JONATHAN ODELL, = MARGARET, dau. Jacob and Synnna, of Greenburgh, N. Y. His will, at White Plains, dated 1 Feb., 1812, proved 4 Jan., 1810, mentions children of his dau. Hannah Mandeville, Jonathan Odell, Jasper S. Odell, Jacob Odell and Isaac Mandeville, Mrs. Odell, having married S. James Mandeville; she died 24 June, 1813. (Probate Records, Liber J, p. 8.)

JACOB ODELL, = HANNAH, dau. Jasper and Auly Synnna, of Greenburgh, N. Y. His will, at White Plains, dated 1 Feb., 1812, proved 4 Jan., 1810, mentions children of his dau. Hannah Mandeville, Jonathan Odell, Jasper S. Odell, Jacob Odell and Isaac Mandeville, Mrs. Odell, having married S. James Mandeville; she died 24 June, 1813. (Probate Records, Liber J, p. 8.)

of Fairfield, in 1664, made Freeman by General Assembly; in 1666, in behalf of his father, William Odell, joined with Francis Hall in deed of partition; in 1673 and 1683, received grants of land at Fairfield; in 1697, named as member of Stratfield Church; in 1707, made will appointing wife, Mary, executrix. (Fairfield Town Records.)

DEBORAH,

no further trace beyond the mention of her name as "Widow Deborah" in the inventory of her husband's estate, 14 Aug., 1797.

HANNAH ODELL,

DEBORAH ODELL, b. 28 Oct., 1684; mentioned in Stratfield Church Records as renewing the Covenant 7 Dec., 1718. MARY ODELL, mentioned in father's will, in 1704, called daughter of John Odell, and renewed the Covenant in Stratfield Church.

ODELL, who is mentioned together with her mother, the dau. of Richard Lyon, in a deed in which she joined with her husband, William Odell, dated 13 March, 1732. Mrs. Odell died — Jan., in her fortieth year; her gravestone is still standing in the old churchyard at Stratfield, but is partly obliterated. (Fairfield Town Records.)

HEZEKIAH ODELL,

of Stratfield, in 1700, named in Stratfield Church Records as son of John Odell, and renewed the Covenant; in 1727, with brother John, joined in deed to Timothy Wheeler; in 1727, appointed guardian of Eleanor Smith and Eleanor French; in 1728, commissioned as Lieutenant at Stratfield by the General Assembly. (Fairfield Town Records.)

SAMUEL ODELL,

of Stratfield, in 1733, called brother, eldest son of Samuel Odell, dec.; in deed from Ebenezer and Mary Gregory; in 1735, on list of grand jurors; in 1751, commissioned Captain by General Assembly; in 1775, called "Samuel Odell, Esq., late of Fairfield," and widow Sarah mentioned in distribution of estate. (Fairfield Town and Probate Records.)

JOHN ODELL,

of Connecticut Farms, N. J.; in 1710, lived at Stratfield; in 1730, son of Esau Samuel Odell, late of Stratfield, joined in deed to eldest brother Samuel; d. 25 June, 1750; will, at Trenton, N. J., proved 25 same month, mentions wife Temperance, only son Jonathan and three daughters. (Probate Records, Liber E, p. 435.)

PERANCE, dau. Rev. Jonathan,

Dickinson, D. D., and wife Jonathan; dau. Jacob and Hannah Dickinson; Rev. Jonathan Dickinson, b. 22 April, 1688; dau. Yale, class 1706; in 1709, First Presbyterian Church in New York; in 1745, first Presb. of New Jersey; d. 7 Oct., 1747; will, at Trenton, mentions

JOHN ODELL, b. 18 Sept., 1750, dau. of Isaac and Anne Odell, married to the above-mentioned Isaac Odell, and issue with her, who were the progenitors of John, of West Co., and ed.

ABIGAIL ODELL,

of Stratfield, in 1757, received deed from his father, Hezekiah Odell; in 1768, appointed surveyor at Fairfield; in 1769, made guardian of Wm. Odell, minor, of Fairfield; in 1774, one of a committee of gentlemen in regard to certain proceedings of Continental Congress; in 1777, estate inventoried at Fairfield. (Fairfield Town Records.)

GERSHOM ODELL,

of Fairfield, in 1745, received deed of land from his father, Hezekiah Odell, of Fairfield; in 1756, estate inventoried by James Odell, of Fairfield, single woman; in 1765 described as Gershom Odell, late of Fairfield, in distribution of his estate, with mention of widow and children William and Ruth. (Fairfield Town and Probate Records.)

JOHN ODELL,
