Cold Storage.

Theological Seminary. Mr L. J. Webster, who for the past few weeks has been in the Peoples' Bank agency of this town, left on Thursday for his home in Shealas, where he will Cold Storage. At the Experimental Farm at Ottaw, experiments have been made in preserv-ing fruit in cold storage and have proved very satisfactory. By this method we are shown to have an agency capatie of changing fruit from a very perishable into a very firm article of commerce. If the fruit is picked before it is quite ripped and subjected to a temperature of thirty four degrees, the rippening process is stopped, no chemical change takes place and the condition of the fruit remains alsolutely stationary for months, so tender a fruit as Bartlett pears coming out perfect at the end of February When the fruit is taken out of the cold storage chamber, the rippening process




