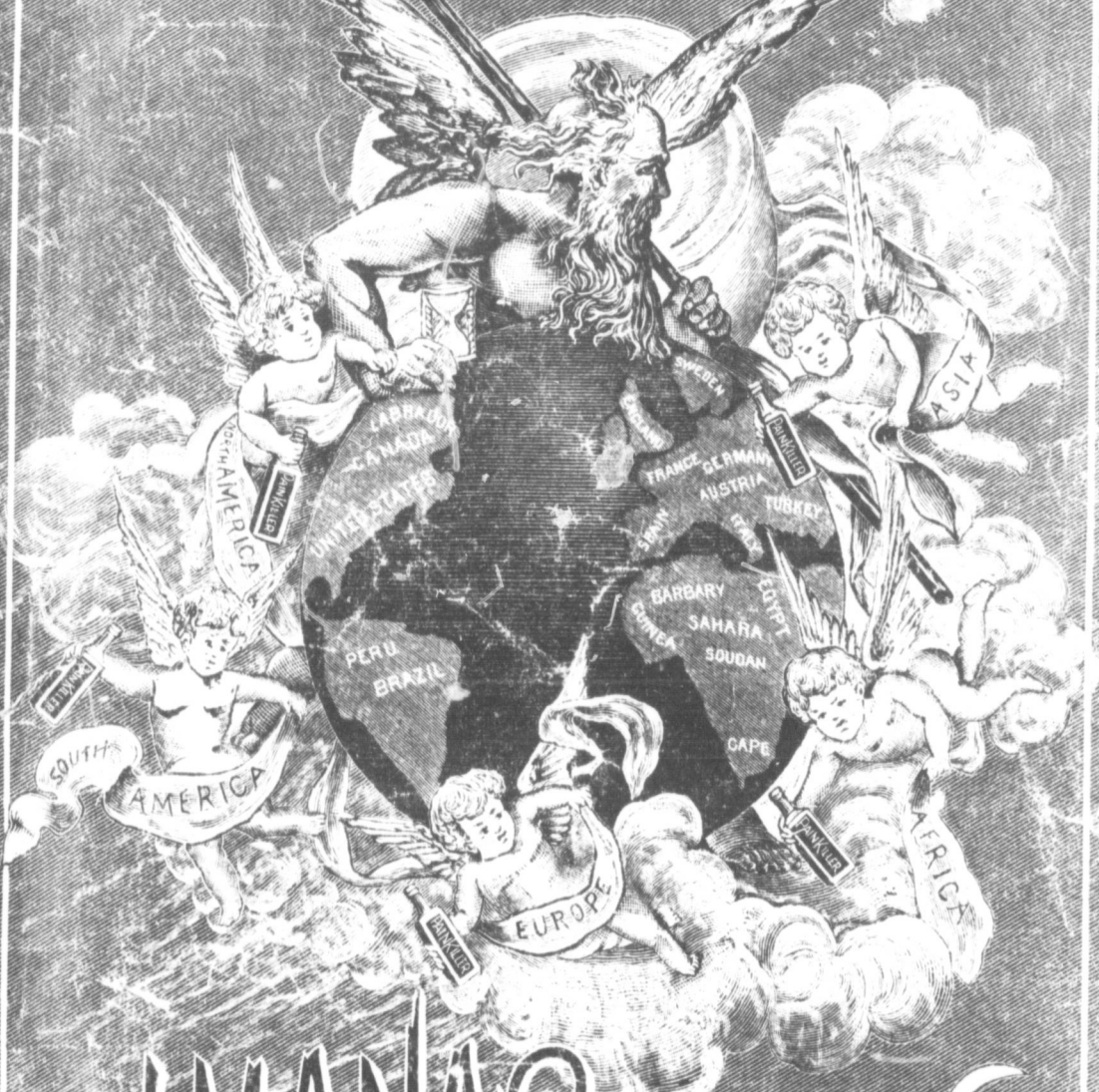

ECLIPSES.

In the year 1887 there will be two eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. A partial eclipse of the Moon on February 8, visible in America. In Eastern Standard Time, the first contact with the Penumbra occurs at 3h. 2m. a.m., the first contact with the Shadow at 4h. 14m., the last contact with the Shadow at 6h. 30m., and the last contact with the Penumbra at 7h. 42m. The magnitude of the eclipse will be $\frac{43}{106}$. II. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in North America, visible in New Zealand and other places in the South Pacific Ocean.

III. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon on August 3, invisible in America.

IV. A Total Eclipse of the Sun August 18, visible in Asia, portions of Europe, and as a partial eclipse only in a part of Greenland and Alaska.

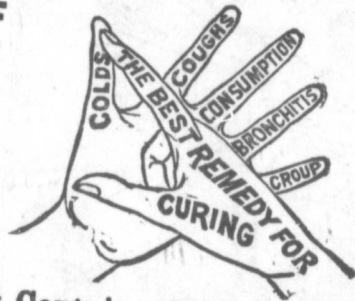
THE FOUR SEASONS.

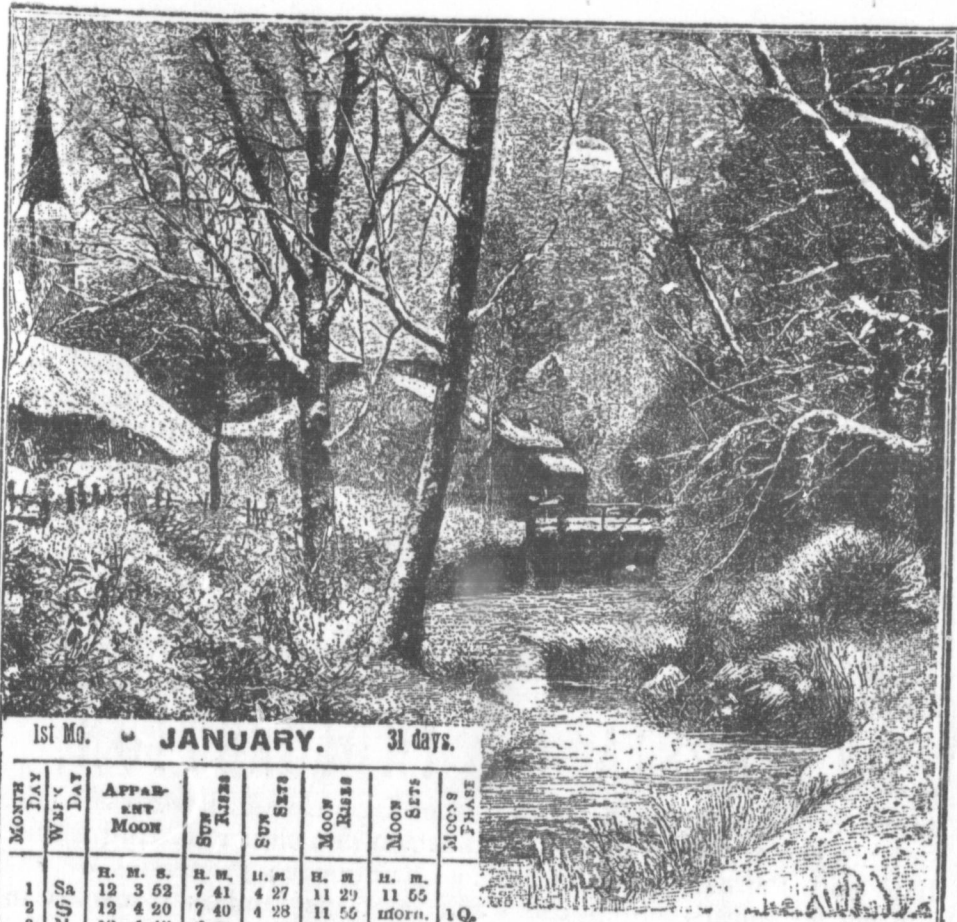

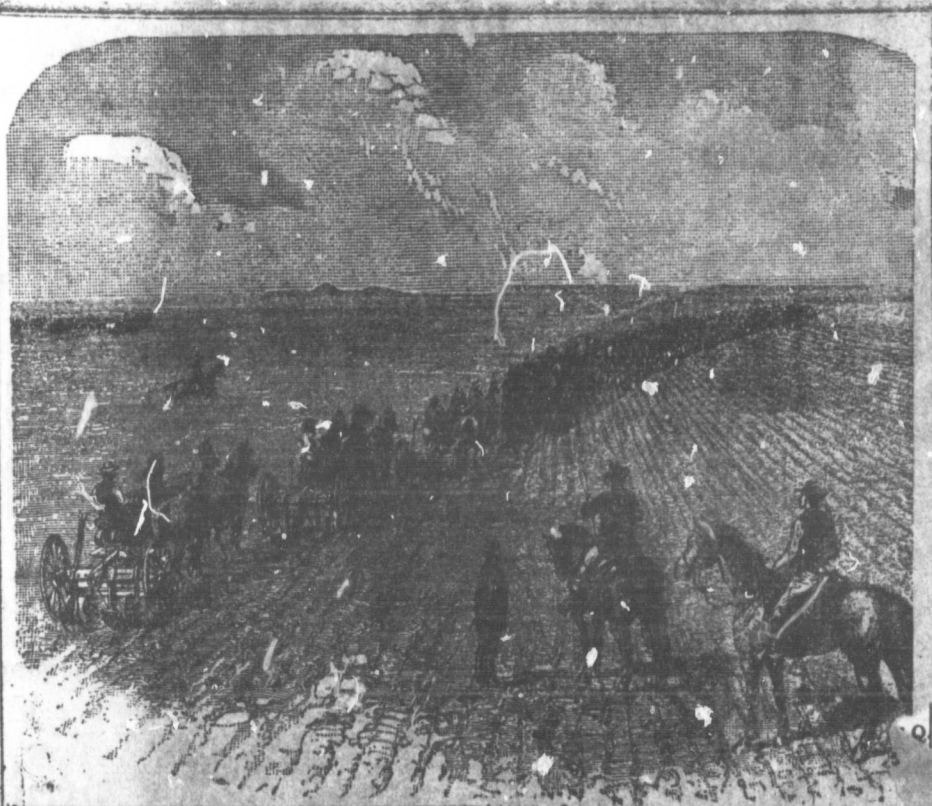

Prof. O. R. Gleason's
Rule for Buying a
Perfect Horse

The ears must be small, pointed and furry inside, and wide between. The eyes must be clear, full, large, standing out prominently, and wide between. The nostrils must be large and thin; neck long and well cut up under the jaw; stout, heavy muscle on top, and thin through middle. Withers must always be higher than hips, short back, broad and long hips, and close jointed. For durability always buy a close-jointed horse, and one with fine, short hair; the finer the hair, the longer the life. For speed, the horse should measure exactly as much from between his ears and his withers, as from his withers to the coupling of the hips—that is, the withers should be exactly midway between his ears and the coupling of the hip. From the point of the withers to the shoulder should be just as long as from the coupling of the hip, over the kidneys, to point of hip by tail. From hoof-band of forward foot to point of withers, fifty-seven inches; from point of shoulders to point of hip, sixty-six inches. Parties buying horses by this rule will find it infallible.

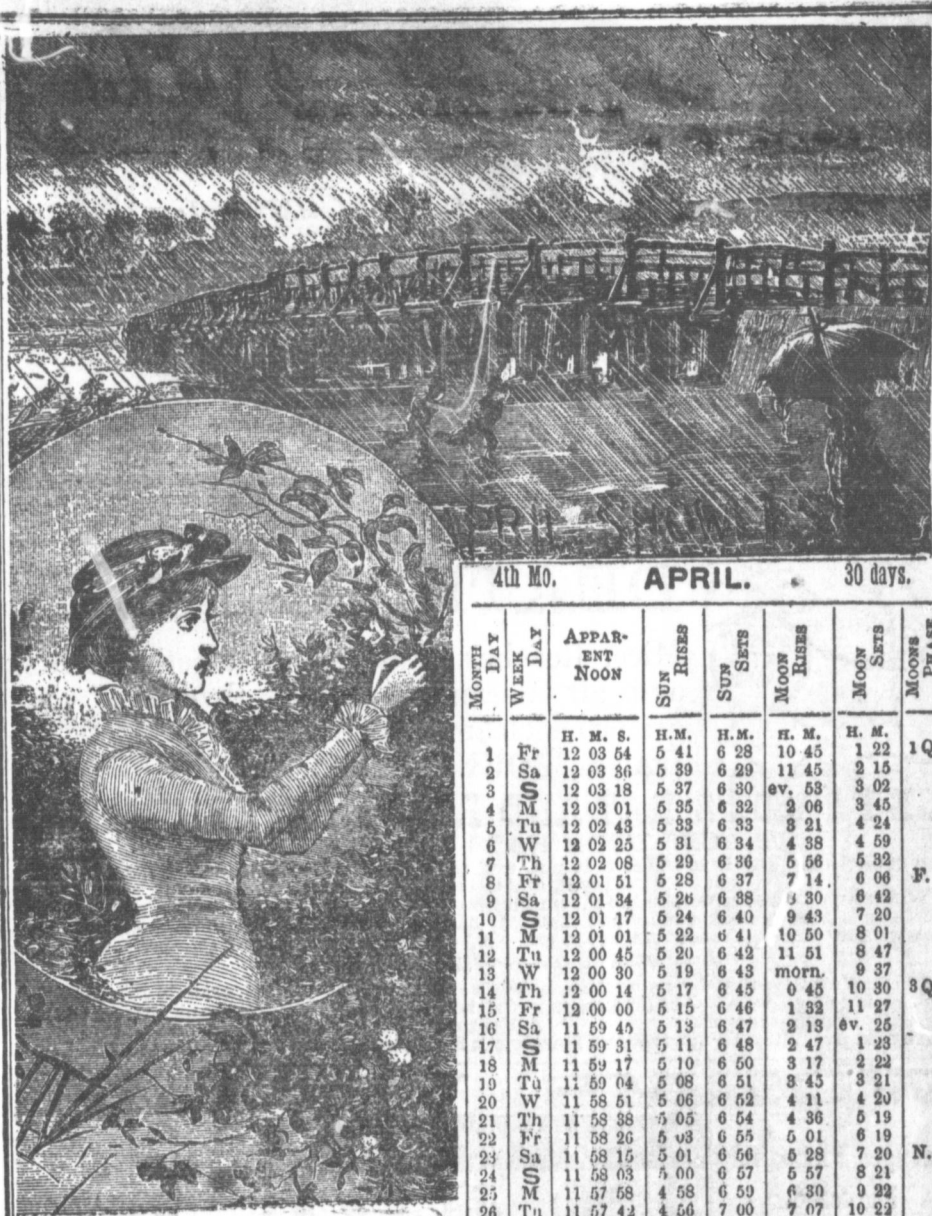

Antidotes for Poisons.

When the poison is unknown, give a prompt emetic of warm water and mustard, ipecac or salt water, and then give white of egg freely, lard, olive or other bland oil, except in case of phosphorus poisoning. If the source of poisoning is known, the following treatment will be indicated:

For Arsenic or White Precipitate.—Give a prompt emetic, followed by a mixture of chalk and castor oil until sesquioxide of iron can be obtained from the druggist.

For Lead Poisoning, Corrosive Sublimite, Saltpetre, White Vitriol, Blue Vitriol, Vermillion.—A prompt emetic, followed by white of egg, and fresh milk, given freely.

For Lye Poisoning.—Give freely of oil or warm lard and white of egg, followed by warm water and mustard, or ipecac.

Nitrate of Silver, or Lunar Caustic.—Use moderately of strong solution of common salt, and then give freely of fresh milk.

For Strychnia and its Salts.—An emetic, followed by tannic acid and chlorine.

For Carbolic Acid.—Olive or castor oil, given freely.

For Ammonia, Caustic Soda, Caustic Potash.—Give oil freely; and afterward give water with vine.

shock the system. Lower the head to
cause flow of blood to the brain; keep
in motion.

A good emetic is one teaspoonful of salt mixed
with one teaspoonful of mustard in a pint of
warm water.

ADVICE TO PARENTS

I would say a few words to parents who have children are troubled with gripes or bowel complaints. It has been used with great success where the milk passages have been clogged and pain ensued, by this mode of treatment. It gives immediate relief, if the parent takes cold, and the breast cake, after weaning the child. 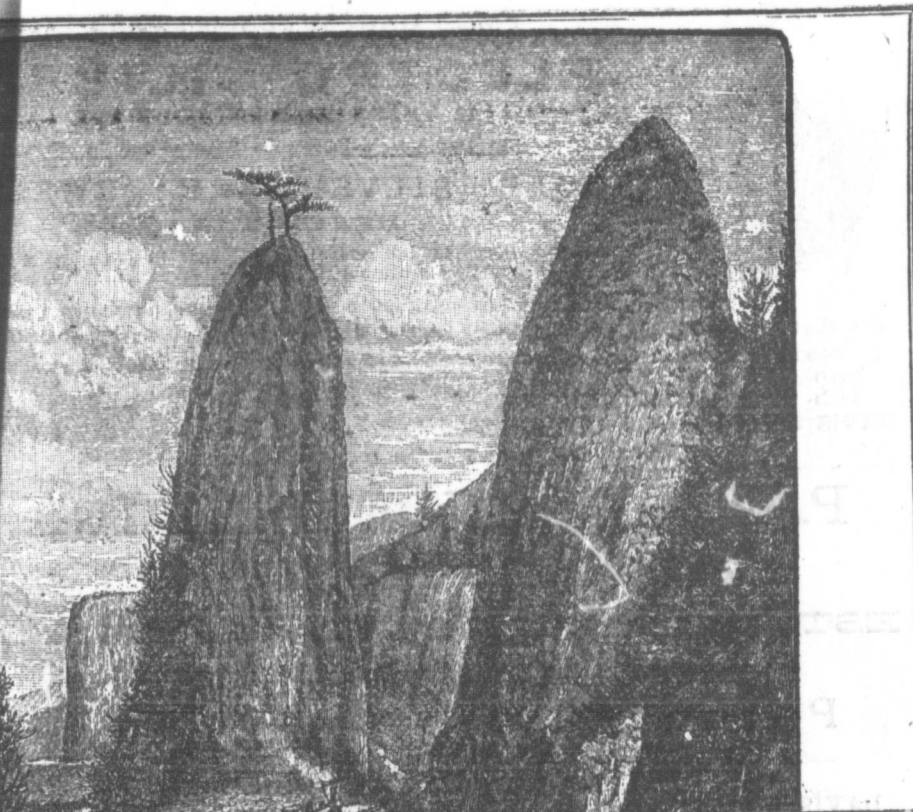

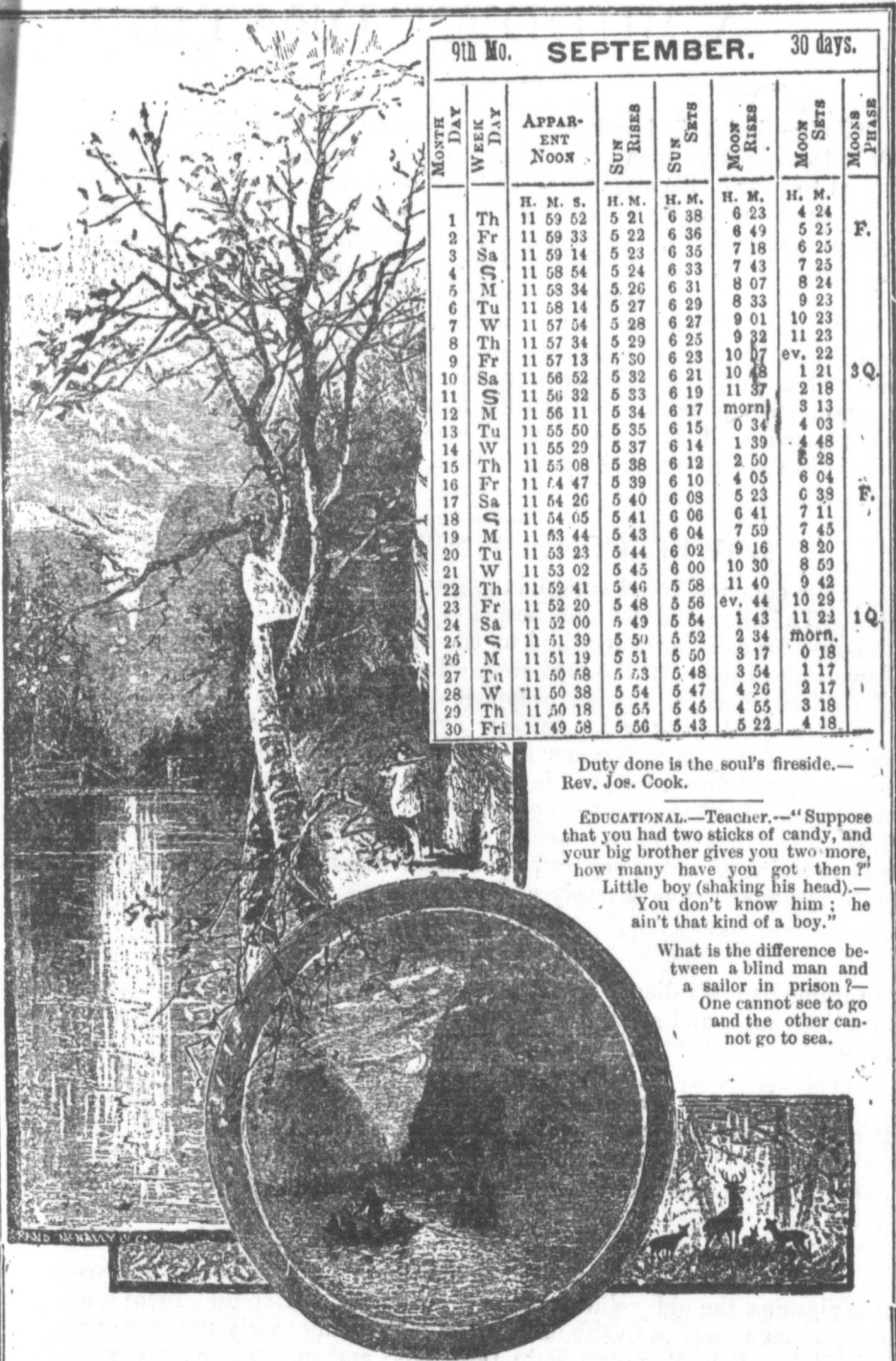

Hints for Housekeepers.

ANTS, RED.—Sprigs of winter-green or ground ivy will drive away red ants. Branches of wormwood will serve the same purpose for black ants. The insects may be kept out of sugar barrels by drawing a wide chalk mark around the top, near the edge.

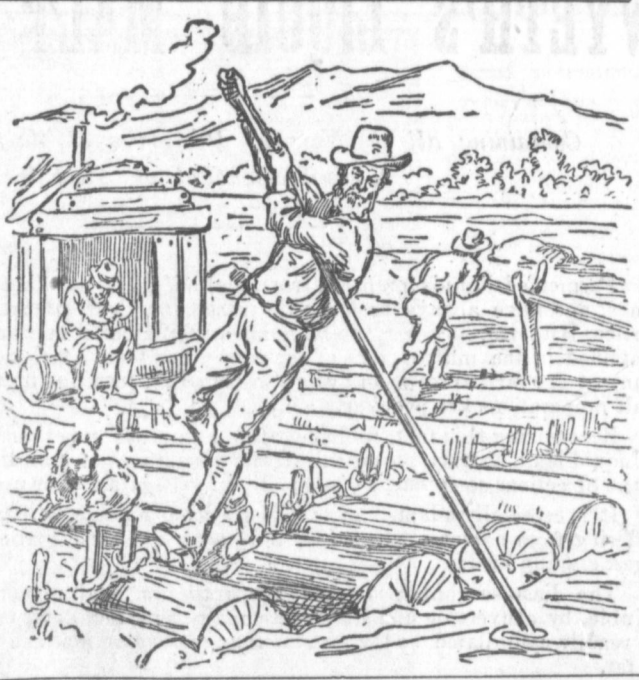
BOOTS.—To make leather boots waterproof, saturate them with castor oil; to stop squeaking drive a peg into the middle of the sole.

CLINKERS.—To remove clinkers from stoves or fire-brick, put in about half a peck of oyster shells on top of a bright fire. This may need repeating.

GREASE SPOTS.—To remove grease spots, thoroughly saturate with turpentine, place a soft blotting paper beneath and another on top of the spot, and press it hard. The fat is dissolved, then absorbed by the paper, and entirely removed from the cloth.

GILT FRAMES.—To restore gilt frames, rub with a sponge moistened in turpentine.

INK STAINS.—To remove stains of ink, wash carefully with pure water, and apply oxalic acid. If the latter changes the dye to a red tinge, restore the color with ammonia.



PAINT.—Chloroform will remove paint. When the color of an article has been destroyed by an acid, ammonia is applied to neutralize the same; after which an application of chloroform will, in almost all cases, restore the original color.

SILVERWARE.—To prevent articles of silverware from tarnishing, first warm them, and then paint them over with a thin solution of collodion in alcohol, using a wide soft brush for the purpose.

STARCH.—To prevent starch from souring when boiled, add a little sulphate of copper.

FURNITURE, TO CLEAN.—First rub with cotton waste, dipped in boiled linseed oil; then rub clean and dry with a soft flannel cloth. Care should be taken that the oil is all removed.

EGG STAINS.—To remove from spoons, rub with common salt.

HAIR.—To clean hair, wash well with a mixture of soft water, 1 pint; soda, 1 ounce; cream tartar, 1/2 ounce.

FRUIT STAINS.—To remove the stains of acid fruit from the hands, wash your hands in clear water, dry slightly, and while yet moist, strike a match and hold your hands around the flame. The stains will immediately disappear.

BRUISES, SORES, Etc.

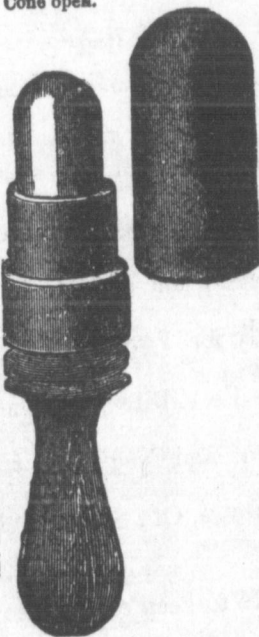
