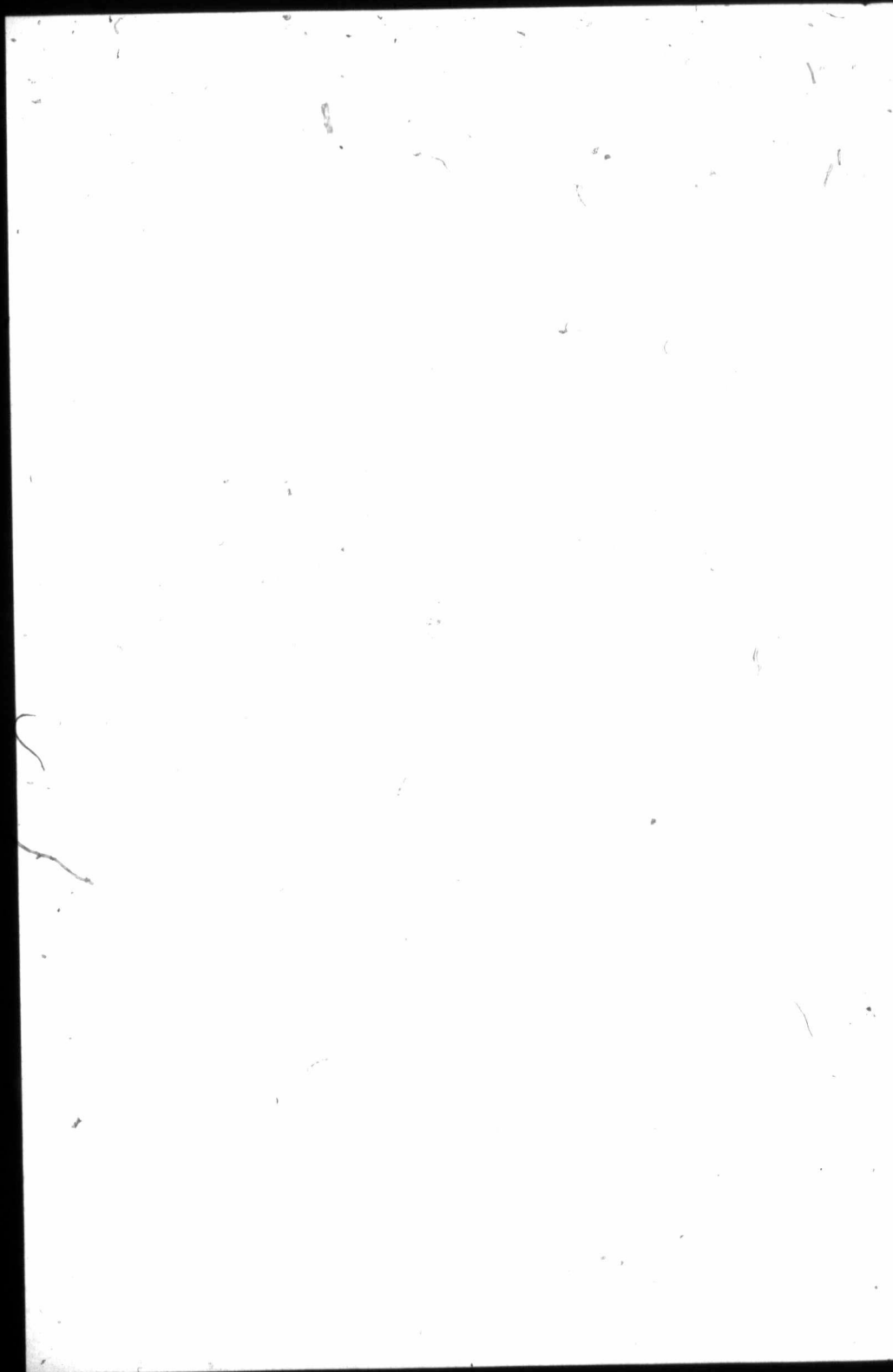
7.30 p.m. Members' Dinner in Her Majesty's Cafe, Gtr. Street.
