At the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at HALIFAX, on the fifth Day of December 1785, and in the Twenty Sixth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. Being the first Session of the Sixth General Affembly convened in the faid Province.

# CAP.

AN ACT to encourage and extend the export of Fish, Lumber and other Produce of this Province to the West Indies, and also to revive, alter and continue the several Laws relating to the Duties of Impost on Beer, Rum and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, which Laws expired the Thirty First Day of December, 1784.

MANN HERE AS the West India Trade of this Province has been Presentle greatly extended, and other great benefits have arisen from the W several Laws relating to the Duties of Impost on Beer, Rum and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, which Laws expired on XXXX the Thirty First Day of December, which was in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty four.

I. Be it therefore Enasted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the Thirty First Day of December next, An Act passed in the Eighth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled An AE to explain, amend and reduce into one Ast, the several Laws now in Force, relating to the Duties of Impost on Beer, Rum and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, together with the several Acts made in Amendment thereof in the 10th, 12th, 13th, 15th, 18th, 19th, 21st, and 22d Years of his Present Majesty's Reign, as also An Act passed in the Fifteenth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled An Ast for granting to bis Majesty an Excise on Melasses and Brown Sugar, Sold within or brought into this Province, and for the more effectually improving and extending the Trade

An Act to expleis amend & reduce into one Act the feveral Laws relating to the Duties of Impost on Rum, &c. &c. Together with the several Acts made in smendment there-

Asalfo an Act for granting his Maje-thy an Excise on Melaffes and Brown Sugar.

And for the more effectually improving and extending the Trade of this Colony to the West Indies, revived.

Trade of this Colony to the West Indies, shall be Revived, and the same and every part thereof, not altered or changed in or by this present Act, shall stand revived, and be in full force and virtue throughout this Province in as sull and ample a Manner as the same was heretofore.

And whereas the Duties imposed by said Laws on Melasses, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors have been found to high, for Remedy whereof.

II. Be it Enasted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the Thirty First Day of this present Month of December, all Melasses, Rum and other distilled Spirituous Liquors imported into this Province, which shall be subject to the several Duties of Impost, and Excise laid thereon by the several Laws revived by this Act, shall in lieu of the Ten Pence per Gallon heretofore thereby imposed on Rum and Spirits, pay only the Sum of Three Pence per Gallon, and Melasses in lieu of the five Pence heretofore by said Laws imposed thereon, shall pay in suture only Three half Pence per Gallon in virtue of this Act, which Duties of three Pence on Rum and three half Pence on Melasses, are to be paid and collected in the Manner and Form, and liable to the several Penalties and Forseitures mentioned and expressed in the several Laws herein before revived.

And whereas several Frauds have been committed with respect to the exempting of Rum, Sugar, and Melasses from the Duties imposed thereon by said Laws.

III. Be it further Enatted, That no Rum, Sugar or Melasses shall in suture be exempted by Reason of the same being purchased with the Produce of this Province from paying the Duties laid thereon by this and the said revived Acts, unless such Rum, Sugar or Melasses shall be immediately imported in the same Vessel, in which the Produce wherewith the same was purchased, was exported.

IV. Provided nevertbeles, That if any vessel on her outward bound Voyage should be sold or any other Cause should happen whereby the Vessel or Vessels, of a resident Inhabitant of this Province may be prevented from returning back with the Rum, Sugar or Melasses so purchased, upon the Master or Owner of said Vessel producing, and delivering to the Collectors of Impost and Excise authentic Certificates signed by the principal Officer of the Customs for the Port wherein such outward bound Cargo shall be disposed off, and two of the principal Merchants at such Port; setting forth therein the Causes which prevented such Vessel or Vessels, from returning with the Homeward bound Cargo. That then it shall and may be lawful, for the Collectors of the Impost and Excise, upon the several other Proofs required

Impost and Excise Duties on.

Rum and Spirits 3d per Gallon in lieu of 101 before granted

Melaffes 1½ d pergallon in lieu of 5d. To be paid and collected as before and liable to the fame penalties and forfeitures.

Setting forth the Caules

by Law being made, to exempt fuch Rum, Sugar or Melasses, from said Duty; any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding *Provided*, That the Rum, Sugar or Melasses so to be exempted shall be imported into this Province in three Months after the Date of such Certificate.

V. And be it further Enacted, That before any Rum, Sugar or Melasses, imported into this Province, shall be exempted from paying the said Impost Duty, the Owner or Person entering the same shall make and subscribe the following Affidavit viz.

VI. And be it further Enasted, That the Monies arising by Virtue of this Act shall be paid into the Treasury, and shall be applied to the Support of his Majesty's Government in this Province, notwithstanding any thing herein or in the said revived Laws contained to the contrary.

VII. And be it further Enasted, That the several Laws herein before expressed and revived, and every Matter and Thing therein contained, which is not herein or hereby changed or altered, together with this Act, shall be and continue, and the same are hereby continued in full Force and Virtue until the First Day of January, which will be in the Year of Our Lord One Thousand seven Hundred and Eighty Seven.

VIII. Provided always nevertheless, That nothing contained in this Act or the several Acts hereby revived, shall extend or be construed to extend to the collecting of any Duty imposed by this Law on any part of the Cargo from the West Indies, two Thirds of which shall be purchased with the Produce of this Province, and be it also further Provided, That if any Person or Persons British Subjects bringing the Produce of the West Indies to this Province, and on which Produce the several Duties imposed by this Law shall have been paid or secured, shall in Six Months, after such Importation shall be made, export the Produce of this Province in the Bottom or Vessel, in which such Im-

#### CAP. III.

An ACT in Addition to an amendment of an Act for establishing and regulating Ferries.

"HEREAS the Settlement of Lands at Dartmouth, Preston, and other places on the Eastern Side of the Harbour of Halifax, promisses to be of great public Utility, and whereas a number of Loyalists with their Families and disbanded Soldiers have already taken up their Lands there, and are frequently
obliged to come to Halifax on necessary Occasions with Vegetables
to exchange for other Necessaries of Life, which their Lands do not
as yet furnish them with, and have not the Means of paying their
Ferriage.

Preamble.

For Remedy whereof, and encouraging Settlement of the aforesaid Lands.

I. Be it enalled by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the First Day of January, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty Six, His Majesty's Justices in their General or Special Sessions of the Peace for the County of Halifax, shall be, and are hereby authorised and impowered to establish a Ferry between Halifax and Dartmouth, and to contract with a fit Person or Persons to undertake the Management of the same.

Court of Sessions to establish a Ferry between Halisax and Dartmouth.

II. Be it also Enatted, That such Undertaker shall provide two or more staunch and sufficient Boats capable of carrying Twelve Persons including the Ferrymen, and that two careful able Men shall attend each Boat, which Boats shall constantly ply between the King's Slip in Halifax and Creighton's Wharf at Darmouth, or such other convenient Place on the Dartmouth side as the Justices of the Sessions may see sit to order, from Sun-rise to Sun-set each and every Day in the Week.

Undertaker to provide two or more Boats to ply from Sunrife to Sun fecting.

III. Be it further Enasted, That two Days in the Week, viz. Wednesdays and Saturdays the Ferry shall be free to all such Persons coming or going with Vegetables and Provisions to and from the Market, who shall have obtained from the Justices of the Quarter Sessions a Certificate or Certificates, that he, she, or they are entitled to such Privilege.

Ferry free Wednefdays and Saturdays for such who the Justices may think entitled to such privilege.

IV. And be it further Enacted, That the expence incurred by this Act for making the Ferriage free two Days in the Week, shall be paid out of the public Treasury, and the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief of the Province, is hereby impowered to grant a warrant for the same for any Sum or Sums not exceeding Sixty Pounds, upon Certificate being produced from His Majesty's

V. And be it further Enasted, That this Act shall continue and be in force, One Year and no longer.

And be it further Enacted by the authority aforesaid, That all Debts, Dues, Penalties or Forseitures which have at any Time become due, or been incurred by Virtue of said recited Acts or either of them, shall and may be received, sued for, levied, collected and recovered at any Time during the period for which the said Acts are hereby continued in manner and form therein respectively prescribed and directed, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.
