The Methodist Conference.
BRIEF SYNOPSIS OF THE PROCEEDINGS AT GRAND BANK.
 The S.S. Glencoe arrived at Grand Bank with the Ministers and delegates to the Methodist Conference on July 1st, and were received at the pier by the loyal and appreciable people of the town. Two Canadian visitors, Rev. Dr. Wright of Mount Allison Ladies College and Rev. R. J. D. Simpson, Secretary-Treasurer of the Superannuation Fund, by request, addressed the Ministers and laymen on board the Glencoe at Argentin and did not proceed to Grand Bank. Doctor Hingle presented the advantages of the new site at Mount Allison. Through information received from the conference last year in America there was no church on this continent making so much provision for the veteran ministers as the Canadian Methodist Church.
 The Ministerial Session of the Conference opened at 9 a.m. July 1st, when Rev. Dr. Fenwick, the President, presided in the evening at 8 o'clock in a evangelistic meeting under the patronage of Rev. Edwin Moore's chairmanship of Rev. R. G. Joyce, an audience which filled the large and commodious building listened to very great and inspiring addresses from Rev. B. Mallette and Rev. G. Joyce. The Annual Conference opened its Feast was held in the Hall at 11 o'clock on Sunday the newly elected President, Rev. W. J. Morris, had the pulpit with him. Rev. G. Joyce led in prayer and Rev. G. Goodwin, Field Secretary of Evangelical Social Service, who has been a very thoughtful and impressive sermon on the text "The Law came by Moses, Grace and Truth came by Jesus Christ."
 The Sunday School Rally Services the afternoon with all the Sunday school scholars of the town gathered in large numbers and seated in the pews of the Church is not to be forgotten. The first speaker, O. Jackson, the Conference Sunday School Secretary, spoke of the interest and leading part taken by the school in the systematic training of the teacher studies. Rev. Mr. Jackson emphasized the urgency of training and informed teachers for the work of the Church as well as showing how other Churches in Canada and America are giving more attention to the training of religious leadership both for the Sunday School and the day school and playground.
 Rev. Arthur Mews, C.M.G., followed with an illustrated talk. The children were interested from beginning to the finish of a thirty minute address which the speaker with a little red and attractive boat drew lessons and likened the building of life into the construction of the boat.
 The large Church for the Sunday evening service was filled again by the Grand Bank people, always regular attendants at all church services. Rev. D. D. Chown, the General Superintendent of the Methodist Church of Canada, was the preacher and Rev. Reynolds White, B.A., and Rev. Roland E. Moore's candidates for ordination. The charge was masterly and scholarly and in the style characteristic of that personality so universally revered and esteemed by all the people of Canada.
 Professor Gifford, Ph. D., of Wesleyan Theological College, Montreal, left a lasting impression by the thought of his four lectures on "The Kingdom of God." Their influence cannot be measured as the inspiration of them from him direct to the

men going forth with a clearer understanding and an entirely new look into the mind of the Master.
 Rev. Mr. Goodwin of the Department of Evangelism and Social Service, with his impressive speech and pleasing personality, placed the problems confronting the spiritual and social life of the Church in a manner that awakens all to the necessity of the leadership of the Church in this day and stimulates encouragement for all through his faith in the ability of the Church to triumph.
 The W.M.S. delegation was presented to the Conference and received by Rev. Dr. Chown and President Morris. Mrs. (Rev.) House read the report in the absence of Mrs. Lindsay, the President, and made mention that Miss Harris, daughter of Rev. Harris of our Conference, had, during the past year finished her probation and gone to China, and that Miss House, daughter of Rev. and Mrs. House, was preparing and hoped to leave within two years for the foreign field. The W.M.S. is doing yeoman service for the Missionary cause of the Church and received a greater ambition for more service through the recent visit of Mrs. Laval, the Canadian, President, at Gower Street. The unusual large attendance of ladies caused the General Superintendent to remark that it was the largest backing he had seen any delegation to have. The Conference passed a resolution memorializing the Government to nationalize the second Monday in November as Thanksgiving Day.
 The Board of Governors of the Methodist College was elected and consisted of twenty five Ministers and twenty Laymen. Charles P. Ayre, Esq., was elected President and John Leamon, Esq., Secretary. Joseph Peters, Treasurer.
 The following were elected as delegates to the General Conference which meets at Toronto in September: Revs. W. J. Morris, L. Curtis, D.D., Extra Broughton, E. C. French, H. C. Coffin, S. Bennett; Reserves, Rev. M. Fenwick, D.D., T. B. Darby, M.A., Laymen, W. H. Peters, John Leamon, A. Vatcher, L. B. Clarke, A. Soper, H. N. Burt; Reserves, A. G. Hudson, A. Mews, C.M.G.
 Rev. W. J. Morris was elected the beneficiary to the Macpherson bequest, which finances a trip to Palestine.
 The laymen of the Conference offered to publish the Minutes of Conference and assume all the financial obligations.
 A resolution welcoming a unification of our day-school system was passed by the Conference.
 The Conference approved sympathetically any plans of University federations of Maritime Universities that would tend to increase the efficiency of educational institutions concerned.
 Rev. R. H. Mercer was elected Business Manager of the Methodist Greeting and Rev. J. G. Joyce Assistant Editor.
 The Ministerial and Lay delegates of the Conference were entertained at a banquet in Fraser Hall, Wednesday evening by the ladies of the town in their own delightful and charming style.
 Conference meets next year at the Gower Street Church, this city.

 LONDON—Thousands of actors and actresses in England are out of work. In their efforts to keep the wolf from the door, men and women of the histrionic art have accepted small parts in cinema productions. An endeavor is being made to relieve the situation by the formation of a kind of co-operative theatrical company for the benefit of the working actors and actresses. Those taking part receive \$15 a week. "East Lynne" was the first play given, but after a four-weeks' season it was found that the company had lost \$250, after paying artists' salaries, so the venture went on the shoals.

Bisley Rifle Meet.
SHOOTING CONTESTS OPENED YESTERDAY.
LONDON, July 10. (By Canadian Press.)—The fifty-ninth annual meeting of the National Rifle Association opened at Bisley Camp to-day, and continues until Saturday, July 22nd when the final stage of the King's Prize will be shot off, the victor crowned, the grand aggregate decided and the prizes distributed. The program for this year's meeting at Bisley shows a determined effort to attract more competition, particularly from those of the younger generation. The most notable innovation is the two days' match for tyros, for which prizes amounting to £280, exclusive of cups, will be awarded. The definition of a tyro is given as "any British competitor who has never won a prize exceeding £1 in value at any National Rifle Association meeting, or any National, Dominion or State Rifle Association meeting. The Service arm will be used in tyro events. The prize lists for the meeting generally have been lengthened and equalized and entrance fees in many instances have been reduced. The principal events will also be more evenly distributed throughout the program than has been the case heretofore. The total prizes for the meeting will amount to over £7,000, of which the King's Prize with its 400 prizes accounts for £1,170. The prizes and rights used this year in Service Rifle ("S.R.") competitions are the same as those permitted last year, but in future the long rifle (Lee-Enfield and Lee-Enfield) will not be allowed. There are no alterations in the conditions under which the King's Prize will be conducted, but in some of the other competitions the number of rounds at each range has been reduced and a sighting shot will be allowed. In International Service Rifle team matches, all teams must fire with the same pattern of rifle.
THE KING'S PRIZE.
Target shooting in England came into prominence with the formation of the Volunteer Force in 1859 and received a great impetus through the inauguration of the "National Rifle Association" in 1859. This institution, established for the encouragement of rifle corps and the promotion of rifle shooting throughout Great Britain, opened a new and important era in the history and development of the rifle. The first meeting of the N.R.A. was held at Wimbledon in 1860, when Queen Victoria, shooting from the 400 yard mark, fired the first shot, scoring a bullseye. It is thus that the Queen's Prize or the King's Prize, as it is known, got its beginning, and this prize is the highest distinction to which a rifle shot can obtain. The competition is one of three stages, and is open to only past or present members of his Majesty's forces. The first and second stages eliminate all but the best 100 competitors. The N.R.A. bronze medal is awarded the highest scorer of the three hundred who compete in the second stage, while the King's Prize of £250 and the N.R.A. gold medal and gold badge go to the winner of the third stage. Seventy-one shots in all are fired by competitors who go thru all these stages. Distances range from 200 yards in the first stage, to 900 and 1,000 yards in the final stage.
The chief event of the opening day is the first stage of the Queen Mary's Prize, a squadded competition open only to past and present members of His Majesty's forces. Unlike the King's Prize, conditions of this competition are designed to conform as nearly as possible to actual war conditions. Monday's first stage consists of ten shots at 200 yards, snaphooting at disappearing targets, which reappear at irregular intervals spread over a total period of ten minutes. This is followed by five rapid fire shots at 300 yards total time being allowed is 25 seconds. The next stage is the "fire with movement." This consists of 60 shots, ranging down from 500 to 100 yards, the men advancing and firing two shots at each hundred yard range at disappearing target. The position at the 500 and 400 yards mark will be prone, at the 300 and 200 yards kneeling, and at the 100 yards, standing. The final stage, on Tuesday, is the "deliberate" and consists of five shots at the 600 yard mark. In connection with the Queen Mary Prize is decided the winner of the Canada Challenge Shield. This shield, purchased in 1918 out of a sum of money provided by the Dominion of Canada, is awarded to the team of five making the highest aggregate in the Queen Mary competition.
JUVENILE EVENTS.
On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of the first week are several events for public school boys, including the Gala and Polden, the Daily Graphic medals, the snaphooting match for a challenge trophy, the Ashburton Challenge Shield, open to teams of eight from the British Public Schools, ten shots at 200 to 500 yards, with the Spencer Cup awarded to the highest individual score awarded to the highest aggregate in the Ashburton. On Thursday and Friday is the full range tyro's meeting. This includes squadded competitions at 200, 500, 600 and 800 yards, making a total of six squadded shots and an aggregate. The Graphic and Wimbledon Cup, for all comers, will be shot off on the closing day of the first week. Canadians have set great store in the

Republicans are strengthening positions in the southwest and are hampering rail movements of Free State forces. It is believed that Cork or Limerick will be the scene of the Republican's final stand, while surrender without fighting is thought possible.
ANXIETY PREVAILS.
LONDON, July 11. Anxiety prevails in India regarding the whereabouts of Brigadier General Charles G. Bruce, leader of the Mount Everest Expedition. According to the Daily Mail's correspondent at Calcutta it is believed possible that he is making a further attempt to scale the peak.
WHERE FINANCE COUNTS.
LONDON, July 11. Great Britain and France are in close communication concerning the German financial situation and reparations. Premier Poincare is said to be coming to London for a conference with Lloyd George. The whole question came before the British cabinet meeting to-day.

Crew Paid Off.
PORTIA WILL LIE UP FOR SUMMER.
The crew of S.S. Portia will be paid off to-morrow, and the ship will remain in port until September when she will probably go to the Labrador to bring back crews. This action of the Shipping Department is causing much adverse comment on the street, and protests are bound to come in from the West Coast. At a time when labour is plentiful and no work goes much surplus' is expressed that the Shipping Department should turn 33 men out on the street. The city trade also has a growl and it is a big one. The Portia was built for the West Coast service, and she has plied on that route for many years. Now, without satisfactory freight service from St. John's, the West Coast merchants may turn to Canada for their requirements. It is difficult to believe that the Minister of Shipping decided to lay the Portia up on his own initiative, but whoever is responsible must be shown the error of his ways.

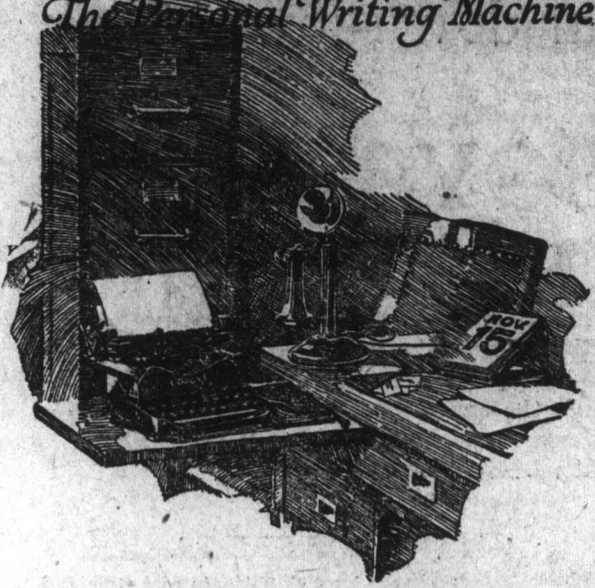

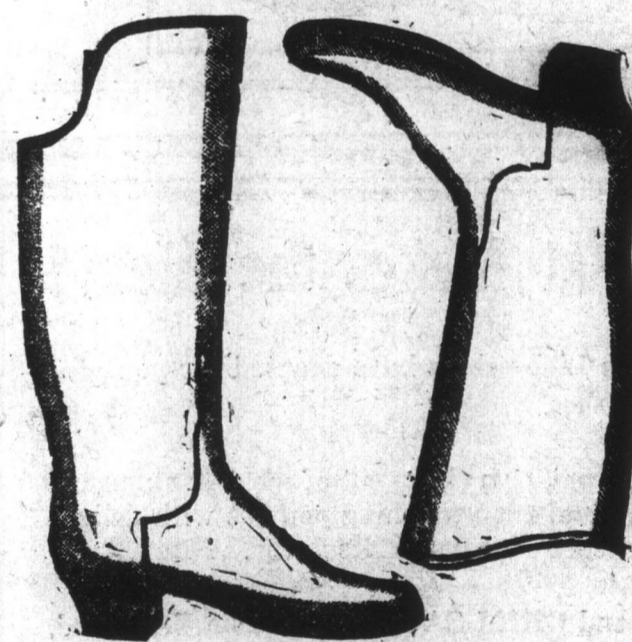
