LAWS.

REVISED, SEPTEMBER, 1882.

Laws of a previous date are not now in force.

ARTICLE I.—THE SOCIETY.

1. The Society shall consist of Graduates and Undergraduates of King's College and of the University of Toronto, of Students of University College, and of regular Students of the School of Practical Science.
2. It shall be called THE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE LITERARY AND SCIENTIFIC SOCIETY.
3. The object of this Society shall be the encouragement of literary and scientific pursuits by discussions, original essays, and readings from English authors, and by the supply of newspapers and other periodicals to its Reading Room.
4. No controverted point in religion, or Canadian party politics, shall be admitted for discussion in the Society.
5. The President and Professors of University College shall be the Patrons of the Society, and shall have the right of attendance at all its meetings.

ARTICLE II.—MEMBERS.

1. The Society shall consist of Ordinary, Honorary, Corresponding and Life Members.
2. Ordinary members shall consist of Graduates, Undergraduates, and Students.

3. Honorary Members shall consist of (1) all Life Members who have already taken a higher degree than that of Bachelor of Arts from King's College or the University of Toronto ; (2) all ex-Presidents of the Society ; and (3) such other gentlemen as have already been elected Honorary Members, or may hereafter be elected by a vote of five-sixths of the members present at any regular meeting of the Society.
4. Corresponding Members shall consist of such Honorary and Life Members, not resident in Toronto, as may be desirous of contributing to the objects of the Society.
5. Life Members shall consist of such Ordinary Members as shall have paid four years' membership fees to the funds of the Society.
6. Candidates for Ordinary or Honorary Membership shall be nominated at least one week before their election.
7. The names of all candidates for membership shall be posted up in the Entrance Hall for at least five days before their election, and any member may, by private notification to the President, require that a ballot be taken for the election of such candidates.
8. In case no ballot be demanded before the next Ordinary or Open Meeting of the Society, the President shall at such meeting announce the names of the candidates proposed, and declare them duly elected ; in case a ballot is demanded, the President shall announce the same without disclosing the name of the member who requested it ; the ballot shall be taken in the usual manner, and the votes of five-sixths of the members present shall be necessary for the election of each candidate.
9. No ordinary member shall be entitled to vote at any

ARTICLE III.—OFFICERS.

1. The Officers of the Society shall consist of a President, three Vice-Presidents, a Recording Secretary, a Treasurer, a Curator, a Corresponding Secretary, a Secretary of Committees, and five Councillors, all of whom shall constitute the General Committee. These officers shall rank in the above order. The Treasurer, Curator and five Councillors shall constitute the House Committee, of which the Curator shall be *ex officio* Chairman.

2. The election of Officers shall take place yearly, by ballot, at the Annual Meeting.

3. Candidates for office in the Society shall be nominated at least six days before the election; and no candidate shall be eligible for election to any office but that for which he has been nominated.

4. The President, or, in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents, or an ex-president, or graduate member, at the request of the President, shall preside over all meetings of the Society, enforce the due observance of the Constitution, decide all questions of order, announce the result of all voting, and give the casting vote in case of a tie.

5. The Recording Secretary shall keep full and correct minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Society, the names of all candidates proposed and elected, and the number of votes cast at every election or division. He shall also be responsible for the correctness of the roll, shall prepare and sign the notices for all meetings of the Society, and post the same in the College entrance.

6. The Treasurer shall receive and account for all moneys belonging to the Society ; shall, under the direction of the General Committee, pay all expenses incurred by the Society, and at the penultimate meeting shall submit his report to two auditors appointed at a previous meeting. He shall keep a Roll Book in which shall be entered the name of every member of the Society, with the date of his admission, and of each payment of fees made by him. He shall also be *ex officio* a member of the House Committee.

7. The Curator shall be *ex officio* Chairman of the House Committee, shall have general charge of the Reading Room, and shall enforce the rules relating thereto, subject to an appeal to the House Committee, to whom he shall submit a monthly report.

8. The Corresponding Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Society, and of the General and Conversazione Committees, under the direction of the President ; shall keep copies of all letters sent, and files of all letters received on behalf of the Society, and notify in writing the Debaters, Essayists, and Readers elected for each public meeting.

9. The Secretary of Committees shall prepare the notices and keep the minutes of all meetings of the General and Conversazione Committees, and shall present their reports to the Society. He shall also report at the penultimate meeting of the Society the number of meetings held by these Committees, together with the attendance of each member thereat.

10. Every officer of the Society shall, at the conclusion of his term of office, deliver to his successor all books and documents in his possession belonging to the Society, and such successor shall henceforth be responsible for the safe keeping of the same.

shall be open to the inspection of any member thereof.

ARTICLE VI.—COMMITTEES.

1. The General Committee shall have power to make By-laws for conducting the business of meetings of the Society ; shall select subjects for debate, and make appointments for all Ordinary and Open meetings ; and shall, at the Annual Meeting, present a report upon the business of the year.
2. Their meetings shall be held at least once a fortnight, and six members shall form a quorum.
3. The House Committee shall have charge of the Society's building ; shall make By-laws for the government of the Reading Room ; shall be responsible for the due and regular supply of periodicals to the same, and shall submit to the Society at the first Open Meeting in March a list of periodicals recommended to be supplied to the Reading Room for the succeeding year.
4. Their meetings shall be held at least once a fortnight, and three members shall form a quorum.
5. They shall elect one of their number Secretary, who shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Committee, and shall present their reports to the Society.
6. They shall have power to appoint an assistant Curator, whose duties and salary shall be under their control.
7. In case any officer of the Society is absent from three consecutive meetings of the General Committee, or of the House Committee, it shall be the duty of the respective Secretaries of these Committees to report the same forthwith to the Society, who may, at their discretion, declare such office vacant.

8. Vacancies occurring under the foregoing section, or by reason of the death or accepted resignation of any member of the General Committee, or of the House Committee, shall be filled in the same manner as at the annual election; and the nomination shall take place at the first meeting after that at which the vacancy is announced.

9. Special Committees of not less than three members may, after due notice, be appointed for any purpose, and such Committees shall continue in office until discharged by vote of the Society.

10. The member first named on any such Committee shall be the convener thereof, but the Committee may, at its first meeting, appoint a Chairman and Secretary. A majority of the Committee shall constitute a quorum.

11. The minutes of every such Committee shall be kept in the Special Committee Minute Book, which shall be deposited with the Recording Secretary as soon as the Committee has reported.

12. In case a quorum is not present at any duly appointed meeting of any Committee, the Secretary thereof shall record the names of those members present, and report the same at the next private meeting of the Society.

ARTICLE V.—MEETINGS.

1. The Regular Meetings of the Society shall consist of Ordinary, Open, and Public Meetings, and the Annual Meeting. These meetings shall be held at half-past seven every Friday evening during the continuance of Lectures.

Any member so appointed, who is unable to act, shall, within four days, give written notice thereof to the Recording Secretary, who shall forthwith post up the name of a substitute; if such substitute be unable to act, he shall notify the Recording Secretary, in writing, on or before the following Monday, and his place shall be filled as the General Committee may direct.

4. Any defaulting member, who has failed to give the notice required by the preceding section, shall forfeit his right to vote for officers and prizemen, unless a satisfactory excuse be offered to the Society within two weeks after the meeting for which such member was so appointed.

5. A Public Meeting of the Society, to which the Patrons shall be invited, may be held on any Friday evening appointed by the General Committee.

6. An Essayist, a Reader, and Debaters, for each Public meeting, shall be elected by ballot, at least two weeks before such meeting. The General Committee shall have power to fill vacancies arising from resignations. The Reader shall submit his selection to the General Committee for their approval. The Debaters shall select their subject, and report the same to the Society one week after their election; in default thereof the General Committee shall chose a subject for them.

7. On any Friday evening an Open Meeting may be held at the discretion of the General Committee, for which an Essayist, Opener and Respondent shall be appointed. The readings shall be voluntary, and any member shall have the right to speak upon the question for discussion.

8. At the close of each debate, the decision shall be given by the Chairman according to the merits of the arguments, or be referred by him to a vote of the members present; and at private meetings he may criticise any defects in the style of the Essayist, Readers, or Speakers.

9. The Society may have an Annual Conversazione, which shall be under the management of the General Committee, with power on the part of the Society to add to their number.

10. The General Committee shall have authority to call a Special Meeting of the Society at any time, and for any purpose, by giving not less than twenty-four hours' notice thereof.

11. The General Committee shall prepare a list of subjects, which may be debated during their term of office, and post a copy thereof, on or before May 1st, in the College Entrance Hall.

ARTICLE VI.—PRIZES.

1. In addition to the prizes annually offered by the College Council for English Essays, Public Reading and Public Speaking, a second prize of the value of five dollars shall be offered for each.

2. No member shall be entitled to vote at the awarding of the Prizes for Public Speaking and Public Reading, or to receive a prize, who has not attended at least one-half of the meetings held during the year.

3. The decisions in regard to the prizes for public speaking and reading shall be taken separately in the following manner: Each member entitled to vote shall write the names of those four whom he considers the most proficient in each department, and the names of the four having the highest number of votes

shall be recorded. A second ballot shall then be taken, each member voting for one of the four thus chosen. If any member obtain a majority of all the votes cast, he shall be declared the successful competitor; if not, the name of the member receiving the smallest number of votes shall be struck off the list, and a new ballot taken upon the remaining three, and so on, until a majority of all the votes is cast for one of the competitors, who shall be first prizeman. The second prizeman shall be chosen in the same manner from the other three members selected on the first ballot. Such decisions shall be made at the first Open Meeting in March.

4. Essays read before the Society, and handed in to the Recording Secretary, on or before the ante-penultimate meeting, shall be referred to a committee of three, appointed by the Society at a previous meeting, who shall decide on the merits of the essays submitted to them, and may adjudge the prizes accordingly. If the committee be unable to decide upon the relative merits of two or more essays competing for the aforesaid prizes, they shall have power to add to their number, until a decision has been arrived at. Such decision shall be announced to the Society at the annual meeting, and the prizes awarded accordingly.

5. Essays competing for the McMurrich Medal shall be subject to the regulations laid down on page 38.

6. No member shall twice receive a first or a second prize in the same department during his academic course.

ARTICLE VII.—FINANCE.

1. The annual subscription shall be one dollar and a half.
2. Students of University College, or of the School of Practical Science, not members of the Society, shall be admissible to the Reading Room after the payment of an annual fee of one dollar.

ARTICLE VIII.—ALTERATIONS IN THE LAWS.

1. Alterations in the laws shall be discussed only at the first Open Meeting in March, or at such other meeting as the General Committee may appoint.
 2. No such alteration shall take place without receiving the votes of two-thirds of the members present, as well as the sanction of the College Council.

2. The Order of Business at the Open Meetings of the Society shall be as follows :

- (a) Minutes read, approved and signed.
- (b) Election of Members.

- (e) Nomination for Offices and Committees.
- (f) Essay.
- (g) English Reading.
- (h) Debate.
- (i) Business arising out of the Minutes.
- (j) Business from Committees,

3. Order of Open Meetings :

- (a) To the Essayist, twenty minutes.
- (b) To each Speaker, ten minutes, and five minutes for a reply, if he be entitled to reply.
- (c) To each Reader, five minutes, provided that at Open Meetings all the readings shall not occupy more than half an hour.

4. The order of business at Business Meetings shall be as follows :

- (a) Minutes of last Business Meeting read, approved and signed.
- (b) Business arising out of the Minutes.
- (c) Communications received.

NOTE.—After order of business (o) at Ordinary Meetings, that part of the Society, consisting of the Fourth and such other year as may be selected by the General Committee, may remain in the General Assembly Room, and the other years may adjourn, with a chairman, into an adjoining room for the purpose of Reading, Essay and Debate.

- (d) Business from Committees.
- (e) Nominations for Office and for Committees.
- (f) New Business.
- (g) Notice of Motion.
- (h) Roll Call.
- (i) Elections and Appointments for Offices, Committees, Public Debates, and Prize Speakers and Readers.

5. The order of business at Public Meetings shall be as follows :

- (a) Essay or Inaugural Address.
- (b) English Readings.
- (c) Debate.

But this order may be varied by selections from the Glee Club at the discretion of the General Committee.

6. The order of business at the Annual Meeting shall be as follows :

- (a) Minutes read, approved, and signed.
- (b) Roll Call.
- (c) Reports of General Committee and Treasurer.
- (d) Reports of Special Committees.
- (e) Business arising out of the Minutes.
- (f) Election of Officers.

7. All Essayists, Readers and Debaters for Ordinary Meetings shall be chosen in turn from the number of those who have paid their fees for the current year.

8. No member entitled to wear a gown shall speak or vote unless in academic costume. No member shall speak or vote after the third Ordinary Meeting of the Society till he has paid his fees for the year.

9. Every member in speaking shall address the Chair, confine himself to the subject under discussion, and avoid personalities and indecorous language.

10. No member shall speak more than once upon any question, unless with the permission of the Society, except in explanation of a material part of his speech which may have been misconceived, and no new matter shall be introduced upon such explanation. A reply is allowed to a member who has opened a debate or moved a substantive motion other than those enumerated in Rule 16, but not to the mover of an amendment.
11. When two or more members rise at once to speak, the Chairman shall determine their precedence.
12. When a member is speaking, no person shall interrupt, except for the purpose of calling him to order.
13. A member called to order shall at once sit down until the point is stated and determined by the Chairman, whose decision shall be given without debate, unless, being in doubt, he shall invite discussion. If such decision is appealed from, the grounds of appeal and the reasons for the decision having been stated, the question shall, without debate, be put as follows:—"Shall the decision of the Chair be sustained?"
14. Any member may require the question under discussion to be read at any time, but not so as to interrupt a member while speaking.
15. When a member is speaking, a motion being read, or a vote taken, no member shall walk out of or across the room, or make any noise. Conversation calculated to disturb any member while speaking or reading, or to hinder the transaction of business, shall be deemed a violation of order, and if persisted in, shall incur censure.
16. Every motion shall be seconded and read from the chair before it is discussed.

17. All motions and notices of motion shall be in writing, except votes of thanks, and motions to reconsider, to adjourn, to take the previous question, to close the debate, to lay on the table, to postpone the discussion to some future meeting, to divide (when the sense will admit of it), or to refer.

18. A motion to adjourn shall be in order at any time, except when a member is speaking, during a division or election, or immediately after a motion, or the adoption of the previous question. A motion to adjourn simply shall be decided without debate.

19. The previous question shall precede, and, until decided, preclude all amendments to the main motion, and shall be in this form : " Shall the main motion be now put ? "

20. On the adoption of a motion to close the debate, the main motion and all amendments already moved shall be put in the usual order, without further discussion.

21. Only one amendment to an amendment shall be in order, and no irrelevant amendment shall be permitted.

22. One week's notice in writing shall be given of motions for the appointment of Committees, the suspension, expulsion, re-election, or censuring of a member, the reconsideration or discussion of any question or resolution, to amend the Laws or Rules of Order, or for a return from any officer or committee ; and the President may, subject to an appeal to the Society, direct any motion made to stand as a notice.

23. A motion to reconsider the decision of the Society on any question must be made by a member who voted in favor of such decision.

24. A vote of two-thirds of the members present at a regular meeting shall be required to alter, add, strike out or suspend a

Rule of Order, to change the order of business, or to suspend or expel a member.

25. When the Society goes into Committee of the whole, the President may leave the chair and call upon some other member to preside. The minutes of the Committee shall be kept by the Secretary of Committees in the Special Committee Minute Book.

26. Twenty-four hours' notice in writing of the meeting of every Committee shall be posted up in the Entrance Hall.

27. Reports of Committees, other than reports of progress, shall be in writing, signed by some officer of the Committee.

28. When the report of any Committee has been read to the Society, it shall be deemed to be received, without any motion to that effect, and may then be adopted with or without amendment, considered in Committee of the whole, referred or laid on the table.

29. Any member may admit a visitor to the Reading Room, or to a private meeting of the Society.

30. Cases not provided for in the foregoing rules shall be governed, as far as possible, by the practice of the Legislative Assembly of Ontario.

THE McMURRICH MEDAL.

Through the generosity of W. B. McMurrich, Esq., M.A., The University College Natural Science Association has it in its power to award a medal, known as "The McMurrich Medal," which is open for competition to the members of the University College Literary and Scientific Society, subject to the following provisions :

1. The competition for the said medal shall be open to Undergraduates of Toronto University who are members of the Natural Science Association, or of the Literary and Scientific Society.
2. The said Medal shall be given for the best Essay on some scientific subject, preference being given to those indicating original research.
3. The essays for competition shall be sent in, on or before the first day of March in each year, to a Committee of the University College Natural Science Association, previously nominated and appointed by the members of this Association : and the said Committee, so appointed, shall award the medal, and bring in their Report in regard to the same at the Annual Meeting of the said Association.
4. The donor shall be an *ex officio* member of the said Committee.
5. No medal shall be awarded unless the Committee deem the essay worthy of such an acknowledgment.
6. The winner of the medal will not be allowed to compete second time.

BY-LAWS
OF THE
HOUSE COMMITTEE.

1. The Reading Room shall be open daily from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. during the continuance of Lectures.
2. One member of the Committee shall be in charge of the Reading Room each day of the week by turns, whose name shall be posted up in the Reading Room, and who shall be responsible for the preservation of due order and decorum.
3. No person shall cause any disturbance by conversation or by any noise in or about the Reading Room, or in the Halls during the meetings of the Society.
4. No smoking or spitting shall be allowed in or about the Reading Room, or in the Society's Building.
5. No person shall cut or otherwise deface the Periodicals, or the walls or furniture of the Building or Reading Room.
6. No intoxicating liquor shall be allowed on the Society's premises.
7. It shall be the duty of the member in charge to enforce the foregoing By-Laws. In case of any offence against them, he shall warn the person so offending to desist, and if the offence be persisted in or repeated, he shall suspend the offender from the privileges of the Reading Room until the Committee shall have met and adjudicated upon his conduct. Immediate suspension shall be imperative for the following offences : (1)

Drunkenness ; (2) Profanity ; (3) Spitting ; (4) Damaging the property or rooms of the Society.

8. Immediately after suspending an offender, the member in charge shall notify the Chairman of the Committee, who shall call a meeting of the Committee at the earliest possible time, when the offence shall be dealt with according to its merits.

9. Any member may extend the privileges of the Society to members of other Universities, for a period not exceeding one week at a time, on entering his name in the Visitors' Book kept for that purpose.

10. A List shall be posted in the Reading Room of all persons entitled to the use hereof.

REGULATIONS

FOR THE

LOAN of PERIODICALS from the READING ROOM.

1. The House Committee may lend to any member of the Society, who has paid his fees for the current year, for a period not exceeding one week, and subject to the Regulations herein-after mentioned, any of the following Periodicals, after their removal from the files :—The British Quarterly, London Quarterly, Westminster Review, Edinburgh Review, Nineteenth Century, Fortnightly Review, Harper's Monthly, Scribner's Monthly, Atlantic Monthly, McMillan's Magazine, Popular Science Monthly, Contemporary Review, Athenæum, Saturday Review, The American Naturalist, Picturesque Canada, Art Treasury.

2. Any person neglecting to return a Periodical at the proper time shall be fined the sum of five cents for each day of retention beyond that time, the offender to be suspended from the use of the Reading Room until such fine is paid.
3. In case a Periodical is returned in a damaged condition, the member in charge to whom it is returned shall assess the damage done, and impose a corresponding fine, the offender to be suspended from the use of the Reading Room until such fine is paid.
4. Not more than one Periodical shall be lent to any member at one time.
5. A Register of all Periodicals so lent shall be kept by the Members of the House Committee,
6. The member in charge shall attend in the Reading Room during an hour appointed by the General Committee to give out and receive Periodicals in accordance with the above Regulations.
