

THE GRAND TRUNK.

General Manager Seagraves Expresses His Views—The United States Largely Benefited by the G.T.R.

MONTREAL, Jan. 3.—Mr. L. J. Seagraves, the general manager of the Grand Trunk Railway Company, has given his views in regard to the proposed extension of the Grand Trunk line to the American States, as reported by the Hon. the Minister of Railways in his speech last night.

At the meeting held at a week ago Mr. Seagraves was asked a question which he has now answered in the following statement: "I don't feel disposed to accept of an increase in the staff of the Grand Trunk, but I do feel disposed to accept of an increase in the staff of the United States."

MONMOUTH RACE TRACK OFFICIALS MAY BE INDICTED.

A Strong Charge Against Betting in Monmouth... Mr. Johnson's Office of \$5000 for Records... The Racing Board at the City-General Sporting News and Cassin.

FATHERS N.J. Jan. 4.—Justice Beasley at the opening of the January term of the Monmouth County Court yesterday delivered a severe charge on the grand jury, bearing principally on the race track question. He said in substance:

Of course, I do not suppose you will need to do your duty, but it seems to me, if the evidence that I speak of is presented to you, the case will be before you with an opinion, and with but one option, and that is an indictment, or indictments, or perjury. I cannot be mistaken about that. If these things were done in the light of fact and the laws of your State were openly broken, gentlemen, the people of this country have a right to expect that the people of the State have a right to feel indignant that such a thing can be done in our midst.
