Children and Poisonous Foods.

Batterings and dainties are generally associated in our mind with Wordsworth, children and Arcadian simplicity. It is difficult to conceive of anything harmful or dangerous in connection with the pretty little yellow flower, but unfortunately it is not always the most modest and retiring plants or flowers that are the least harmful; for example, the deadly nightshade (Atropa belladonna). Not that the battering can do you any harm, but it is a very potent poison, and still when consumed in sufficient quantities it will cause death. A proof of this has lately been afforded in England in the case of a boy who after eating some battering died within a few hours with all the symptoms of irritable poisoning. The bacterium belongs to the ranunculaceae, and nearly all the members of this group possess poisonous qualities, chiefly of an irritant nature, though in a few instances principles are to be found. Every year some children lose their lives by eating poisonous seeds or flowers, and care should be taken to look out for the leaves, but more especially for the plants or shrubs of a poisonous nature, as deadly nightshade, labradorum and yew. Fortunately, bacterium should not be eaten whole, but rather the mortar from this cause would be much greater than it is at present.
