CABLES ON WHEAT DEPRESSED AND CHICAGO WEAK.

Railroad Stocks More Active and Weak in Wall Street—Falling in Local Stocks—Unsettled—Large Decrease in World's Supply of Wheat—Cotton Markets Dull.

Tuesday, Toronto, May 15. The bears had the upper hand today in all markets and created a very unprofitable feeling.

Canadian Pacific closed 1/2 higher in London today at 52 1/2.

Cornals are firmer, closing at 100-110 for money and at 100 1/2 for account.

The London gold rate of England on balance today was £246.00.

The world's visible supply of wheat decreased 4,200,000 bushels the past week. Brazil exports a decrease of 2,000,000 bushels in the United States and Canada.

The gold in the United Treasury is down to \$98,000,000.

The amount of wheat on passage to Europe is 43,340,000 bushels, an increase of 392,000 for the week. A year ago the amount was 41,421,000 bushels.

Corn afloat to Europe amounts to 2,900,000 bushels, a decrease of 404,000 bushels for the week.

The shipments of wheat from India last week were 130,000 bushels, a decrease of 40,000 bushels.

Wheat made another record today. The highest price for that option. Exporters say that Chicago and Ontario prices will have to go 2 1/2 to 3 cents lower, or else British prices will have to advance correspondingly before a profitable export trade can be done.
