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GENERAL NEWS.

A certain Chinese sect teaches

great hereafter.

A bill has been introduced in the
New York legislature providing for
the expenditure in the next few years
of \$20,000,000 on canals. The ob-
ject is to provide employment for
workmen and improve commerce.

Much is heard about bomb-proof
fortresses, but the great want among
legislators in Europe at the present
time is a bomb-proof suit, which they
can wear with a sense of security when
sitting under the public galleries.

The Scottish Liberal Association
has adopted an address to Mr. Glad-
stone, partly endorsing his policy, and
declaring their belief that the House
of Lords ultimately will be compelled
to yield to the people's will in regard
to Home Rule for Ireland.

A bushel of corn makes four gal-
lons of whiskey, which retails for \$16

MASTERS AND MATES.

The St. John Sun says: "Does not the Post see that the act was never understood to be applicable to ferry boats and river tugs? We confess we do not see it. To whom does the word 'undoubtedly' refer? If to the government, they could not have understood it, otherwise they would have expressly mentioned such vessels amongst the exempted. The members for the city and county of St. John in 1883 and 1891 did not so understand it, for they never so stated in the debates nor did they secure the exemptions to the act. The act was not to support the Sun's suggestion that there was any understanding of the tugs. Who then so understood it? Certainly not the men who read the act, for the act (sec. 7 chap. 28, 1893) states it applies to any steam ship or registered tug (in Canada) carrying goods, passengers, mail, or other cargo, or for hire, ships employed solely in fishing or for other purposes, having neither masts, sails or rigging and not being 'sailing ships.' Thus the Sun must see that the only persons who understood that tugs were exempted, were persons not sufficiently interested in the subject to turn up and look into the law. It is absurd to make the Minister of Marine responsible for such persons not understanding the law, and thereupon to proceed to gibet him for enforcing it, because some unknown persons who did not inform themselves 'undoubtedly' did not apply to tugs. The exemptions are plain enough—yachts, fishing vessels and barges—and when the Sun states that tugs ought to have been and would have been exempted, it occurred to a member, it says very little in praise of the intelligent interest taken by the members of the city and county of St. John in 1883 and 1891, in the subject, when the law was being read. If the law is bad, it is the legislators not the administrator who is at fault. Let the Sun lay the capacious form of Master WELDON, ex M. P., across its knees for neglecting the interests of the tug boats; let it then call up Masters McLeod and HAZEN, for a severe switching for neglecting a tug boat law to be fastened and fastened on the necks of the gentle and inoffensive tug boat men.

With all proper deference to the blood thirsty articles in our St. John contemporaries, we think there has been a good deal of a temper in a few of them. The tug boat men were called upon to go and did pass their examinations and received their certificates. No fearful outrage or damage appears to have been done to anybody. The tug boat men passed, because they were competent men. If incompetent, they would not have received certificates. There was no wrong done anybody; the battle terminated bloodlessly, there was no body killed, wounded or missing.

The final grievance of the Sun, is that the minister did not send the time two months till close of navigation, on the ground that the act had not been enforced for ten years previously.

The Sun fails to see, first, there was no need to postpone, because the men did pass and did receive their certificates and, second, the minister of the crown learns that a law with the administration of which he is specially charged is not being enforced, and fails to take immediate steps to enforce it, he not only adopts as his own the negligence of his subordinate officers, but he undertakes the responsibility of sitting aside the will of the Legislature. No minister ought to be asked to do these things lightly. In following in this country, as closely as possible, the trade and navigation laws which wide experience and the progressive intelligence of England have dictated, it is natural that in some localities or in some lines of business, friction may occur; but it is not a much more reasonable course for the press and politicians to upset general laws, intended to give a life and property and elevate the character of our maritime marine than on any individual complaint or hardship, to declaim on the viciousness of the laws and the vindictiveness of those whose duty it is to enforce them.

That Marsh Law.

A meeting of the marsh owners of the parish of Sackville convened at the parish hall, Middle Sackville, on Monday 6th March last to discuss the legislation bearing on the marshes. W. F. George Esq. was selected as chairman and H. A. Powell, M.P.P., made a full and comprehensive statement of the contents of the present law and pointed out several remedies which might be employed.

Messrs. A. B. Fawcett, Wm. B. Fawcett, J. L. Black, George Campbell, W. F. George, Chas. Ward, David Wheaton, Abner Smith and valuable information was elicited and much enthusiasm manifested. Mr. Powell moved: That a committee of five be appointed to arrange for the straightening of a bill for the application of the assessment and collection of expenses in connection with the great marsh. The following committee was appointed: Messrs H. A. Powell, George Campbell, Walter Cahill, William Milner and S. Edgar Dixon. Mr. Powell also moved: That a further committee of five be appointed to act in concert if they see fit with the Commissioners of Sewers for the Parish of Westmorland to take into consideration the whole law relating to the Commissioners of Sewers in the Parishes of Sackville and Westmorland and cause a bill to be prepared embodying such provisions as they may see fit and submit such bill to a meeting of the marsh-owners of the parishes of Sackville and Westmorland to be called at such time as the committee should decide. Such a committee should have power to add to the number from unrepresented districts. The motion was carried and the following committee appointed: Messrs. J. L. Black, Albert

Fawcett, Wm. F. George, George Campbell, Capt. Wm. Milner, Robt. Lowman and H. A. Powell.

Although too late to arrange a bill to be presented to the legislature then in session it was expected that given the better part of a year in which to perform their work the committee would be able to frame such a bill as would meet every possible exigency and settle the forever all disputes.

The bill has not yet come forth. It cannot be said that the committee have not done their work in an unsatisfactory manner. They have not done it all. No committee meeting has been held and as far as can be ascertained no steps have been taken to give notice that such a bill will be introduced. The legislature generally meets in February and a month's notice of a bill to be presented is necessary. Unless immediate action is taken the matter will have to be left over for another year. It is not likely that a committee could frame a law that would meet the approval of the people without several meetings and lengthy discussions, but if notice were given at once there is yet time. Surely in accepting and then neglecting this trust the committee have acted in a very reprehensible manner.
