PREFACE.

In preparing this list of novels for readers in Canadian Libraries several principles have been kept in mind.

1. Canadian works of fiction have been included to a larger extent than in any other list we know of.
2. There has been a greater emphasis on English novels and novels produced in the British Overseas Dominions.
3. There has been some cutting down of the lists of novels provided by United States Libraries, though it is hoped that all works of general interest and value have been retained. This is simply a recognition, in the most friendly spirit, of the difference in interest depending on local or national conditions.
4. A wider use of translations of European novels of acknowledged merit has been made.

Difference of opinion in regard to such lists there will always be. However, the field has been gone over carefully, and the selection made has appeared to be based on good authority.


