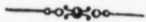

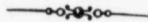

REPORT OF COUNCIL

—OF THE—

DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION,
FOR 1869.

In presenting the Second Annual Report of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association, the Council beg to submit the following observations:

In the List of Affiliated Associations for the year, the names of several Associations that were not connected with the Dominion one last year have now been added.

In 1868, amongst the subscribing Associations there was divided, through the liberality of the Government, acting through the Minister of Militia, the large sum of \$7,800, but no official notification has been received of the amount to be distributed by Government this year.

It was originally intended that the Second Annual Prize Meeting should be held at Halifax, but for reasons shewn in the Secretary's Report, it became necessary to transfer the meeting to Toronto.

The meeting extended over nine days, but the attendance was not so large as at Laprarie in 1868.

The aggregate number of entries is 1231, the details of which are shewn in the Secretary's Report. This number contrasts unfavorably with the number at Laprarie in 1868, viz: 2,076. The Council can only account for the great difference, by attributing it to the circumstances under which the meeting was held, and especially to the fact that

the Ontario Rifle Association had recently held their annual meeting at the same place, and also to the unexpected change of the place of meeting from Halifax to Toronto.

The amount distributed in Prizes was \$4,505 00, in addition to which the MACDOUGALL Challenge Cup was again contested for. His Excellency the GOVERNOR GENERAL most liberally presented a Silver Cup and Ten Sovereigns; the Adjutant General of Militia (Col. ROBERTSON Ross), \$100 and a Silver Medal; and Mr GZOWSKI, the President of the Ontario Provincial Association, \$50.

The Council would draw attention to a new feature in the Prize List, viz: "The Time Match," which was instituted for the purpose of testing the proficiency of the Volunteer Militia, competing in the Breech-Loading Snider Enfield Rifle, and in comparing the scores made in this match, it will be observed that they are fully equal to scores made in similar matches at Wimbledon, with the same description of weapon.

The Council regret that the Prize Meeting could not be brought to a conclusion upon the sixth day as originally intended. Its extension over nine days was in consequence of three days continuous rain, which most effectually put a stop to any competition being carried on, and necessarily added largely to the cost of the meeting.

The Council feel that it is a subject of great congratulation that, as at the meeting at Laprairie, so at the one at Toronto, no accident of any description occurred.

The Council beg to refer to the Treasurer's Statement, for a detailed account of the Finances of the Association, which, with the Report of the Auditors and of the Secretary, are appended to this Report.

The Council beg to acknowledge the liberality of the local subscriptions in Toronto, amounting to \$1,245, which are duly shewn in the list of subscriptions.

Twenty ranges were prepared in Toronto, as compared with twelve at Laprairie, and the cost of the meeting at Toronto was \$2,818 95, whilst that at Laprairie was \$3661. The detail of the arrangements at Toronto are given in the Report of the Committee appointed for that purpose, and will be found in the Appendix.

The Council congratulate the Association upon the improved efficiency of the Canadian Volunteers as marksmen, whose scores may fairly challenge comparison with scores made at Wimbledon.

It is much to be regretted that the Maritime Provinces were nearly unrepresented at the meeting, there being but a single competitor from New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, the Provincial Prize was therefore contested by Ontario and Quebec, and was won by the former Province.

The Council hope that the next Annual Prize Meeting may be held in one or other of the Maritime Provinces, where they have every reason to expect that it will be fully supported by a large attendance of competitors from the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec, as well as those of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

The Council refer most gratefully, to the liberal support awarded to the Association by the Government of the Dominion, through the Honorable the Minister of Militia and Defence, to whom they earnestly appeal for a continuation of the liberal policy which has resulted so favorably in the improvement of our defensive force in the use of the weapon. The Council begs also gratefully to acknowledge the support received from His Excellency the Governor General, the Adjutant General of Militia, the President of the Ontario Provincial Association, and others.

The meeting was opened by Mrs. HOWLAND, who fired the first shot; His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario, with Major General STISTED, the Commandant,

and Officers of the Garrison, together with a large number of ladies and gentlemen, friends of those competing, being present at the opening, as well as on the subsequent days, watched the proceedings with evident interest. The meeting was also attended by Colonel ROBERTSON ROSS, the Adjutant General of Militia, whose presence afforded both gratification and encouragement to the Volunteers present.

The Council refer with deep regret to the death of the late Lt.-General Sir C. WINDHAM, and they feel that the Association will join with them in fully acknowledging the support which he afforded to the Association and the Volunteers in general, and the interest he took in all their proceedings.

The Secretary's Report, together with a list of the matches, detail of scores, etc., is herewith appended.

The Council tender their thanks to Lt.-Col. MACPHERSON, for the performance of his duties as Treasurer, etc., and to the Secretary, Lt.-Col. STUART, for his indefatigable services as Secretary.



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REPORT OF THE SECRETARY
OF THE
Dominion of Canada Rifle Association.

At the General Meeting of the Association, held at Ottawa, upon the 6th May, 1869, it having been decided that a Prize Meeting should be held during the Autumn of that year, it was unanimously agreed that it should take place at Halifax, and a programme of prizes was accordingly drawn up, based upon the understanding that Halifax was to be the place at which the meeting was to take place.

After considerable correspondence had taken place with persons at Halifax, interested in the success of the meeting, it was found that there were difficulties in the way of the meeting being held at Halifax, and, therefore, it was agreed that Toronto would be the next most desirable locality at which it should be held.

It was then fixed that the Annual Prize Meeting for 1869 should take place at Toronto, upon the 6th September, and a revised list of prizes was drawn up, published and distributed.

The Government, through the Honorable The Minister of Militia and Defence, again authorized a grant of \$5,000 in aid of the funds of the Association; and His Excellency the Governor General Sir JOHN YOUNG, signified his intention of offering a prize to be competed for at the same meeting, which consisted of a Silver Cup with Ten Sovereigns added.

The MACDOUGALL Challenge Cup, valued at \$200, was again contended for, upon the same conditions as in the year 1868, and the winner this year was Gunner RUSSELL, Toronto Gar. Artillery.

The Adjutant General of Militia, Colonel ROBERTSON Ross, also presented a prize of \$100, with a Silver Medal, and the list of prizes was also most liberally augmented with an additional prize by Mr. Gzowski, of the amount of \$50.00.

Very considerable additions and alterations were made to the butts and ranges upon the Common at Toronto, with a view of affording all the necessary facilities for conducting a large meeting with expedition and success.

It was a matter of much regret that the attendance at this meeting fell considerably below that of the year previous, and moreover that from a variety of circumstances, representatives from the Provinces of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia were, with one exception, unable to attend.

A Camp was formed upon the Garrison Common, close to the ranges, but the very heavy rain which continued for three days and nights, prevented the competitors from taking

advantage of the camp, and they consequently resided during the meeting in the City of Toronto.

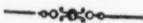

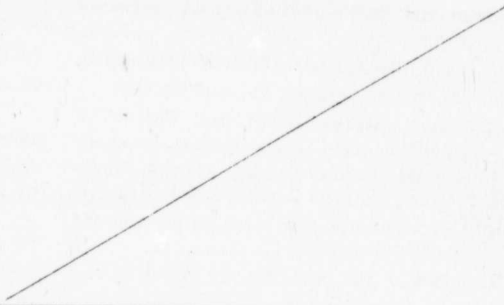

RULES.

- 1.—That this Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."
- 2.—Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00 per annum shall become a Member of the Association.
- 3.—Donors of \$40.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a Prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association.
- 4.—Any Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$40.00 annually to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships in the proportion of one to every Dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such Memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association, to be registered by him one month previous to the Match.
- 5.—There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council.
The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
- 6.—There shall be a President.
- 7.—There shall be Vice-Presidents.
- 8.—There shall be a Council of Forty-two Members, who shall be elected in the following proportions:
Sixteen, [16] from Ontario.
Twelve, [12] " Quebec.
Seven, [7] " New Brunswick.
Seven, [7] " Nova Scotia.
of whom four shall form a quorum, and who shall be elected, primarily by the delegates now assembled at Ottawa, and hereafter at the Annual Meeting,—and the General Meetings of the Council shall be held at the Capital of the Dominion.
- 9.—The Council shall choose from the members elected the President of the Association.

- 10.—There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, selected from among the Members of the Association, and who shall be elected by the Council.
- 11.—The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with this Association, and the Militia Staff-Officers in charge of the several Militia Districts of the Dominion, being members thereof, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.
- 12.—There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a paid Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.
- 13.—The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting,—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.
- 14.—The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such By-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them;—no By-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.
- 15.—The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held alternately in the several Provinces of the Dominion, at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.
- 16.—The Prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such Regulations as may be passed by the Council from time to time.
- 17.—An Annual Report, embracing the audited account of the Finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the Prize Meeting as may be found practicable.
- 18.—There shall be an Annual Meeting, to be held at such time as shall be selected by the Council.

BY - L A W S .

- Annual Meeting.** The Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held at Ottawa on the Third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of the Parliament of the Dominion.
- Meetings of Council.** There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council. The first of which shall be held on the day after the Annual Meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.
- Extraordinary Meetings.** Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary if required by any six of the members of the Council,—notification being sent to each member of Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting,—and the requisition for the Meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meeting.
- The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings.** The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary,—and open to the inspection of any members of the Council.
- Finance Committee.** There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.
- Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Bank.** The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.
- Expenditure of sums for current expenses.** All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or in his absence by some member of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.
- Expenditures of a general nature.** Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.
- Annual accounts.** A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditure shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

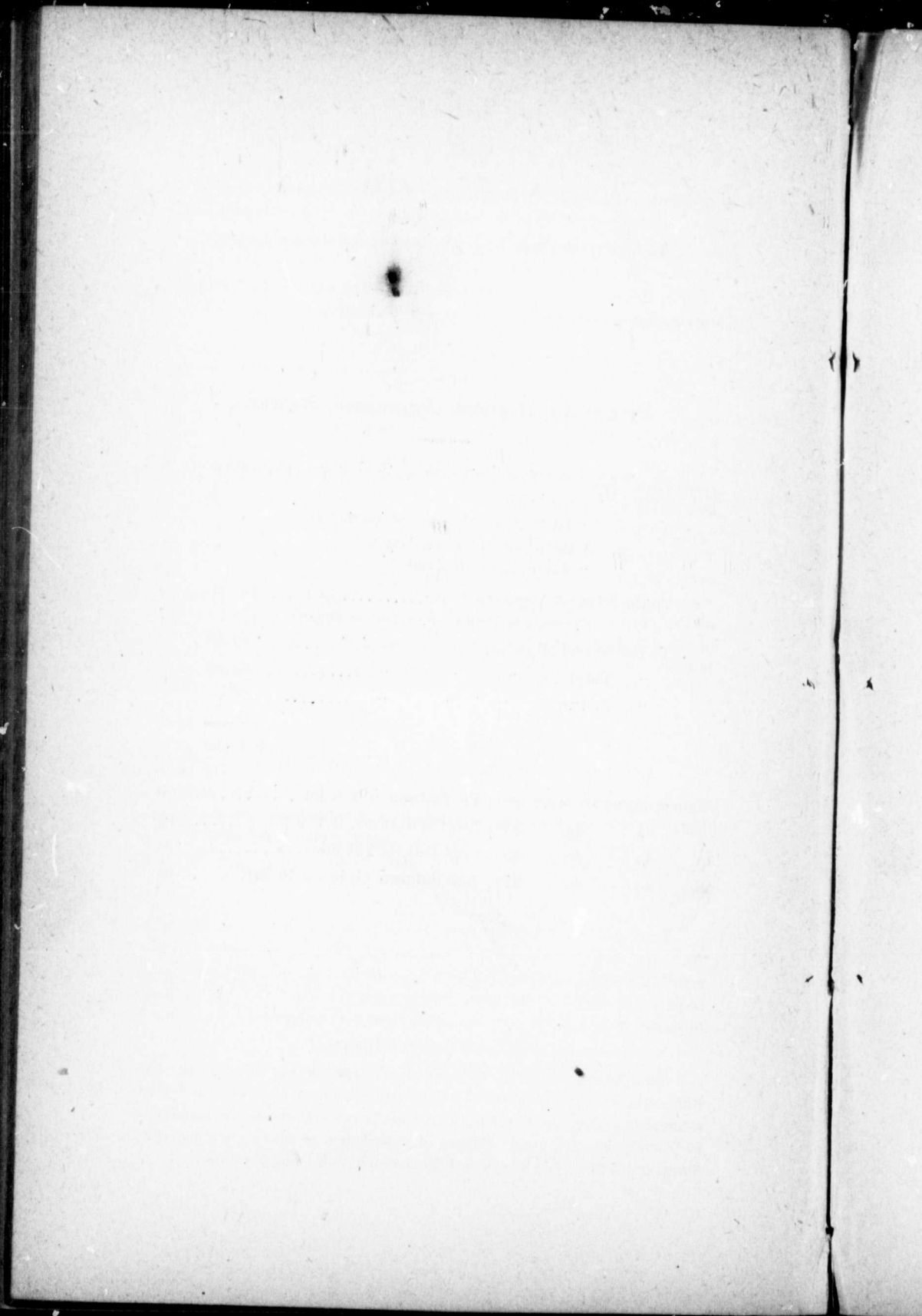

Report of the Committee of Arrangements.

The Committee of Arrangements for the Matches of the Dominion Rifle Association beg leave to report :—

BUTTS AND RANGES.

That your Committee having carefully examined and tested practically the systems of marking, and of protecting the marker, and finding all more or less objectionable, requested the Chairman and Secretary to take measures for ascertaining the best system, and to erect such Butts as might be necessary for testing such system. This having been done, and the system of Sunken Butts favorably reported on, your Committee have authorized the erection of Ten Butts on that system, which, with Ten upon the Hill system, will furnish Twenty Ranges for the ensuing Match. The requisite number of Discs and marking apparatus having been procured, and glass furnished through the kindness of the Ontario Rifle Association, your Committee found it only necessary to go to small expense on this matter. The outlay necessary on the Ranges to increase the height of the Firing Abutments has been trifling also. The estimated cost of finishing the Twenty Ranges will be as follows :

Ten Butts on sunken system.....	\$365 00
Ten Butts on hill system.....	300 00
Running Man Target and Time Targets.....	250 00

Making a total of..... \$915 00

*As a considerable amount of this money has been expended upon the Dominion Government Ranges, your Committee would urge upon your Council the advisability of obtaining from the Government at least a portion of the money, to reimburse them for the permanent work upon their property.

MARKERS, &c.

Your Committee beg to report that through the kindness of Sir CHAS. WYNDHAM, K.C.B., Lt.-General Commanding, and of the Officers commanding in this garrison, they have been enabled to obtain the services of trained and efficient Markers. Fatigue Parties have also kindly been furnished for the erection of tents and other necessary works.

SQUAD COMMANDERS.

Your Committee beg leave to report that having experienced the difficulties and delays caused by the employment of incompetent Squad Commanders, they have requested Lt.-Col. BOUTON to obtain the assistance of Twenty-five Volunteer Officers of experience to act in such capacity. These gentlemen will be allowed their expenses during the Match.

VOLUNTEERS' CAMP.

Your Committee beg to report, that through the kindness of the Military and Militia Authorities, an ample supply of Marquees and Tents have been provided for the use of the Volunteers in Camp,—for whom also a supply of Blankets have been obtained. Lt.-Col. DURIE, D. A. G., 2nd Mil. Dis't, Ontario, has kindly consented to take command of the Camp, and Capt. PEBLES, District Quarter-Master, has consented to act as Camp Quarter-Master. The ADJUTANT GENERAL has authorized Lt.-Col. DURIE to turn out a Volunteer Company Officer and 40 men to work gun,—also, 2 mounted Orderlies. Through the latter gentleman a supply of Straw has been obtained, which can be retailed out to those who desire it at the rate of 5 cents per bundle.

REFRESHMENTS.

Your Committee beg leave to report, that they have accepted the tender of Mr. JOHN SPENCE for Refreshments,—he paying the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars for the exclusive privilege of retailing Refreshments on the ground. He has agreed to furnish a good meal at the Ordinary for twenty-five cents per head,—while a Mess will be provided for the Officers of the Association, and others who may desire it, at higher rates, and in a better style.

POLICE REGULATIONS.

Your Committee beg leave to report that they have placed a Squad of Police under the charge of Sergeant-Major QUINN, 10th Royals, who will look after the discipline of the Camp and Ranges, keep watch at night in case of fire, and act as Orderlies during the day. Two Policemen have

also been kindly furnished by the Chief of City Police, who will remove all disorderly persons from the ground.

TARGETS, &c.

Your Committee beg leave to report that every facility has been afforded them by the Military Authorities in the exclusive use of Ranges, the supply of Targets, Benches and Barrack Tables, Marquees, &c., with all other aid that it has been in their power to afford during the whole of the preparations.

PROGRAMME.

Your Committee beg leave to report that Messrs. Copp, Clark & Co. have published a programme—authorized by the Council—and have furnished two hundred copies gratis for the use of the Council; the remainder being sold to the competitors at the rate of ten cents per copy. This Programme embodies all necessary information relative to the Matches.

EXPENDITURE.

Your Committee regret that owing to delays in the arrival of the Targets, &c., they are not enabled to give a detailed account of the Expenditure necessary to complete the preliminary arrangements. The amount is estimated, however, at \$1262.00; and your Committee trust that, with due economy, they will be enabled to keep within that amount.
