

ACT OF INCORPORATION.

CHAPTER XCII.

An Act to incorporate the Toronto Club.

[Assented to 15th October, 1863.]

WHEREAS the persons hereinafter named, with Preamble. a large number of others in Toronto, and elsewhere in Upper Canada, have associated themselves for the establishment of a Club, for social purposes, and have prayed to be incorporated by the name of the "Toronto Club," and it is expedient to grant their prayer: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. The Honorable J. H. Cameron, and A. Thorn-Incorporation Todd, J. M. Strachan, A. Morrison, John Crawford, Esquires, and such other persons as now are or herafter shall become members of the said Association shall be and are hereby declared to be a body politic and corporate, in deed and in name, by the name of the "Toronto Club," and by that Corporate name shall have perpetual succession and a common powers. seal, and shall have power from time to time to alter, renew, or change such common seal, at their pleasure, and shall by the same name from time to time and at all times hereafter be able and capable to purchase, acquire, hold, possess, and enjoy, and to have, take and receive, to them and their successors,

to and for the actual occupation of the said Corporation, any lands, tenements, and hereditaments, and real and immovable property and estate situate, lying and being within the City of Toronto, and the same to sell, alienate and dispose of whensoever the said Corporation may deem it proper so to do; and by the same name shall and may be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, in any Constitution manner whatsoever; and the Constitution, Rules, and Regulations now in force, touching the admis-

sion and expulsion of members, and the management and conduct generally of the affairs and concerns of the said Association in so far as they may not be inconsistent with the laws of this Province shall be the Constitution, Rules, and Regula-Proviso: as tions of the said Corporation; Provided always, By laws, &c. that the said Corporation may from time to time alter, repeal, and change such Constitution, Rules, and Regulations, in the manner provided by the Constitution, Rules and Regulations of the said Corporation.

2. All the property and effects now owned by or corporation held in trust for the said Association are hereby vested in the said Corporation, and shall be applied solely to the maintenance of the said Corporation.

Liability of members imited.

3. No member of the Corporation shall be liable for any of the debts thereof beyond a sum which shall be equal to the amount of the original entrance fee and the annual subscriptions which may remain unpaid by such member; and any member of the Club not being in arrear may retire therefrom, and shall cease to be such member, on giving notice to

- 4. It shall be lawful for the said Corporation to Stock and issue stock, to such extent as they may deem necestions for sary, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of stock. forty thousand dollars, in shares of one hundred dollars each; such stock to be subscribed for in a book to be opened for that purpose by the Committee of the said Club, and to be paid up in such manner and within such delay as may be determined by the said Committee.
- 5. The funds arising from such stock shall be Application applied exclusively to the erection of a Club House of stock. and dependencies, and to furnishing the same.
- 6. The shares of such stock shall be assignable Transfer of by delivery and surrender of the certificates to be stock. issued to the holders of such shares respectively, and by assignment on the books of the Corporation.
- 7. Each holder of such stock duly paid up shall Rights of be a proprietor of an undivided share of the real holders, estate of the Corporation and of the buildings thereon to be erected, and shall be exempt from all liability beyond the extent of the stock he shall actually hold.
- 8. It shall be competent to the said Corporation Paying off to pay off so much of the said stock from time to stock. time as the said Committee may deem desirable; the share or shares so to be paid off to be selected by the said Committee by ballot,

Mode of payment.

9. Such payment may be made by despositing, in any of the chartered Banks in the City of Toronto, to the credit of the holder or holders of such share or shares, the amount of such share or shares and of all dividends unpaid thereon, and thereupon such share or shares shall, ipso facto, cease to exist.

CHAPTER LXVII.

An Act respecting the Toronto Club.

[Assented to 7th March, 1878.]

WHEREAS the Toronto Club have presented Preamble their petition praying for an amendment to their Act of Incorporation, and whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition:

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the

Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:—

- 1. It shall be lawful for the Toronto Club to Power to borrow money upon the credit of the Club and to borrow hypothecate, pledge or mortgage the real or personal property of the Club to secure any sum or sums of money so borrowed at such rate of interest and on such terms as may from time to time be agreed upon.
- 2. The Club shall have power to draw, make, Power bills and eccept, and endorse all bills of exhange and promis-notes. sory notes necessary for the purposes of the Club ander the hands of their President and Secretary fter authority from the Committee of the Club so to do, and in no case shall it be necessary that the all of the Club be affixed to any such bill or note, are shall the President or Secretary be individually sponsible therefore: Provided that nothing hereshall be construed to authorize the Club to issue tes or bills of exchange payable to bearer or tended to be circulated as money or as notes or bills a bank.

RULES OF THE TORONTO CLUB.

I. All former rules are hereby repealed.

II. Politics and religious questions of every kind are absolutely excluded from open discussion in the Club.

INTERPRETATION.

III. The words "Ordinary Members" shall mean members who have paid the entrance fee required by the Rules; the words "Qualified Members" shall mean such Ordinary Members as are not in default with respect to their annual subscriptions or dues to the Club or Steward; the words "Privileged Members" shall mean such members, admitted to the privileges of the Club. as are not required or do not elect to pay an entrance fee. No member who has not paid an entrance fee shall be entitled to attend or vote at any meeting of the Club, or to vote for the election of members, or be elected upon the Committee of Management, or have any interest in the property of the Club. The words "Privileges of the Club" shall mean, in the case of visitors introduced by members under Rule XXXII. such privileges as may have been or hereafter may be prescribed by the Committee of Management, and in other cases shall mean all the privileges of the Club enjoyed by ordinary members. The words "Residents"

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and "Resident Members" shall mean persons residing in Toronto or within ten miles thereof, and "Non-residents" or "Non-resident Members" shall mean persons residing more than ten miles from Toronto.

ANNUAL MEETINGS.

IV. The Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held on the second Thursday in January for the transaction of general business, the election of members to fill the places of the retiring members of the Committee of Management, and the appointment of an Auditor for the current year; and at such meeting the Committee of Management shall present an audited report, together with a detailed statement of the accounts, assets and liabilities of the Club for the past year, and an estimate of the receipts and disbursements for the current year.

V. Notices of motions to be brought before all general meetings shall be handed to the Secretary and posted by him at least seven days before the day of such meetings, and no subjects shall be discussed thereat except those of which notice has been given.

SPECIAL MEETINGS.

VI. The Secretary shall call a Special General Meeting of the Club at any time, on receiving direction from the Committee of Management, or on a requisition to the Chairman of the Committee, signed by no less than ten qualified members. In all such case

VII. The Chairman of the Committee shall take the chair at all the Club and Committee Meetings; in his absence the members present at any such meeting shall elect a Chairman.

QUQRUM.

VIII. Twenty qualified members shall constitute a quorum at any general meeting of the Club, and four members of the Committee of Management shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Committee.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

IX. The Committee of Management shall consist of nine members, and shall elect a Chairman from their own number at their first meeting in each year. The three senior members shall retire each year, and shall be ineligible for election that year except in the case of the retiring Chairman, and three members shall at the next annual meeting be elected in their place. The names of the three retiring members shall be posted by the Secretary fourteen days before such annual meeting, and any two qualified members may nominate a member or members to be proposed for election in their place, and such nomination or nominations shall be handed to the Secretary and posted by

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him seven days before the day of such meeting. In case no nomination, or not a sufficient number, have been posted, the meeting shall elect the required number.

X. The Committee shall meet weekly or at the call of the Chairman, and as often as he shall think expedient, for the auditing of accounts, the transaction of current business and the taking cognizance of any infraction of the Rules or Regulations.

XI. The Committee shall appoint all sub-committees and define their duties and powers, and, subject to the provisions of the general Rules, shall make Regulations for the internal management of the Club.

XII. The Committee shall appoint a Secretary, a Solicitor and a Banker, and may appoint and employ such other officers, servants and agents as may be required for the proper working of the Club, and it shall have all the powers of the Club, except the power to rescind or alter any Rules, Resolutions or By-laws adopted or passed by the Club, the power to expel members save as otherwise provided by the Rules, and the power to raise money by way of loan on mortgages or debentures.

XIII. The Committee shall have power to levy an assessment of not more than \$10 in any year, subject to the approval of two-thirds of those present at an annual or a special general meeting called for the purpose of considering the same; and any members making default in

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XIV. The Committee shall have power, at a meeting of the Committee called for the purpose, of which three clear days' notice shall be given, to fill by appointment for the current year, all vacancies in the Committee occasioned by death, resignation or otherwise.

XV. Should any member of the Committee of Management be absent from six consecutive meetings of that body without a satisfactory excuse to the other members, he shall cease to hold office, and his place shall be filled in the manner provided by Rule XIV.

SECRETARY,

XVI. The Secretary shall keep correct Minutes of the proceedings of the Club, also all necessary books of account, and shall also receive all Club Moneys, and pay all accounts. He shall discharge all duties assigned to him by the Committee of Management, shall be paid such salary as the Committee may decide, and shall hold office during pleasure.

AUDITOR.

XVII. The Auditor shall examine and audit the Club accounts, and report thereon to the Committee of Management yearly, or when required.

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BALLOT.

XVIII. The name of every candidate for admission shall, before nomination be submitted by a Qualified Member to the Committee of Management, accompanied by a letter addressed to the Secretary, declaring the fitness of the proposed candidate for membership, and unless approved of by two-thirds of the members of the Committee present at a meeting called for the purpose, such candidate shall not be eligible for nomination. All conversations and discussions before the Committee on the subject of admissions and all proceedings in reference thereto shall be deemed confidential, and shall not be divulged.

XIX. Every nomination of a candidate for membership shall be entered in a book kept for the purpose, and such nomination shall be signed by two Qualified Members of the Club, one as proposer and the other as seconder, neither of whom shall be a member of the Committee of Management and shall state the candidate's usual residence, rank, profession or occupation. The Secretary shall forthwith post the same, and at least two weeks thereafter such candidate shall be balloted for by Qualified Members on any Saturday between the hours of 12 o'clock noon and 6 o'clock p.m., by each voting member writing his name upon a card and putting the same with a white or black ball in a ballot box provided by the Secretary. The Secretary and one member of the Committee of Management, or two members of the Committee

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Committee

shall after the time for voting has expired, open the ballot box and declare the result, provided always that at least twenty-four Qualified Members shall vote in order to constitute a valid ballot, and that one black ball in every six balls shall prevent a candidate from being elected. No person who has been so rejected shall be eligible for election within twelve months.

XX. The Secretary shall furnish each candidate so elected with a copy of the Rules and a memorandum of the amount payable for entrance fee and subscription, and until the same is paid such candidate shall not be deemed to be a member of the Club or entitled to any of the privileges thereof. And if any person heretofore or hereafter elected fails to pay such entrance fee and subscription within four weeks after notification the election may be declared void by the Committee.

FEES.

XXI. Ordinary Members shall pay an entrance fee of one hundred dollars and an annual subscription as follows: If a resident of Toronto or within ten miles thereof, thirty dollars; if residing more than ten and less than one hundred miles from Toronto, twenty dollars; and if residing more than one hundred miles from Toronto, an annual subscription of fifteen dollars. All annual subscriptions shall be due and payable on the 1st day of December in each year, but members who are required by the Rules to pay an annual subscription of thirty dollars or twenty dollars or

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fifteen dollars, as the case may be, shall, if elected on or after the 1st day of February, pay a subscription at the rate of three dollars, two dollars, or one dollar and fifty cents per month, respectively, for the current year ending on the 1st of December, provided that both Ordinary and Privileged Members, instead of paying their annual subscriptions of thirty dollars, twenty dollars, or fifteen dollars, as herein provided, may, if they so elect, pay the same in two half-yearly instalments of sixteen dollars, eleven dollars, or eight dollars, as the case may be, the first instalment to become due and payable on the 1st day of December, and the second on the 1st day of June, and every member failing to pay his annual subscription, or his instalment, as the case may be, for one month after any of them becomes due, shall pay an additional sum by way of fine of two dollars for each month or portion thereof during which he is in default. name of every member failing to pay his annual subscription or his first instalment before the 1st day of January, or failing to pay his second instalment, with all fines, before the 1st day of July, shall be posted in the Club, and if the subscription or instalment, as the case may be, with all fines, be not paid within five months thereafter, he shall then cease to be a member of the Club, but he may, upon application within a reasonable time to the Committee of Management, be reinstated by the Committee if in its opinion it is deemed expedient to do so, and upon such terms as the Committee shall determine.

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XXII. If a Non-resident Member becomes a resident, he shall pay the usual entrance fee, if he has not already done so, and also the usual annual subscription of a Resident Member, and a residence substantially for three consecutive months in Toronto, or within ten miles thereof, shall constitute such member a Resident Member. And failing to comply with the requirements of this Rule and the decision of the Committee upon his case, he shall be dealt with under those provisions of Rule XXI. which are applicable to members in default, and shall cease to be a member of the Club.

XXIII. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to notify all members whose debts or obligations to the Club or the Steward thereof have remained unpaid for one month, and no member shall be allowed to vote for the election of a member, or to exercise any of the privileges of membership in the Club until such debt or obligation is satisfied. All entrance fees, subscriptions and dues shall be paid to the Secretary.

LIFE MEMBERS.

XXIV. Ordinary Members of the Club may be elected as Life Members by a unanimous vote of the Committee of Management at a meeting called for the purpose, either for great services to the Club or upon the payment of a sum to be fixed by the Committee in each case, provided that the name of the member and in case of payment the amount so fixed shall be posted in

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the Club by the Secretary for two weeks, but if before the expiration of the said two weeks three Ordinary Members inform the Secretary in writing that they desire the approval of such election by a general meeting, such election shall be stayed until approved of by a vote of two-thirds of the members present at such meeting. All Life Members heretofore and hereafter elected shall be exempt from further subscriptions or assessments, but shall remain subject in all respects to the provisions of Rule XL, except that no portion of the amount paid by them to become a Life Member shall be returned.

SUPERNUMERARY MEMBERS.

XXV. Any member who may be absent from the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec during the whole period for which the annual subscription is payable, may be considered a Supernumerary Member, and pay an annual subscription of five dollars during the continuance of such absence; but any member availing himself of this indulgence must previously notify the same by letter to the Secretary, who shall insert his name in the book of Supernumerary Members, and such member shall be readmitted to all the privileges of the Club upon his return being notified, in writing, to the Secretary, such notification to be given within one month after his return to the said Provinces of Ontario and Quebec or either of them, and upon payment of his subscription, or the proportion thereof for

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the current year, as provided in the case of new members in Rule XXI: and failing such notification and payment, such member shall be considered as having withdrawn from the Club.

RESIGNATION OF MEMBERS.

XXVI. No member shall be permitted to resign his membership until his subscription, dues and debts to the Club have been paid, and any member who shall withdraw, resign, or be expelled, shall cease to be a member of the Club, and shall forfeit ipso facto all right or claim to membership therein, or by virtue of his membership in or to its property or funds; and any member who shall be expelled shall forever thereafter be ineligible to be readmitted a member of the Club, or to be introduced as a visitor into the Club.

XXVII. Any member, whose dues and debts to the Club and to the Steward, are paid, shall be at liberty to withdraw from the Club, on his written application to that effect, sent to the Committee.

PRIVILEGED MEMBERS.

XXVIII. The Committee of Management may in its discretion admit to the privileges of the Club for such periods as it may from time to time think fit any stranger of distinguished rank or position visiting Toronto. And the Committee may also admit to such

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privileges for a period not exceeding one year, such strangers as may be temporarily resident in Ontario upon payment of a subscription of five dollars per month.

XXIX. Ordinary Members of the St. James's Club, Montreal; the Rideau Club, Ottawa; the Halifax Club, Halifax; the City Club, St. John's, Newfoundland; the Manitoba Club, Winnipeg, and, in the discretion of the Committee, of any other Club, and officers of Her Majesty's Forces stationed in or visiting Canada, or on duty in the Dominion, and the officers of the Active Militia Permanent Forces of the Dominion of Canada although residents of Ontario, but not residing in Toronto, or within ten miles thereof, shall be admitted to the privileges of the Club for two weeks, such members being eligible for one month longer on payment of five dollars, and such privilege not to be repeated within six months.

XXX. Any Ordinary Member of the St. James's Club, Montreal; the Rideau Club, Ottawa; the Halifax Club, Halifax; the City Club, St. John's, Newfoundland; and the Manitoba Club, Winnipeg, whose usual residence is not less than one hundred miles from Toronto, shall be eligible for election on payment annually of the usual Resident Member's subscription, and shall be exempt from paying the entrance fee so long as they are Ordinary Members of the above mentioned Clubs, and continue to reside at the distance from Toronto above specified.

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XXXI. By the consent of the Committee or a quorum thereof, the officers of Her Majesty's Forces stationed in Canada, or on duty in the Dominion, and the officers of the Active Militia Permanent Forces of the Dominion of Canada may be admitted to the privileges of the Club for a period of not less than one year, on payment of the annual subscription in advance without entrance fee. The name of any person admitted under this Rule, with the name of his proposer, shall be entered in the Visitors' Book.

XXXII. Subject to the regulations prescribed by the Committee of Management, any member may introduce gentlemen who are non-residents of Ontario to the privileges of the Club for two weeks, not necessarily consecutive, by entering their names in the Visitors' Book, but no introduction of the same gentleman shall be made for more than two weeks within six months, and he may introduce gentlemen to the Visitors' Room, but if they are residents, not oftener than once a month, and he may at his own expense invite guests to breakfast, lunch, dinner and supper.

XXXIII. The member introducing a friend to the privileges of the Club shall be answerable for any debt he may incur to the Steward, and for any damage done by him to the Club property.

XXXIV. The names of persons introduced to the privileges of the Club under Rules XXVIII., XXIX and XXXII., with the duration of their privilege shall be posted on the notice board.

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GENERAL RULES.

XXXV. The Committee may extend to guests of members the privileges of the Private Card Room during the afternoon, such guests having lunched or having been invited to dine at the Club and subject to such regulations as the Committee may from time to time adopt, and guests of members shall have all the privileges of the Club after six o'clock in the evening provided they have dined at the Club, but these privileges shall only be enjoyed whilst the member introducing such guests is present with them.

XXXVI. The Club shall be open every day for the reception of members at 8 o'clock in the forenoon and shall be closed and the lights extinguished at 1 a.m., except on Saturdays and Sundays, when the hour of closing shall be midnight; and no member shall be admitted into or remain in the Club after these hours on any pretence whatever, unless specially authorized by the Committee.

XXXVII. The Committee of Management shall make regulations prescribing the conditions upon which billiards, whise and other games may be played in the Club, and any member committing a breach of such regulations shall be liable to expulsion under Rule XL.

XXXVIII. Members shall pay all vills for dues and expenses incurred before leaving the Club, and the names of all members whose accounts remain unpaid on the first day of each month, such accounts having

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and the aid ing previously been rendered, shall be posted on the fifteenth. All credit shall be stopped to any member while posted.

XXXIX. Any cause of complaint that may arise is to be written and signed by the member so complaining in the Complaint Book, or by letter to the Secretary, which complaint must be specially noticed by the Committee at their next weekly meeting; and any overcharge, inattention, or improper conduct on the part of a servant is to be stated by letter, under the signature of such member, which being put in the Secretary's box, must be laid before the Committee at their next weekly meeting.

XL Any member wilfully infringing the Rules of the Club, or being guilty of conduct in or out of the Club which, in the opinion of the Committee, or of any ten members who shall certify the same in writing to the Committee, is detrimental to the character or interests of the Club, or is unbecoming a gentleman, shall be liable to suspension from all the privileges of the Club on a vote of two-thirds of the Committee present, when the question of the member's conduct shall be investigated, and notice of such suspension shall at once be given by the Secretary by post to such member's last known address, and such member shall have the right of appeal by giving notice in writing within seven days after notification of his suspension, addressed to the Secretary of the Club posted and registered, and such appeal shall be ıe er

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to a meeting of the Club to be held within one month of such suspension, of which meeting at least seven days' notice must be given on the notice board, and also by post to the suspended member at his last known address, and if such suspension is sustained by a majority of qualified members at the Special General Meeting so called, or if the member suspended fail to notify the Secretary of his intention to appeal, he shall be considered to be expelled and shall forfeit all privileges of the Club, including his entrance fee, but his subscription for the current year shall be returned to him pro tanto, and he shall be forever after ineligible for membership.

XLI. Any notice duly posted on the notice board shall be deemed a sufficient notice to all the members of the Club unless special notice is ordered.

AMENDMENTS.

XLII. Any member who proposes to move at an annual or special general meeting for the adoption of a new rule, or the repeal, alteration or amendment of an existing rule, shall give timely notice thereof to the Secretary, together with a copy of his proposed motion, and the Secretary shall post the same on the notice board at least six clear days previous to such meeting, and no repeal, alteration or amendment of a rule shall be adopted without such notice nor without the consent of two-thirds of the members present at such meeting.


