## ECIIPEFS.

In the year $188 \%$ there will be two eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon.
I. A partial eclipse of the Moon on Feb. ruary 8, visible in America. In Eastern Standard Time, the first contact with the Penumbia occurs at 3 h .2 m , a.m., the first contact with the Shadow at 4 h .14 m ., the last contact with the Shadow at 6 h . jom., and the last contact with the Penumbia at 7 h .42 m . The magnitude of the eclipse will be $\frac{43}{100}$. II. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in North America, visible in New Zealand and other places in the South Pacific Ocean.
III. A Partial Eclipse of the Mon on August 3, invisible in America.
IV. A Total Eclipse of the Sun August 18, visible in Asia, portions of Europe, and as a partial eclipse only in a part of Greenland and Alaska.

 tousekeeperf．ANTS，RED．－Sprigs of Inter－green or ground ivy 11 drive away red ants． anches of wormwood will rve the same purpose for ack ants．The insects may e kept out of sugar barrels $y$ drawing a wide chalk hark around the top，near he edre．
BOOTS．－To make leather poots waterproof，saturate hem with castor oil ；to stop queaking drive a peg into the middle of the sole．
CLINKERS．－To remove clinkers from stoves or fire－ brick，put in about half a peck of oyster shells on top of a bright fire．This may need repeating．
GREASE SPOTS．－To re－ move grease spots thorough－ ly saturate with turpentine， place a soft blotting paper beneath and another on top of the spot，and press it hard． The fat is dissolved，then ab－ sorbed by the paper，and en－ tirely removed from the cloth．


GILT FRAMES．－To restore gilt frames，rub with a sponge moistened in turpentine．
INK STAINS．－To remove stains of ink，wash carefully with pure water，and apply oxalic acid． If the latter changes the dye to＇a red tinge，restore the color with ammonia．

PAINT．－Chloroform will remove paint． When the color of an article has been destroy－ ed by an acid，ammonia is applied to neutral－ ize the same ；after which an application of chloroform will，in almost all cases，restore the original color．

SILVERWARE．－To prevent articles of sil verware from tarnishing，first warm them， and then paint them over with a thin solu－ tion of collodion in alcohol，using a wide soft brush for the purpose．

STARCH．－To prevent starch from sour－ ing when boiled，add a little sulphate of cop－ per．

FURNITURE，TO CLEAN．－First rub with cotton waste，dipped in boiled linseed oil ；then rub clean and dry with a soft flannel sloth．Care should be taken that the oil is all removed．

EGG ST．INS．－To remove from spoons， rub with common salt．
HAIR．－To clean hair，wash well with a mixture of soft water， 1 pint ；salsoda， 1 ounce；cream tartar，it ounce．

FRUIT STAINS．－To remove the stains of acid fruit from the hands，wash your hands in clear water，dry slightly，and while yet moist，strike a match and hold your hands around the flame．The stains will immedi－ ately disappear．

## BRUISES, SORES, Etc.
