November Mail.—The stram ship Calcidania, with the November mill, arrived at Halifix on Tuesday afternoon last, in 13 days from Liverpool, bates are to the 4th of the present month. The Calcidonia brought out between 40 and 50 passengers, among whom were Mr. John Coigley and Mr. T. G. Tisadie, of this City. The most important intelligence is the resignation of the French minister Turiers, who has been succeeded by Soult as President of the Council, and Ginzot, late Ambassador at London, as Minister for Foreign Affairs. They are styled 'The Ministry of Reconciliation."
