$\qquad$ campuses during the last week has been the suppression, by
means of force, of the student strikes in Argentina, held by the students in protest against the renewal of the state of siege in that country. A revolution in the government, which is now controlled by army and navy higher-uns, has helped to bring the situation to a head. The students demonstrated their disapproval by barricading themselves in the Universities and passively resisting attempts to dislodge them. During one attack by government forces, one student was killed and several injured. This act by the Argentine government has been
roundly condemned by everyone who has taken an active roundly condemned by
interest in the situation.
On the MicGill campus, meetings have been held and resolutions passed indicating the sentiments of the McGili students in their sympathy with the Argentine students. McGill is not the only Canadian University which has taken a definite stand
and expressed its views on the question. But is U. N. B. among he iist of those people who have enough interest in the welfare of others besides themselves and their own narrow world of ppressed by a major force? I don't think so. In fact I doubt if more than fifty students on the campus even mentioned the matter to other students. that brought practically every country on the giobe into the headlines of our papers, are stiil no nearer to a world-sized outlook. There are very few of us who include even other Canadian campuses in our thoughts and words on student problems and activities, let alone the campuses of uniyersities in other countries and on other coninents. We are narrow in our outlook and our thinking. Petty problems of immediate and short-lived importance occupy our whoie thoughts, leaving no room for the problems that face others, or even to reap the benefits that can be obtained by studying the activities of students of other campuses. The plight of the Argen tine students is only one of hundreds of cases where we as group of students should take an active interest in the affairs af similar groups. If there is anything we can do to help them we should be finding it out and doing something about it. "F NicGill students are. Can it be that ive havent got the give" to do something ourselv
