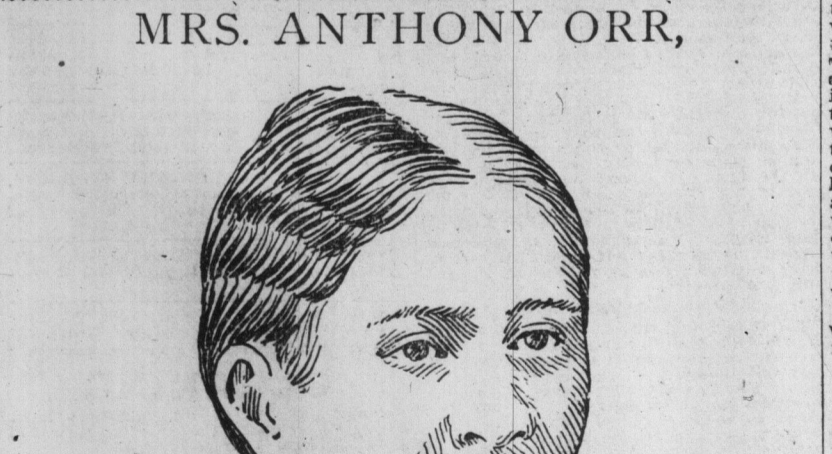

THE STRIKING COAL MINERS

There Will Be About 150 Suits for Wages.

MUCH TALK OF EVICTIONS.

Miners at Simmons' Creek and Logan Have Gone Out.

Matters at the Lehigh and Wilkes-Barre Collieries Growing Serious—Twenty-Five Hundred Miners Join the Drivers, and the Locality is Excited—Police With Winchester Arms on Hand to Guard the Collieries—Judge Jackson's Orders Issued at Charleston, W. Va.—Open Rebellion at Sandy Creek.

Pittsburg, Pa., Aug. 16.—There were no evictions up to noon, but it was reported that a number will be made before the close of the day. The threatened suits against the New York & Cleveland Company for retaining the wages of their striking miners have been commenced. It is anticipated that about 150 suits will result. Each will be for salaries ranging from \$15 to \$20, which represents two weeks' pay.

Matters Growing Serious.

Hazleton, Pa., Aug. 16.—Matters at the Lehigh and Wilkes-Barre collieries in the Honeybrook district, are growing serious. The five drivers went out on Saturday for an increase in wages. About 2500 miners joined them, and the usually quiet southeast town is in a state of unusual excitement. The men had no organization, but a branch of the United Mine Workers' Association was started this morning, and six hundred men at once signified their willingness to join. The men held a mass meeting at night and decided to guard the collieries. The strikers gathered on the hill above the works at Anderson, and a crowd of 300 men marched past the colliery buildings. At a given signal the men at work left their places. The deputies did not attempt to molest the miners, but the deputies would, it is believed, have precipitated a riot, as the men were determined and armed. The strike is now so bitter against Superintendent Jones that he fears bodily harm, and moves about with an armed escort. His house is guarded day and night. Superintendent Jones this morning called a meeting of the miners, and the miners are now determined to have all their grievances heard, and to appeal to the Lehigh and Wilkes-Barre collieries in New York.

Jackson's Orders Issued.

Charleston, W. Va., Aug. 16.—Judge Jackson's injunction orders were issued this morning, and Deputy United States Marshal Friddle has arrested New River coal fields to serve papers on Dilcher and his associates.

Open Rebellion.

Pittsburg, Pa., Aug. 16.—There was open rebellion at the Sandy Creek strike camp this morning. The police were driven away, and the strikers, who were dissatisfied with the commissary, complained to Captain Jones and demanded that he order them they were being well treated. The foremen then threatened to march on the camp. Many of the strikers arrested them if they did not keep quiet. This had the desired effect, and the foremen returned to their quarters. There was no trouble at the other camps.

Vancover B.C. SPECIAL LETTER.

The Coujtilan Started for the Klondike With Several Vancouverites Who Will Be Trading.

Correspondence.—The steamer Coujtilan started for Klondike this week from Vancouver, loaded down with men and freight. Several prominent Vancouver men past vigorous youth were passengers. They took a large supply of provisions, which they will exchange for gold dust. The Coujtilan was the first steamer to return from the Yukon. Her captain reported that Dyea was crowded with miners bound for Klondike, that there seemed to be abundance of provisions and a large number of pack horses, and he thought every-thing already there would get through before winter. On returning six steamers bound for Dyea were spoken.

The Klondike Gold Fields.

Those who are interested in the Yukon gold fields and are anxious to invest in order to participate in the gold discoveries of this region, but unable to go there themselves, should be pushed to go for a prospectus of the British Columbia Development Company to 52 Yonge-st., Toronto. This company is organized for the purpose of operating in that region.

A Military Expedition to the Yukon.

An expedition of a military character is being organized for the purpose of going to the Klondike. Members will be paid for two years and be entitled to the rank of sergeant and a pension of \$1000 a year. The company provides transportation, supplies and tools. The expedition will be under the command of a lieutenant and accompanied by a surgeon and surveyor.
