IMPORTANT ANXIETY HAS DEAL IN NOVA AGAIN COME SCOTIA STEEL MARKET

New York, N. Y., Nov. 27.—The stock market suffered today from a steady depression of the price of steel stocks and also from the satisfaction of a considerable part of the demand from the outstanding short interest built up in the week's trading. The anxiety of the stock market was increased by the news that the Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Co. had accepted a settlement plan for the payment of its debt.
