The Red River Road—A New Idea.—The Australians have fought a successful battle against transportation. Mr. Cardwell has yielded to the pressure which had been brought to bear upon him, and he will, early in the ensuing session, endeavor to obtain the sanction of Parliament to a scheme for the complete abandonment of our penal set tlements in Austra. It is much to the credit of the colonists that they have made up their minds to prevent the influx of English criminals into regions which ought to be held sacred to honest labor. Meanwhile, the question still remains, What are we to do with our convicts? A writer in the Star strongly urges that some thousands of them should be employed in the construction of a road between Canada and the Red River Settlement. This is a suggestion which is likely to meet with favorable consideration on the part of our Government, if Canada has no objection to urge. Some expression of opinion on your part would throw considerable light upon the expediency of the measure. It seems to me that for some years to come the Imperial Government might usefully employ the convict labor at its disposal in constructing roads in the Hudson's Bay Territories. While on this subject, let me add that the Company's servants are greatly dissatisfed with their financial position under the new arrangements, and that many mutterings of their discontent have reached head quarters in London.—[London Correspondence of Toronto Globe.
