





#### **CANADA'S NET DEBT**

IS \$336,268,546

Ottawa, Nov. 10-According to the public accounts volume published today the funded debt of Canada payable in London was 52,900-902 pounds at the end of the last fiscal year. The net debt of the Dominion was \$336,268,546, an increase of \$12,338,267. Accounts show consolidated fund receipts of \$101,503,710; expenditure \$79,-411,574, leaving a surplus on this account of \$22,091,963. In addition to this, however, there was a total capital or special expenditure of \$35,971,911, of which \$19,968,-064 was on the National Transcontinental Railway, and \$2,414,-171 on bounties.
