THE COLONIES INVITED TO SPEAK.

The attitude of the British government toward the establishment of a Colonial Court of Appeal and the return in the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council is worthy of more than cursory observation.

My Lord, Sir—With reference to my despatch of the 15th February, 1901, I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your despatch, which was received by me on the 21st of the same month.

It is unnecessary for me to recapitulate the recent history of this question. His Majesty's Government were strongly of the opinion that it was very desirable to ascertain the views of the colonies upon the question, and in inviting your Government to send a representative to the meeting, they were not desirous of imposing any conditions upon the colonies, any views of their own, but were anxious to ascertain what the views of the colonies might be upon the question. Had it proved to be the case that the colonies unanimously or by a great majority desired a change of importance should be made in the constitution of the Final Colonial Court of Appeal, which in their view would be a desirable and authoritative tribunal to that court in the colonies, His Majesty's Government were anxious to do all in their power to meet the views of the colonies, and for this reason, the colonies might, with practical unanimity, arrive at the conclusion that the views of His Majesty's Government were not in accordance with their desires.

We take it that this disposition on the part of the Imperial Government to act upon the advice of the colonies in matters in which the colonies are interested extends beyond the creation of new or the modification of existing judicial tribunals.

We take it that when the question of trade relations between the colonies and the Empire was under consideration, the British Government would adopt a similar policy and do what it can to facilitate the extension of trade, both between the colonies themselves and between the colonies and the Empire. We do not imagine, of course, that the Mother Country will adopt a policy inconsistent with its own best interests, and we are inclined to believe that if the colonies show any unanimity in regard to an inter-colonial and inter-imperial trade policy that the Mother Country will stretch a point to put such a policy into effect.

It is not our intention to suggest any change that is not desired by the colonies, while it will go as far as it can in enacting what positive legislation the colonies approve of. It is quite clear that the government wishes the colonies to speak out. It desires to have their views on all questions, to suggest reforms based upon the Imperial idea. The British government does not wish to force the colonies into action of any kind. On the contrary, all suggestions looking toward these reforms must come voluntarily from the colonies.

We are clearly given to understand that our opinion on all matters affecting the Empire will not only be gladly received, but is anxiously sought. In view of what has actually transpired in regard to the modification of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, the remarks of Lord Salisbury at the recent banquet to the Prince of Wales at Guildhall become doubly significant. At that meeting the British Premier is reported to have spoken as follows:

"No doubt it is true, just at this moment, that we have many enemies who are not very recent in expressing their opinion, but on the day of this day's celebration, which is largely due to the action and co-operation of the British Highnesses, we have more than that we possess in the support of our distant kinsmen an approval and a sanction which, to us, is worth infinitely more than all the content and all the censures that we may receive from other nations."
